The Origins

The training program for the Pracheena Examination that began in 1860 at the Ratmalana Purana Vihara for Buddhist monks and laymen marks the beginning of this historical educational establishment. Later, in 1875, the Vidyalankara Pirivena was established in the Kelaniya Peliyagoda area by the late Ven. Rathmalane Sri Dharmaloka Thero. Since then, for over a century, the University of Kelaniya has been a renowned educational establishment for Pracheena Bhasha. The Sri Lankan government granted the Vidyodaya and Vidyalankara Pirivena university status by the Vidyalankara University Act No. 45 in 1957. On the 1st of January, 1959 the University was renamed the Sri Lanka Vidyalankara University. The late Ven. Kirithuduwe Sri Pannasara Thero was appointed the first Vice Chancellor of the University.

The Evolution of the Vidyalankara Campus into the University of Kelaniya

The University of Ceylon Act No.1 of 1972 consolidated all universities into one university, and from February 15th of 1972 onwards, the Vidyalankara University became a Campus of the University of Sri Lanka. With the promulgation of the Universities Act No. 16 of 1978, the university system in Sri Lanka was restructured and the Vidyalankara Campus was restored to its independent status, now renamed the University of Kelaniya, Sri Lanka. According to the Vidyalankara University Act of 1957, only male undergraduates comprising both clergy and laymen were enrolled at the time, but with the Higher Education Act No. 20 of 1966, female undergraduates were also given the opportunity to study at the University.

Contemporary Status

In order to expand its space, the University had to be shifted to a new location, and from the Academic Year 1965/1966 onwards, the University of Kelaniya was relocated to the current premises. By the year 1959, the University comprised five faculties: Languages, Buddhist Studies, Arts, Science, Philosophy and Research. Currently, the University has expanded its faculties to include Humanities, Social Sciences, Science, Medicine, Commerce and Management Studies, Postgraduate Studies, and Computing and Technology, and has a total of 55 departments.

Location

The University is located in Dalugama, Kelaniya, which is approximately eight kilometers north of Colombo along the Colombo-Kandy road. The closest railway station is in Pattiya Junction. Except for the Medical Faculty, which is located in Ragama, and Faculty of Computing and Technology located in Peliyagoda, all the other faculties are located in the Kelaniya Dalugama premises.

Affiliated Institutions

There are two institutes affiliated to the University: The Postgraduate Institute of Pali and Buddhist Studies, located in Kohuwala; and the Postgraduate Institute of Archeology, located in Colombo 7.

COMMON FACTS ALL STUDENTS MUST BE AWARE OF

Information and Communication

All students are advised to check the University website and notice boards regularly. Announcements on various matters are issued to the students by the University through the University website, Students' Welfare Division, Faculty Offices, Departments, Medical Center, and common meeting places such as the Student Center, Student Hostels and main lecture halls. It is important to pay attention to these notices, as they provide information on academic matters as well as student support services.

1. Student Registration

(i) University Registration

The registration of internal students at the beginning of every academic year is carried out by the Academic Division of the University. Each student should get her/his registration renewed during the time period specified. Any student who is registered as an internal student is entitled to free entrance to the University premises and to enjoy facilities provided by the University.

All students registered in the University are provided with identity cards/students' record books by the Academic Division of the University. They should confirm their identity by presenting the identity card or student record book on every occasion when a lecturer, an officer or a security officer of the University requests it. This includes admission to the library and other facilities.

(ii) Faculty Level Registration for Subjects and Course Units

Academic registrations of the students are carried out by relevant Faculties. For the Faculties of Humanities and Social Sciences, registration is carried out by the Inter Faculty Centre for Coordinating Modular Systems (ICCMS). Students of Faculties of Humanities, Social Sciences and Science are given a two-week period at the beginning of the academic year to register for the subjects and course units they select. Students of the Faculty of Commerce & Management Studies are given one week for the selection of courses and registration. The faculty handbooks issued by the respective faculties provide additional details of the degree programmes offered by the faculty and the selection of courses. The students in the Faculty of Medicine and the Faculty of Computing and Technology will register for examination directly as there is no selection of course modules in the first year.

2. Registration for Bachelor of Arts Honours and Bachelor of Science Honours Degree Programmes

Based on the examination results of the first year, students of the faculties of Humanities and Social Sciences can register for the Bachelor of Arts Honours degree programmes. Students of the Faculty of Science can register for the Bachelor of Science Honours degree programmes if they are selected to follow the Honours degree programme based on their first year and second year examination results. It is compulsory for students selected to the University on a special intake to choose the special intake subject they were selected for, for their Honours Degree programme.

3. Attendance at Lectures, Tutorials/Practical classes

Anyone who is not registered as an internal student in the University is strictly prohibited from attending lectures, tutorials or practical classes. Every registered student should attend relevant lectures, tutorial and practical classes. Any student unable to attend lectures and tutorial/practical classes on health grounds must forward a medical certificate issued by the medical officer of the university to the Deputy Registrar (Academic) through the Head of the Department and the Dean of the Faculty.

4. Student Appeals

It is mandatory to submit appeals using the prescribed format at the Academic Division and during the specified time period. The recommended categories to submit student Appeals and relevant instructions are specified under Academic Division in this Student Handbook.

Decisions taken by the University on students' appeals are sent to the private addresses of the students. The letter which includes the decisions should be retained by the student as it must be provided when the university requests it.

5. Rules and Regulations on Conducting Examinations

Examinations are organized by relevant Faculties and the Examination Division of the University. Activities pertaining to the examinations and the relevant rules and regulations are stated under the section on examination division for the information of the students.

6. Student Counselling and Student Welfare

The University provides student counselling and welfare services to the students. Students' Hostel rules and regulations, instructions for activities pertaining to student societies and subject societies are provided under the section on Student Welfare Division of this handbook. Students' Welfare Committee has been appointed by the University Council to maintain and to manage welfare activities of the students. It

consists of the Vice-Chancellor, Deans, Registrar, Director - Students' Affairs, Senior Student Counsellor, a male Warden and a female Warden, Student Counsellor (Buddhist monk), a female Student Counsellor, Senior Assistant Registrar (Students' Welfare Division), Director of Physical Education and a student representative from each faculty.

7. Behavior and self-conduct of Students

University students are adults, and considered mature and responsible by the University. Therefore, as in the case of all other citizens, they must conduct themselves according to the laws of the country.

Students should refrain from

- i. Interrupting academic or administrative activities, contravening general rules and regulations of the country or
- ii. Harassing any male or female students of the university physically, verbally or mentally or insulting members of the staff or
- iii. Damaging human, physical and other properties of the university or
- iv. Behaving in the university premises or outside in a way that is disrespectful or harms the reputation of the university.

To ensure the right to learn by maintaining peace in the university, the Parliament has approved Act No.20 of 1998 to prohibit ragging and criminal activities of any other nature in higher educational institutes. Under the provisions of this Act, an individual can be made an offender by the court for the following activities:

- Criminal intimidation
- Imprisonment
- Wrongful restraint
- Wrongful confinement
- Forcibly residing in an educational institute and damaging its property

When she/he is made the offender, she/he can either be imprisoned or fined or both, according to the gravity of the offence.

In the case of being found guilty of any of the offences, only a High Court Judge has the power to grant bail to students depending on the offence. Also, the arrested person may not be released, according to the gravity of the offence. Moreover, the court may order the university to expel the offender from the educational institute.

Act No.20 of 1998 to abolish ragging and any other criminal activities has been included in this handbook as Annex 02, and the university expects all students to follow it correctly. Further, Act, No. 4 of 2015 on Assistance to and protection of Victims of crime and witnesses and its amendment act no 27 of 2017 have been included as Annex 03 of this book.

The University Council has appointed a disciplinary committee to maintain the discipline of the students and selected members of the academic staff may be included in this disciplinary committee.

8. University Security Service

The University Security Service functions 24 hours [throughout the day] to protect the University community and the property of the University. The Security Service functions as a support unit with the Student Welfare Division and Students' Counselling Service in student activities. The Security Service also provides support to organize various functions of the University. The University Security Service provides special protection during various functions of the University and helps the administrative officers and the academic staff in implementing the rules and regulations of the University and maintaining the peace and discipline of the student community.

9. Restricted Times for Remaining in the University

Students should not remain in the University after 8.00 p.m. without valid reasons. Security officers may advise them to leave the University premises. Students should not remain in the University premises after lectures, practical classes and after hours except when an approved meeting, party, drama, or festival or some such event is held. Residential students should not leave the hostel without the permission of the relevant officers on such occasions.

01. Academic Division

1.1 Enrollment of new Students

The enrollment of new students is done online via student registration system by the University when the University Grants Commission send the university the database of selected students. Students are expected to upload the certificates and documents certified by the principal of the school or Justice of Peace and the payment should be done using the 16 digit code generated by the system individually to each student. As the student files are also maintained in electronic versions, students will be requested to produce originals, if any additional information is required.

Please note that if the students were referred by University Grants Commission 3 months after the orientation program such students will be registered in the system but will be included to the next intake of students to follow the academic program.

1.2 Administrative Registration

This is a mandatory requirement for all the students except 1st year in order to ensure their active studentship in the university.

Annual administration registration is done by academic division before the commencement of every academic year. Administrative Registration is now conducted online all the students should follow the instruction sent to their individual emails and use the 16 digit code generated independently to each student for payment. In case if the students pay using another code, they may have to verify that such payments are debited to University. If payment cannot be verified as a result of using another code, such students are liable to pay again to update registration.

The final year students do not need to register for the next academic year. However in case they have to re-sit an examination as a result of a failed subject or due to an appeal, such students have to register themselves for the relevant academic year.

1.3 Student Identity Cards

Every student should have a student identity card as long as she/he is an undergraduate registered at the University of Kelaniya. Therefore, an identity card is issued to all registered students by the Academic Division. If the identity card is lost the new identity card will be issued to the candidate upon submission of a request for a new identity card, a police statement on the loss of the identity card, and the receipt slip of the payment of Rs. 500/- issued by the shroff.

The students should confirm their identity by forwarding the student identity card on every occasion whenever a lecturer, an officer, or a security officer of the university requests it. This includes entrance to the library and other facilities.

1.4 Use of Student's Name during the Period of Registration

All the conditions stipulated in circular No. 09/2021 dated 05.11.2021 on the use of students' names within the university period issued by the University Grants Commission are given here for the information of all the students. All activities related to students' names are carried out as per the regulations of the said circular and the students should strictly abide by the following conditions:

- (a) Change of names in degree certificates is accepted only if the proper legal procedure has been followed.
- (b) The name stated in the degree certificate is the name by which the student is registered for undergraduate courses.
- (c) An internal change of a part of a name at the student's request is allowed only when each part is mentioned in the Birth Certificate.
- (d) If an ordained student disrobes after registering under a certain name for the Final Degree Examination, the Degree Certificate is issued in the name stated in the Birth Certificate. Accordingly, even if a lay student becomes a member of the clergy, such evidence should be duly produced and submitted before the effective date of the degree.
- (e) All the changes specified from (a) to (d) will be made only if the request for such name changes are submitted before the effective date of the degree.

1.5 The Appeals Committee

The Appeals Committee is established to address any of the following issues faced by a student:

- (a) Being unable to sit an examination on medical grounds or other reasons.
- (b) Obtaining a deferment of an academic year.
- (c) Taking leave locally and overseas
- (d) Any other personal reason acceptable to the Appeals committee.

The appeals to be submitted under the above categories should be made using the prescribed application forms through the Academic Division. These requests should be submitted through the Dean of the relevant Faculty to the Appeals committee.

The following process should be followed for students granted permission to sit for the examination as first-time candidates on medical grounds by submitting a medical certificate for the same subjects immediately following the examination.

- i) Medical Certificate issued by University Medical Officer.
- ii) Medical Certificate issued by the Government Hospital (Western/Indigenous)
- iii) Medical Certificate issued by a consultant (Western/Indigenous)
- iv) Medical Certificate issued on admission of a hospital (Western/Indigenous)

In the occasion it is observed that a student has attempted to mislead the authorities of university, it will be considered an examination offence, and will be liable to be punished as per the recommendation of the examination offences committee.

The following instances are considered as such attempts to mislead.

1. Attempting to sit as a first timer by submitting medical certificate after failing the examination.
2. Attempting to sit as a first timer, after being absent for the original examination without submitting an appeal.
3. Attempting to sit as a first timer, after skipping the actual academic year recommended by Appeals Committee.

Completion of the Degree

A student shall complete a Bachelor's degree within five consecutive academic years and complete a Bachelor's Honours degree within six consecutive academic years as per the Qualifications frame work of the University of Kelaniya. An appeal submitted to complete the degree programme beyond this period will be considered under exceptional circumstances, on a case by case basis.

The maximum duration to consider the appeals is within 10 academic years from the date he/she registered with the university. **No appeal shall be considered after ten (10) consecutive academic years from the date he/she first registered with the university.**

The students who repeat examinations due to failed subjects do not have to obtain approval by Appeals committee, if they are still within the duration of 5 years (in the case of a three-year degree) or 6 years (in the case of a four-year Honours degree). However, any request to sit exam beyond 5-6 years (as applicable) up to 10 years should obtain the approval of the Appeals committee.

1.6 Instructions to be Followed when Requesting Deferment

An undergraduate who is unable to continue academic activities during the prescribed academic year needs to obtain approval from the appeals committee for a deferment of the academic year.

- (a) The students who wish to postpone registration in the first academic year should submit the reasons in writing before the commencement of the academic year.
- (b) If medical reasons are cited, a Medical Certificate obtained from a government hospital should be submitted.
if a Medical Certificate is obtained from a private doctor, it should be submitted with the certification of the Chief Medical Officer of the University.
- (c) If the reason is financial difficulties, such evidence should be supported with the certification of the Grama Sevaka and the Assistant Government Agent.
- (d) For any other personal reasons, written proof of this reason should be submitted.

02. Examinations Division

All examinations of the students registered for a programme of study at the University of Kelaniya are coordinated by the Examinations Division of the University of Kelaniya. The functions of the Examinations Divisions include (i) issuing the necessary notifications at the time of each examination and providing rules and instructions on conducting written examinations as per the approved examinations regulation approved by the Senate of the University, (ii) Conduct of Examination Boards in respect of each programme of study and releasing of results, (iii) issuing of academic records and verification of results, (vi) Coordinate the examinations conducted by the faculties, Institutes and the Campus, (v) conduct of Examination Irregularities Investigation Committee, and (vi) organizing annual general convocations are the major functions of the examination division. In addition to bachelor's degrees, the examinations related to certificate courses, diplomas and postgraduate degree programmes are also conducted by the Examinations Division.

The candidates must adhere to the following rules and regulations when sitting for examinations at the University of Kelaniya.

2.1 Rules and Regulations Related to the Written Examinations

- 2.1.1 Candidates should be in the vicinity of the examination hall at least 15 minutes prior to the commencement of the examination and should enter the examination hall only when the supervisor gives them permission to do so
- 2.1.2 As soon as the candidates enter the examination hall, they should seat themselves at the desks bearing their index numbers. The seat cannot be changed except with the special permission of the supervisor.
- 2.1.3 No candidate will be allowed to enter the examination hall 30 minutes after the commencement of the examination. Once the examination starts, the candidates are not allowed to exit the examination hall in the first 30 minutes of the examination. After the first thirty minutes, any candidate may leave the hall after handing over the answer script to the supervisor, However candidates are not allowed to leave the hall in the last 30 minutes of the examination.
- 2.1.4.1 Each candidate should collect the admission card from the Examination Division or Faculty Office and get her/his signature verified by a member of the academic staff, and bring it to the examination hall, along with the Student Identity Card/Student Record Book.

- 2.1.4.2 The candidacy of those who fail to submit the afore-mentioned documents is liable to be cancelled.
- 2.1.4.3 If the candidate does not have the admission form, she/he should furnish a statement signed according to the format supplied by the supervisor in order to sit the examination. The candidate should produce the required documents to prove identity when she/he sits the next examination paper.
- 2.1.4.4 If this happens to be the last and the only paper for which the candidate is sitting, the aforementioned documents should be shown to the Assistant Registrar/Senior Asst. Registrar of the relevant faculty on the next working day.
- 2.1.4.5 If the Student Record Book/Student Identity Card is lost during the examination, a second copy should be obtained from the Assistant Registrar/Senior Assistant Registrar of the relevant Faculty.
- 2.1.4.6 If there is a difference in the name that appears on the Student Record Book/ Student Identity Card and the Admission Card, a certificate obtained from the Registrar confirming the above should be produced. If a student fails to submit such a certificate, the National Identity Card, or a recently taken photograph certified by an authorized person should be submitted.
- 2.1.5 During the examination, the admission card or the relevant part of the admission card should be handed over to the invigilator after the candidate signs the form in the presence of the invigilator. The candidates should sign in the due place of the admission card at each session of the examination.
- 2.1.6 The candidates should bring only the necessary items such as pens, pencils, bottles of ink, erasers, rulers, geometrical instruments and colored pencils which are legally permitted to be brought for their use at the exam. In addition, the candidate should be responsible and refrain from bringing any sort of document, note or instrument which could be used improperly at the exam hall, especially mobile phones or other electronic communication equipment or any other technical equipment with her/him during the examination.
- 2.1.7 The candidate should promptly produce any document, object or instrument which is near her/him or in her/his care as and when the supervisor asks for it.
- 2.1.8 Candidates are prohibited from asking or exchanging anything, conversing or copying from any other candidate or any document. No assistance of any sort should be obtained from another candidate/person. Copying from another

- candidate, encouraging or assisting another candidate to copy is strictly prohibited.
- 2.1.9 Only writing books and papers issued for the day should be used for writing answers to the question paper. It is the candidate's responsibility to check whether the date stamp bearing the valid date and the invigilator's signature are placed on the books or/and the answering sheets. If the stamp of the valid date with the signature of the supervisor or invigilator is not placed on the answering books and papers, such stationery should not be used to write the answers. It is the responsibility of the candidate to inform the supervisor as soon as possible, and ensure that the papers are stamped with the valid date and signature.
- 2.1.10 The required stationery to write answers. (i.e. writing paper, graph papers, drawing papers, ledger papers etc.) will be issued to the candidates as and when necessary. Tearing, scratching, folding, crushing or destroying any paper or book supplied to the candidate is prohibited. Only the stationery supplied by the supervisor or invigilator should be used. All the stationery and instruments supplied to the candidate, whether used or unused, should be left on the desk and should not be taken out of the examination hall.
- 2.1.11 Before starting to answer the question paper, the index number of the candidate and the name of the examination should be written in the due place on the answering sheet. The index number of the candidate should be written in all papers used for answering the questions. No candidate should write her/his name or any symbol of identification on the answering sheets. Writing someone else's index number on one's answering sheet is considered misconduct and an examination offence. Answering sheets without the index number or an illegible index number will be rejected.
- 2.1.12 The paper used for rough work and other writing papers should be attached to the answering sheet. Irrelevant parts or mistakes made on the answer sheet should be crossed out. Rough work should not be done on the admission card, timetable, question paper or the Student Record Book. Candidates who do not follow these instructions will be seen as having breached the rules of the examination.
- 2.1.13 Candidates should behave well in the examination hall, without disturbing the supervisor, invigilators, and other candidates. Silence should be preserved in and out of the examination hall. Candidates will not be allowed to go out of the examination hall temporarily except in an emergency. In such situations, permission can be granted to go out temporarily with an invigilator. The supervisor possesses the authority to expel those who do not follow the instructions. Talking to others except the supervisor or an invigilator in the examination hall at the time of examination is completely prohibited. The

attention of the supervisor or an invigilator can be obtained by raising one's hand when a question arises.

- 2.1.14 Candidates should be suitably dressed for the examination so that their attire does not conceal their identity.
- 2.1.15 No candidate should reproduce a field book, a field programme or a thesis as a whole or in part that has been produced by another.
- 2.1.16 No candidate should permit another to sit the examination on her/his behalf, and no candidate is permitted to sit the examination on behalf of someone else.
- 2.1.17 Candidates should be aware of the fact that the supervisor possesses the sole authority to question or to take statements from a candidate regarding any matter that has arisen in the examination hall. The candidate cannot refuse answering questions or signing a statement.
- 2.1.18 If the supervisor is convinced that a situation which leads to cancellation or postponement of the examination has arisen, the supervisor will take steps to report to the due authorities immediately, having stopped the examination and collected the answer sheets immediately.
- 2.1.19 Candidates should stop all work as soon as the signal to stop the examination is given by the supervisor. The supervisor/invigilator bears the right to notify the Examination Division about disobedient candidates if these instructions are not followed.
- 2.1.20 Candidates should hand over their answer sheets to the supervisor or an invigilator themselves. Candidates should stay in their seats until the answer sheets are collected. Answer sheets should not be handed over to workers or any other person in the hall for any reason. A candidate does not have the right to ask for the answer sheet once it has been handed over, for any reason whatsoever.
- 2.1.21 No candidate can take her/his or someone else's answer sheets out of the examination hall.
- 2.1.22 Candidates should be responsible not to keep any document or note or equipment in their possession, which can be misused at the time of the examination. Further, candidates should not try to use any equipment or document or note improperly. All candidates should be responsible not to engage in examination misconduct and to avoid any such act which will lead to suspicion of being engaged in examination misconduct.
- 2.1.23 When marking answer sheets, when more questions than the stipulated number of questions are answered, only the due number of answers according to the respective order of answering will be marked (e.g.: the last answer may not be marked when an additional question apart from the due number of questions is

- answered). Nevertheless, the examiner has the authority of identifying an answer or part of an answer which is not needed to be marked in cases where the candidate has answered more than the required number of questions.
- 2.1.24 Sitting for examinations by all candidates registered for the examination is mandatory. If the candidate does not appear for the examination, she/he should seek permission of the Senate within the relevant period of time, having submitted a written appeal to the Appeals Committee with acceptable reasons for not sitting the examination with written proof and the recommendation of the Dean of the relevant Faculty. If a candidate cannot appear for a part of the examination, the Assistant Registrar/Senior Asst. Registrar of the Faculty should be immediately informed of this in writing, and relevant proof should be sent within 48 hours, via Registered Post.
- 2.1.25 If a candidate is not sitting the whole examination or a part of it due to medical reasons, a Medical Certificate should be obtained having reported to the Medical Officer of the University before the examination commences or within the period the examination is being conducted.
- 2.1.26 If a candidate who has not sat the whole examination or a part of it has not obtained the approval of the Senate following the instructions, sitting the said examination in the next instance would be considered a repeat examination.
- 2.1.27 If a candidate has not obtained the approval of the Senate for not sitting the complete examination, she/he will not be entitled to get a class upon completing the degree.
- 2.1.28 A candidate who fails to obtain a Medical Certificate from the University Medical Officer due to unavoidable circumstances, should submit a valid Medical Certificate obtained from the District Medical Officer of the candidate's residential area or a Consultant Physician or a Government Ayurvedic hospital. The Certificate must be certified by the Medical Officer of the university within 14 days from the due date of the examination. Medical Certificates issued by Western, Ayurvedic, or Homeopathy doctors in private practice will not generally be accepted. However, these may be considered on a case basis by case by the Appeals Board of the University.

2.2 Examination Irregularities

Examination irregularities have been classified as follows.

- 2.2.1 Keeping unauthorized documents in one's possession
- 2.2.2 Copying/Plagiarism
- 2.2.3 Entering to the examination hall with written notes on the palm or on any other part of the body, or on one's clothes
- 2.2.4 Cheating

- 2.2.5 Taking the stationery belonging to the university out of the examination hall
- 2.2.6 Improper behavior that disturbs the examination activities
- 2.2.7 Impersonation, or employing somebody else to sit the examination on one's behalf or sitting the examination on someone else's behalf
- 2.2.8 Getting to know or trying to know the contents of a question paper through improper means
- 2.2.9 Encouraging, supporting, or getting assistance to commit an examination irregularity
- 2.2.10 Influencing the examiner or other examination officers improperly
- 2.2.11 Not following or obeying the orders or instructions of the supervisor or arguing with the supervisor or the staff serving in the examination hall
- 2.2.12 Taking mobile phones or technical gadgets of any sort into the examination hall.

2.3 Inquiries into Malpractices at Examinations

Malpractices related to examinations will be reported to the Administrative Officer assigned for Examination matters (Deputy Registrar/Senior Assistant Registrar/ Assistant Registrar/ Examinations) by the Supervisor.

The Administrative Officer/Examinations writes to the Committee Investigating Examination Irregularities and reports each case of irregularity to the Committee. Punishments which are prescribed by this Committee are submitted for the approval of the Senate. The Committee Investigating Examination Irregularities is a sub-committee appointed by the Senate. Considering the recommendations of this Committee, the Senate will determine the punishments for the offences. The decision of the Senate is final. The Registrar of Examinations (Deputy Registrar/Senior Assistant Registrar/ Assistant Registrar) will inform the candidates about the punishments.

2.4 Punishments for Malpractice in Examinations

2.4.1 Having unauthorized documents

Prohibition to sit the examinations conducted by the University for a maximum of two years and/or other punishments according to the recommendations of the Senate.

2.4.2 Copying

Cancellation of candidature and prohibition of sitting other examinations held by the University for a maximum of three years and/or other punishments according to the Senate.

2.4.3 Having notes on the palm of your hand or any other part of the body or garments.

Cancellation of candidature and prohibition to sit examinations held by the University for a maximum of three years and/or other punishments according to the Senate.

- 2.4.4 **Cheating**
Cancellation of candidature, and prohibition to sit University examinations for a specified period, and the imposition of other punishments according to the Senate.
- 2.4.5 **Taking stationery items out of the examination hall.**
Cancellation of candidature and prohibition of sitting examinations conducted by the University for a specified period of time decided on by the Senate.
- 2.4.6 **Misbehavior causing disturbance in examination hall.**
Cancellation of candidature, and prohibition of sitting any examination in the University for at least five years, and other punishments decided on by the Senate.
- 2.4.7 **Impersonation**
If a candidate sits the examination using another candidate's index number, or allows another person to impersonate her/him, it is a serious offence. In such a situation both candidates will be liable for a punishment. If the other person who has sat the examination has not registered as a student in the University, the normal laws of the country will be used to punish her/him.
- In the case of the registered student, cancellation of candidature and prohibition of sitting University exams for a minimum of 5 years and maximum of 10 years, and any punishment imposed by the Senate will be upheld.
- 2.4.8 **Discovering contents of question paper or attempts to find the contents of the question paper in an illegal manner before the examination.**
The cancellation of candidature and punishments according to the decisions of the Senate.
- 2.4.9 **Supporting malpractice at an examination, getting help from someone else or examination malpractice.**
The cancellation of candidature and punishments according to the decision of the Senate.
- 2.4.10 **Undue influence on supervisors and other officials**
The cancellation of candidature and punishments according to the decision of the Senate.
- 2.4.11 **Disobedience in the examination hall and/or disputes with the supervisor and staff in the examination hall**
The cancellation of candidature, prohibition of sitting University examinations for a maximum of five years and other punishments decided on by the Senate.
- 2.4.12 **Bringing mobile phones or any other technological device into the exam hall**

The cancellation of candidature and prohibition of sitting University examinations for a maximum 3 years and/or other punishments according to the decisions of the Senate.

2.4.13 Being guilty for the second time of malpractice at an examination.

The cancellation of student registration and/or decision taken by the Senate.

2.5 Compulsory Punishments

All candidates must be aware that all or several of the following compulsory punishments can be imposed by the Senate:

2.5.1 Cancelling the question paper and allowing to resit the relevant examination after an academic year has passed.

2.5.2 Not awarding a class for the degree.

2.5.3 Limiting the maximum marks for re-sitting a cancelled question paper to 40%

2.5.4 The suspension or cancellation of scholarships and bursaries

2.5.5 The cancellation of hostel facilities

2.5.6 Not calling/inviting for the convocation.

2.5.7 Delaying the release of results and awarding the degree one year later.

2.6 Any other misconduct/malpractice/misdemeanor or fault

Any misconduct/malpractice/misdemeanor or fault not discussed in this section, but deemed a malpractice by the Senate, will be discussed and the punishment will be meted out according to the decision of the Senate.

2.7 Appeals made by students who have been identified to be punished for malpractice at examinations

Students who have been punished for malpractice at the examinations can forward their appeals to the Vice-Chancellor.

After directing it to the Committee Investigating Examination Irregularities, the Vice Chancellor can ask the committee to convene and consider the relevant appeals and make recommendations to the Senate.

In such cases, the decision taken by the Senate after considering the recommendation of the Committee Investigating Examination Irregularities, will be the final decision.

Appeals against punishments can be made by the student within 14 days of the receipt of the letter sent by the Administrative Officer of the Examination Division informing her/him of the punishment.

Candidates have no right to appeal after 14 days of receiving the letter.

- Activities related to issuing of concessional season tickets for travel by bus and train.
- Giving permission for guest lectures, seminars, films, dramas and meetings and related activities organized by student unions.
- Coordinating fundraising activities organized by student unions.

Student Centre

The Student Centre is open from 6.00 a.m. to 8.30 p.m. on working days except during vacation. The officer-in-charge is available from 8.00 a.m. to 4.15 p.m. Reading and sports facilities are provided at this centre.

This is located on the first floor of the reading room of the Student Centre.

Photocopying Service

Facilities are provided at the Student Centre, Main Library in the Dalugama Premise and Faculty of Medicine in Ragama Premise for students to make photocopies.

Common Rooms

There are separate common rooms for clergy, female and male students on the upper floor of the Student Centre.

People's Bank - Kelaniya Branch

This bank is situated at the entrance to the University on the Colombo-Kandy Road. It provides students with banking facilities. A branch of the bank is situated in the administration building of the University of Kelaniya

Post Office

The main post office, is situated at Wedamulla, Kelaniya on the Colombo-Kandy Road. A sub post office is situated in the premises of the University of Kelaniya, adjacent to the Faculty of Graduate Studies.

Monthly Season Tickets

Officers of the Kelaniya bus depot visit the University at the end of every month to issue season tickets from the Sri Lanka Transport Board. Season tickets are issued at the Student Welfare Division. In addition, applications for railway season tickets are issued in January and July every year at the Student Welfare Division.

3.1 Scholarships & Bursaries

• Mahapola Scholarships

The selected students are eligible for 10 installments on a monthly basis. The entire amount should be credited by the Mahapola trust fund to the student's bank account.

Payment conditions of Mahapola Trust Fund

- Every scholarship recipient should engage in the relevant studies and 80% attendance at lectures is compulsory.
- The Mahapola scholarship will be suspended by the Mahapola Trust Fund if a recipient is banned from lectures due to disciplinary issues or antisocial activities, punished for damaging university property, ragging, or for engaging in offensive acts.
- The Mahapola scholarship will be cancelled if a student has been found to be registered in university, fail exams or is employed.

Bursaries

The applications are called by the University during the academic year for the selection of suitable students for Bursaries. An approved monthly stipend is paid to the eligible students. The students who are not entitled to receive Mahapola or other scholarships are eligible to apply for the bursary.

Conditions applicable for the award of Bursaries

01. Your internal studentship is liable to be cancelled if any vital information is withheld from the application or proved to be inaccurate.
02. If there is any change in the family income, marital status or change of income from employment it should be brought to the notice of the University immediately.
03. The Bursary will be paid during the period you are engaged in academic activities. If for any reason you temporarily keep away from engaging in academic activities or take leave before termination of the course, it should be informed to the Registrar of the University.
04. Payment could be temporarily suspended or fully suspended for any one or more of the following reasons:
 - (a.) Your complete failure in any examination. If, however, you are referred in your first examination and registered for the second year the Bursary can be paid.
 - (b.) Any reason unacceptable to the Vice Chancellor for not sitting an examination.
 - (c.) Not continuing your academic work satisfactorily.
 - (d.) Not conducting yourself in a disciplined manner.
 - (c.) Any reason deemed to be sufficient as decided by the Governing Board of the Universities. [University Authority]
05. When payment of Bursaries is temporarily suspended or fully suspended, restoration of payment could be made at the discretion of the University authorities.
06. Students qualifying for Bursaries will be paid a maximum of 10 installments for an academic year. No more than 10 installments will be paid without the approval of the University Grants Commission.
07. Bursary will not be paid to those receiving Mahapola Scholarships. Monthly installments are paid through the Peoples Bank branches in Ragama and Kelaniya.
08. Students should sign for the first instalment of the first and second semester in every academic year with their account details

Other Scholarships

- Apart from government scholarships, there are scholarships awarded by other institutes and persons.
- The University Grants Commission awards scholarships to students who are not eligible for any other form of financial assistance.
- There are also scholarships awarded by institutions and individuals. Students are informed of these opportunities through notices displayed in common meeting places of the University.

- **Student Welfare Fund**

The Student Welfare Fund is created to provide financial assistance due to death or serious injuries/accidents of a student.

- **Vice Chancellor's Fund**

This fund has been established to provide limited financial assistance to students under very special circumstances. Further information about this fund can be obtained from the Student Welfare Division.

3.2 Student Hostels

3.2.1. Hostel Facilities and Wardens of Student Hostels

Hostel facilities are provided for a limited number of students by the University. These hostels are situated within the University premises and outside. Staff members are appointed to be part time wardens of these hostels. The entrance fee to the hostel is Rs.100/. In addition to that, the hostel fee for an academic year is Rs.500/-. This should be paid at the beginning of every academic year. First year students have to pay an additional fee of Rs.500/- as a non-refundable deposit.

Selected students should report to the hostel on the given date. Action is taken to fill the vacancies of those who do not present themselves within 07 days from the due date. The total hostel fee that should be paid is valid from the due date. Action is taken to charge thrice the fee if payments are not settled by the due date.

Permission is not granted to enter the hostel, until the total hostel fee is settled by the students.

At the beginning of every academic year, a hostel committee is appointed under the leadership of the Warden. Reporting on the welfare of the students and forwarding recommendations to the Warden are the responsibilities of such committees. 3. 2. 2 Hostel Rules and Regulations

- (a) The allocation of rooms for students is done by the relevant sub-warden.
- (b) A student should not change the room without the permission of the fulltime sub warden.
- (c) Students should return to the hostels at least by 10.00 p.m. Also, they should respect the privacy of other students.
- (d) No student should disturb others in the room or outside.
- (e) Students should not give accommodation facilities to a member of the university or outsider without the permission of the fulltime sub warden/warden.
- (f) No student should change the furniture in rooms without the permission of the fulltime sub warden/warden.
- (g) The furniture in the rooms should not be kept on the balcony or outside the rooms.
- (h) Students should be responsible individually as well as collectively for the furniture in a room where more than one student is living. The cost for lost or damaged furniture is charged from the responsible person or persons.
- (i) Students should not keep any equipment of the hostel except what is given to them for personal use.
- (j) The keys of the rooms and other equipment issued to the students should be handed over to the fulltime subwarden/warden at the beginning of the vacation period.
- (k) Illegal entrance to a hostel during vacation is prohibited.

Use of Personal Electric Items

Electric items other than those provided by the University should not be used without prior permission of the fulltime warden. Such instruments/devices used with the permission of the fulltime subwarden and should be checked and approved by an electrician of the University.

Rules associated with leaving the hostel

- (a) No student should leave the hostel before 6.00 a.m. without the permission of the sub warden/warden. Male residents should not leave the hostel after 10.00 p.m. without the permission of the subwarden/warden.
- (b) When the resident comes back after vacation, permission regarding accessing the hostel should be handed over to the warden.

Note

- No resident should seek private medical help without informing the medical officers of the University first. However, the warden has the power to facilitate external medical treatment based on the urgency and nature of the issue. On such occasions, it should be informed to the University medical officer as soon as possible.
- No student associations can be started at the hostel without the permission of the warden. No guest can be invited to deliver lectures without the permission of the warden.

Visitors

- (a) The warden can order any visitor to leave the hostel if he/she feels it is necessary.
- (b) A female student should not call any male visitor to her room and a male student should not call any female visitor to his room without the permission of the warden.
- Residents should refrain from giving tips to the domestic staff.
- **Alcohol and Substance Abuse:**
Taking liquor and substance abuse is strictly prohibited within the hostel premises.

Conditions of Residency

(a) Cleaning Hostel Rooms

- (i) Each student will sweep his/her room daily and remove all cobwebs, and clean the furniture once a week.
- (ii) All books and clothes will be kept clean and tidy.

(b) Washing and drying of clothes.

- (i) Clothes should not be spread on windows, doors and balconies nor should they be put on furniture to dry.
- (ii) Clothes should not be put in basins in bathrooms to be soaked.

(c) Switching on / off lights

- (i) Students should switch off all lights when they leave rooms and bathrooms.
- (ii) All the lights in parlours and rest rooms are switched off at 10.00 p.m.

(d) Solid waste

- (i) Solid waste should not be put in corridors or in the garden.
- (ii) Residents are responsible for cleaning their rooms. Rooms should be swept daily, and the waste should be kept outside the entrance to the room so that the domestic staff of the hostel can remove it.

(e) Maintaining suitable noise levels

- (i) Residents should keep noise levels to a minimum from 9.30 p.m. to 6.00 a.m.

- (ii) Residents are not permitted to play any musical instruments, listen to the radio or watch television between 9.30 p.m. and 6.00 a.m.

All the students of the hostels should obey the above rules and regulations. The warden has the power to punish students who violate these rules and regulations. Possible punishments include:

- (i) A fine of not more than Rs. 200/- and/or
- (ii) Suspending the right to use the hostel for a certain period of time

Whenever such a punishment is imposed, it is recorded in his/her personal file and the parents/guardians of the students are informed.

Bringing alcohol into hostels or using alcohol in any event is totally prohibited and if such an act is committed at any time, strict disciplinary action will be taken, and residency and studentship will be abolished.

Students shall abide by the above conditions of residency and the Hostels Committee will check whether the said conditions are followed. The aforesaid Committee will monitor the residency of the students in each room and will be awarding marks.

The awarded marks will be considered when the students are provided hostel facilities again and a student may lose hostel facilities for the loss of marks due to unsatisfactory conduct.

3.3 Matters Related to Student Unions

Faculty Student Unions and University Student Unions are established under the by-law of Unions. For each faculty union, the following officers and other members are elected.

- Chairman
- Vice Chairman
- Secretary
- Editor
- Junior Treasurer
- Committee Members

The number of committee members to be selected is decided according to the number of registered students in the faculty.

University Student Union

The following officers are elected for the University Student Union by elected officers of all the faculty level student unions and other members.

- Chairman
- Vice Chairman
- Secretary
- Editor
- Junior Treasurer

Other officers who have been selected from faculty level student unions and other members of these unions are appointed as members of the University Student Union.

3.4 Subject Societies/Other Student Societies

- If a group of students of the University of Kelaniya intend to form a student society, they should seek advice from the Senior Assistant Registrar/Student Welfare. The students who intend to form a student society should publicise their intention within the University. The students should call a general meeting and draft a constitution. The format of the constitution can be obtained from the Student Welfare Division of the University.
- Only the students of the University of Kelaniya have the right to obtain membership of any student society.
- The student society is not entitled to be affiliated to any other organization outside the University, without the prior written approval of the Director/Student Affairs.
- Any society that is not registered should not function in the university.
- The registration of a society must take place within two months after the commencement of the academic year and the expected programme of the society must be produced within two weeks of registration.

• Funds for Student Societies

Every subject society must have a junior as well as a Senior Treasurer. Funds for the society must be earned by collecting membership fees and in any other ways possible. Each society must maintain its own bank account.

Every payment must be paid by a voucher. The senior treasurer's approval must be obtained for every payment. The budget of each society/union must be produced to the Senior Assistant Registrar (Student Welfare) through the Senior Treasurer, within the stipulated period.

3.5 Instructions for the Organization of Meetings, Ceremonies, Films and Dramas

If any students' union of the university wishes to organize a meeting, a ceremony, a film or a drama, the required forms can be obtained from the Student Welfare Division. The approval of the Director of Students Affairs must be obtained for two activities with the recommendation of the Senior Treasurer of the respective Society/Union.

3.6 Organization of Tours

A student union/society may organize a tour subject to the following conditions.

- (a) All tours must fall on university holidays. If a tour needs to be organized during the academic year, the relevant Dean's approval should be obtained.
- (b) Formal written requests must be made for tours.
- (c) A list of the names of the participating students, approval letters of the lecturers who wish to join the tour, the time expected to be taken for the tour, the date and time of departure, expected return date and time, and the places of stay at night must be indicated in the request.
- (d) If female students are participating in the tour, a female permanent academic staff member must join the tour. The organizers of the tour should produce a letter signed by that female academic staff member confirming her willingness to participate.

The approval of the Director of Student Affairs must be obtained.

3.7 Instructions for the display of posters.

Rules for displaying posters are as follows.

- (a) All posters must be displayed at designated places with the approval of the Director of Students Affairs.
- (b) Every poster which contains a notice must be limited to 10 days.

Introduction

The University of Kelaniya Library has a history spanning over 65 years. In parallel to the Vidyalankara Pirivena becoming Vidyalankara University in 1959, the Library started with a collection of books that belonged to the Vidyalankara Pirivena. Subsequently, it was shifted to the current premises in 1977 with a larger collection. Later, as this old building was not sufficient to accommodate its growing collection, a newly built four-storied building was added to the Library system in 2013. Presently, the Library holds a collection of over 252,838 books and monographs relevant to various study programmes and research activities at the University. Furthermore, the Library subscribes to 25 local and foreign printed journals.

The Library provides access facilities to EBSCO, Research4Life, JSTOR, Emerald, Oxford University Press, Cambridge, Elsevier, Wiley, ProQuest and Taylor and Francis databases. These databases include more than 12,500 academic e-journals and approximately 100,000 e-books that the Library provides the staff and students of the university.

Professional librarians have been appointed for each faculty to fulfil the information requirements and Information Literacy training needs of the users. Thus, all registered members of the library have the opportunity to contact designated faculty librarians for their information and training needs.

Users can borrow books that are not available in the Library through the Inter Library Loan Service. Facilities for obtaining journal articles that are currently unavailable in the Library are also available through the British Library Document Delivery Service.

4.9 The Medical Faculty Library

The Medical Faculty Library, which was first established under the North Colombo Medical College, is located at the Ragama Medical Faculty premises. It caters to the academic staff and students of the Faculty of Medicine.

The Library has a collection of books comprising over 18,600 volumes, mainly related to medical sciences, and it subscribes to many full text medical e-journals through EBSCO databases. The Library also provides remote access to 30 Key Medical and Speech and Hearing Sciences E-textbooks and 16 specialized E-books via ProQuest EBook Central and Taylor and Francis Ebook platforms. In addition, all full-text journal databases subscribed to by the UCG consortium and the Main Library can also be accessed remotely.

Library services are provided to all registered students and academic and non-academic staff members of the faculty. The Library is open from 8.30 a.m. to 7.00 p.m. during weekdays and from 8.30 a.m. to 6.00 p.m. on Saturdays. It is closed on Sundays and government holidays.

4.10 Postgraduate Science Library

The Information and Communication Technology (ICT) Centre formerly known as the Computer Centre was established in the mid-1980s to provide computing skills to students. With the advances in Information Technology and changes in the role played by technology, the ICT Centre has become the primary ICT Services provider for the University.

Services provided by the ICT Centre include maintenance of the University's IT network including fiber-optics backbone, providing Kelani Wi-Fi services, email services to staff and students, e-learning services, IT helpdesk system for staff and students, ZOOM video conferencing, Office 365 free office package for staff and students, Microsoft Azure Dev Tools for teaching for staff and students, maintenance of the websites of the University, conducting certificate courses for students, installing hardware and software, developing Information Systems and supporting Faculties/ Departments/ Divisions to maintain their ICT equipment, training staff, advising and recommending procurement of ICT-related equipment, and more.

Certificate courses conducted by the ICT Centre include courses in Computer Literacy, Information Technology, JAVA Programming, Web Designing, Computer Hardware Technology, Advanced Networking, and Graphic Designing and Editing. The objective

of the Computer Literacy Course is to provide undergraduates with basic skills in using computers, using office productivity packages such as Microsoft Office, Open Office and using Internet-based services. The Certificate in Information Technology course provides an introduction to key concepts in Information technology. Both courses are open to all undergraduates. A textbook focusing on these courses has also been published by the ICT Centre. Courses in Programming, Web Designing, Computer Hardware Technology, Advanced Networking and, Graphic Designing and Editing are limited enrollment courses, and students are selected for these courses based on their performance at the Information Technology course.

In addition, workshops and training sessions for academic, academic support, administrative and non-academic staff of the university are also conducted by the ICT Centre.

The ICT Centre is equipped with approximately 245 computers in 5 computer teaching laboratories, printers, scanners, video conferencing equipment, and other ICT-related equipment for the use of both students and staff of the university.

The ICT Centre is open from 8.00 am to 6.30 pm on all working days and from 8.00 am to 5.30 pm during weekends. Opening hours are extended during the periods of study leave and examinations.

A university-wide wireless network has been established covering the entire university including university-owned hostels. The ICT Centre has also introduced a Single-Sign-on System for Internet-based services such as accessing email, e-learning systems, Wi-Fi, and to access the Internet.

The Faculty of Humanities, which dates back to the inception of the Vidyalkara Pirivena in 1875, is a unique faculty that combines the study of language, literature, performing and visual arts, aesthetics, and religious studies. The Faculty of Humanities together with the Faculty of Social Sciences, offers a Bachelor of Arts degree. The Faculty also offers Bachelor of Arts Honours degree programmes to students along with postgraduate courses that lead to M.A., M.Phil., and Ph.D. degrees.

The curricula offered by the Faculty of Humanities consist of a wealth of eastern knowledge alongside state-of-the-art rich knowledge that would ultimately cater to the knowledge capital of Sri Lanka. The curricula are designed to mold responsible citizens and leaders of the country who are equipped with intellectual integrity, self-discipline, responsibility, creativity, critical thinking skills and the principles of inclusivity so that they can contribute to society and the world of work independently and collaboratively.

The Faculty of Humanities has two computer labs of its own, which provide IT access to students in addition to the services provided by the University's main IT Centre. Moreover, the Departments of English Language Teaching, Sinhala, Modern Languages, Western Classical Culture and Christian Studies, and Fine Arts also have their own computer labs.

The Department of English Language is a part of the Faculty of Humanities that offers English courses to undergraduates in all the faculties. The Cultural Centre of the University of Kelaniya, which also comes under the purview of the Faculty of Humanities, is located at the back of the Dharmaloka Hall. It offers space for students to engage in cultural activities. The Centre offers dancing, music, handcraft, drama and photography courses to the university community.

The Research Centre of the Faculty of Humanities (RCFH) which is located in K 28, was established with the aim of developing a strong research culture in the Faculty. It strives to foster a stimulating interdisciplinary community of academics to share knowledge through intensive discussions. The Centre organizes the International Conference on the Humanities (ICH) and the Humanities Undergraduate Research Symposium (HUG) annually. Also, all research related workshops are conducted through the RCFH.

7. Diploma in Photography course
8. Diploma in Film and Television course
9. Diploma in Drama and Theatre course
10. Diploma in Script Writing

The main objective of these Degree programs is to create academics with the knowledge and skills required for the development of the country. Core subjects such as Drama and Theatre, Image Arts, Film and Television are intended to train and to develop the skills of the undergraduates in Humanities for sustainable national development. These programs have created graduates who have been awarded nationally for their excellence, knowledge and skills.

The first Degree program offered by the Department is Drama and Theatre, the content of which is both theoretical and practical. The course includes the extensive academic study of local and foreign drama history, universal drama genres, drama traditions, and trends, as well as practical exercises and workshops on acting, drama production and directing. This course is offered as BA General in BA Honours in Drama and Theatre.

The second Degree program of the Department course content includes camera-based photography, film, video, television, and computer-based digital audio visualization and image creation. This course covers theoretical and practical subjects as well as studies on the arts of photography, cinema, videography, and television studies, as well as its application and creative application. This course is offered in both BA General in BA Honours in Image Arts.

There are **no pre-requisites** for the **Drama and Theatre** and **Image Arts** Degree programs. Further, any student can follow the above courses after obtaining admission either to the Faculty of Humanities or to the Faculty of Social Sciences of the University of Kelaniya. In the process of admission to the BA Honours Degree program, special consideration will be given to the students with skills in areas such as painting, music, dance, acting, creative writing and photography.

The third is the Degree in Film and Television Studies. Direct admission of the students to the course is done by the University Grants Commission. Students will be selected through an aptitude test conducted by the Department. The test is conducted under two sections, written and oral. The oral test will be conducted only for students who pass the written test. The oral examination is done on-site or using an online method. Students are selected by the University Grants Commission taking into consideration the marks obtained in the Aptitude test. Those who passed the Advanced Level in Science, Arts and Commerce streams can apply for this course. The aptitude test is advertised in newspaper and on the University website. It should be noted that Film and Television Studies offers the opportunity to pursue a four-year Bachelor of Arts honours degree.

Students who directly come to the university under general admission will not be given the opportunity to pursue this degree course.

The students who do not follow the core subject units of the two courses of Drama and Theatre and Image Arts will have the opportunity to select auxiliary units in Drama, Photography and cinema with the approval of the Department.

Postgraduate Studies

This Department also conducts a Master of Arts degree programme in Drama and Theatre. In addition, the facilities for research studies in the disciplines of Drama, Cinema, Photography, and Television leading up to M.Phil. and PhD.

Diploma in Photography Course

The one-year Diploma in photography is conducted for external students who may be amateurs or professionals but those who are keen to develop their skills theoretically and practically in an academic setting. This course will cover advanced composition, studio lighting and portfolio presentation. In addition, the lectures will be conducted by well-experienced academics in the field and pioneers of photography.

Diploma in Film and Television Course

The one-year Diploma in the Film and Television course is offered for the external students. The course will provide a fine theoretical and practical approach from the field of film and television. Pioneers in the film industry, experienced academics of the field, and university lecturers will conduct the lectures in this diploma.

Diploma in Drama and Theatre Course

The one-year Diploma in the Drama Theatre course is offered for the external students. The course will provide a fine theoretical and practical approach from the field of Drama and Theatre. Pioneers in the drama industry, experienced academics of the field, and university lecturers will conduct the lectures in this diploma.

Diploma in Script Writing

This one-year diploma can be identified as a course implemented for the external student who have an interest in Drama and Cinema and television studies. Both theoretical and practical sessions related to the subject will be conducted by well-experienced researchers, renowned artists and expertise in the field as recourse persons. Internal students also can register for this diploma after paying the required fees of the diploma.

The Department of English Language Teaching (DELTA) is responsible for the practical, task-oriented aspect of Teaching English as a Second Language (TESL) in the University of Kelaniya.

The vision of the DELTA is to be a centre of excellence in English language education and to make English available to all. Its mission is to train undergraduates in English communication skills, improve their academic writing in English, and to train them for the world of work. Also, the DELTA strives to equip TESL graduates with pedagogical skills, methodologies, theoretical input and critical thinking tools to make them successful professionals with a strong background of research.

The DELTA is a part of the Faculty of Humanities but provides English courses to all the faculties of the University of Kelaniya. Its strength lies in its ability to liaise with students and staff from all disciplines and provide English for Specific Purposes (ESP) and English for Academic Purposes (EAP) courses as needed. The DELTA course units are offered to all Levels from the first year to fourth year. The DELTA offers a number of professional English courses to many faculties and the 4th level course focuses on writing research theses.

The DELTA also offers Teaching English as a Second Language (TESL) Honours Degree to those who wish to pursue a career in Teaching English as a Second Language. The Degree in TESL focuses on creating professionals in Teaching English in Sri Lanka and it is different from the degree in English offered by the Department of English. The

students reading for the Degree in TESL will focus on areas such as applied linguistics, language acquisition, teaching methodology and language testing broadly. Furthermore, the undergraduates are accustomed to the research culture and trained to engage in research through various course units. A comprehensive internship programme provides the platform for them to apply theory into practice.

In addition to the academic programmes, the DELT conducts a monthly guest lecture/seminar/workshop series titled “Perkumpulan” in order to create space for academic discussion within the Department.

The DELT was awarded an “A” grade at the Programme Review that was conducted in 2017 by the QAC of the UGC which bears witness to the quality of the programme and the dedication of the academic and non-academic staff of the DELT.

The academic staff of the DELT work actively to support the University’s and the nation’s efforts to improve the standard of English language teaching and learning as well as to raise the bar for academic excellence and research. They teach on the Junior Staff Development Programme, English courses for non-academic staff, and perform other vital English language related tasks for the faculty and the University. The academic staff of the DELT also supervise undergraduate and postgraduate theses and teach on various postgraduate courses such as the MA in Linguistics, the MBA, and the MBus.

The Department offers academic programmes for the BA and BA Honours Degrees.

The BA Honours in Visual Arts and Design programme offers Art History, Theoretical, and Practical Training in Garden Design and Interior Design, and Practical Training in Painting, Sculpture, and Computer Graphic Design.

The Performing Arts program is twofold: BA Honours in Performing Arts in Dance and BA Honours in Performing Arts in Music. Both the subjects offer practical training in music and dance, and an industry training as well. It is mandatory for those who follow music to learn both vocal music and instrumental music. Those who follow dance will learn all three traditional dance forms; Kandyan, Low-country, and Sabaragamuwa, together with the drumming that belongs to the respective traditions. Additionally, students of music and dance will have to undergo academic and a practical training in Sri Lankan Folk Music, Choreography, Make-up and Costume Design.

The Honours Degree programme in Computer Graphic Design offers theoretical and practical training in Computer Graphic Design, 2D and 3D Animation, Principles of Typography and Page layout, Image Processing, Animated Story Telling, Animation Sound Design, Video Editing etc. Students will also have an opportunity to engage in a career-oriented internship as part of their degree requirements.

In order to be accepted to the Visual Arts and Design degree programme, the student should have a C grade or above for Art at the G.C.E. (Advanced Level). Those who do not satisfy this requirement are required to pass a practical painting test conducted by

the Department. A pass with a C grade for Dancing or Music is a pre-requisite for those who wish to enroll in the Performing Arts degree programme. There are no prerequisites to be enrolled in the Honours Degree Programs in Computer Graphic Design and Digital Design, although students who obtained a C or above for Art or Information and Communication Technology (ICT) at the G.C.E. (Advanced Level) will be given preference.

India, which is our neighbor and has the second highest population in the world, uses Hindi as the official language and it is the mother tongue of the majority of Indians. The main library and the departmental library 'Prof. Indra Dassanayake Hindi Library' houses texts necessary for Hindi Studies.

Prior knowledge of Hindi is not a prerequisite to join this programme. The course is constructed in a way that the candidates can learn Hindi from the beginning, while receiving knowledge of the language, literature and culture. It is expected that at the end of the first year, the students will be able to communicate in the Hindi language. The Department also caters to those who do not take Hindi as a main subject, but as an optional course.

Bachelor of Arts Honours in Hindi Studies

Those who achieve high scores in the first-year examinations will be offered to read for Honours in Hindi. Hindi is the medium of study of this course which is designed to give an expansive knowledge on the Hindi language, folk and classical literature, and Hindi speaking culture (North Indian culture). You can obtain further information about this course of study from the Head of the Department.

M. Phil. / Ph. D. in Hindi Studies

Those who are qualified to read for an M.Phil., or a Ph.D. can continue their studies on the Hindi language, folk and classical literature, and the Hindi speaking culture (North Indian culture). You can obtain further information about this course of study from the Head of the Department.

Certificate Course in Hindi Studies

This is a one-year certificate course designed to give competency in written and spoken Hindi. Undergraduate of any level of the Degree programme can be registered for this course. Prior knowledge of Hindi is not a prerequisite to join this programme.

Diploma in Hindi Studies

This is a fee levied one year diploma for external students who are interested in learning the Hindi language.

The Government of India offers scholarships to undergraduates reading for a BA or BA Honours in Hindi to receive training for ten months at Central Hindi Directorate (Kendriya Hindi Sansthan) located in Agra.

Department of Linguistics

An independent department for linguistics in the university system in Sri Lanka was first established in the University of Kelaniya, under the Faculty of Humanities in 1972. During the past four decades, the Department of Linguistics has introduced four degree courses namely Linguistics, Translation Studies, Translation Methods and Tamil as a Second Language. Further, the Department offers Tamil Language as an elective course, Short Term Course in Tamil Language and Certificate Course in Tamil for Foreign Students.

Linguistics

Linguistics is the scientific study of language. It does not only focus on one particular language but it is a common study on all human languages. It focuses on the identity, composition, history of the human languages as well as the relationships between languages with other subject areas.

There are subjects that lead a candidate to pursue practical studies utilizing linguistics knowledge. Clinical Linguistics, Applied Linguistics, Communication Disabilities, Sign Language, Lexicography and Language Planning are among such subjects. This course introduces scientific information necessary for language scholars who follow higher studies in the discipline.

Prerequisites are not expected. This course is open for any scholar of the Faculties of Humanities and Social Sciences who is interested in studying language scientifically.

Translation Studies

Translation Studies is a subject limited only for the B.A. (Special) Degree. Students from any A/L subject stream can follow this course provided they pass the Aptitude Test held by the University and get selected by the University Grants Commission on an Z-Score based criterion. Students of translation studies are expected to improve proficiency in Sinhala, English and Tamil languages along with theoretical knowledge and practical training in translation.

Translation Methods

This is a practical subject limited only for the B.A. degree. The scholars who select Translation Methods are expected to be competent in both the Sinhala and English languages. The students who wish to follow this subject shall sit for an examination conducted by the Department of Linguistics and this course will be conducted subject to the registration of five (05) minimum students. In teaching Translation Methods, both the Sinhala and English languages are used. At the end of the course, i.e. in the third year, the scholars have to follow a course unit of professional training with regard to translations.

Tamil as a Second Language

Students who wish to follow Tamil as a second language should possess a 'S' pass for Tamil as a second language at the G.C.E. (O/L) examination and they should pass the eligibility test conducted by the Department of Linguistics.

Tamil as an Optional Subject

Any student can follow the Tamil Language as an auxiliary subject. There are no pre-requisites for this subject.

Proficiency in Tamil Language

This is a one-year course with no pre-requisites. Students can register from the effective date of registration of 1st year (minimum) and 3rd or 4th years (maximum).

Diploma in Sign Language Interpretation

This is a two-year course for which students can register in the first and the second year. There are no pre-requisites to follow this course.

Certificate Course in Tamil for Foreign Students

This is a one-year fee-levying course offered to foreign language students.

Diploma Courses

There are two fee-levying (Weekend) courses – Diploma in Tamil Language and Diploma in Translation & Interpretation. These are one year courses.

Post Graduate Courses

The Department offers a two year M.A. in Linguistics, a Master of Philosophy in Linguistics and Doctor of Philosophy courses.

In the modern world, living languages used by different countries for day-to-day communication, administration, education and research are called Modern Languages. Study programmes offered by the Department of Modern Languages are designed not only to give a thorough knowledge of the target language but also to understand literature, culture, and philosophy of the country in which the target languages are

spoken and to provide comprehensive knowledge in conducting research in the relevant foreign language.

The Department consists of permanent lecturers as well as international scholars on visiting basis from different countries and conducts courses in Chinese, French, German, Japanese, Spanish, Russian and Korean languages.

B.A. Degree programme

- a) A prior knowledge in a relevant language is not a requirement to follow the first year of the Bachelor's Degree except for French and Japanese languages. The undergraduates who wish to follow either French or Japanese language must obtain at least a pass in the relevant subject at the G.C.E. (A/L) Examination. Upon passing the proficiency test conducted by the Department, undergraduates are allowed to follow the particular language course even if they do not fulfill the above-mentioned requirement.
- b) Language, literature and the culture of the relevant foreign language would be studied during the study program.
- c) Undergraduates, whose attendance is below 80% throughout the academic year will not be eligible to sit the end of course examinations.

Undergraduates, who do not enroll in the above languages as core subjects, are given the opportunity to follow the relevant auxiliary units in those languages.

B.A. Honours Degree programme

The Department offers Honours Degree programs in French, German, Japanese, Russian, Chinese and Korean. Further information could be obtained from the Department.

Certificate Course in Modern Languages

(Chinese, Japanese, French, Russian, German, Korean, Arabic, Italian, Spanish)

First or second year undergraduates of any Faculty would be eligible to follow this course. The certificate course is designed to provide a thorough knowledge of the relevant language and culture where any prior knowledge of the subject would not be required. At the end of the one-year course, the undergraduates who successfully complete the course will be awarded a certificate.

The Department of Pali and Buddhist Studies is a pioneering department at the University of Kelaniya, which was known as the 'Buddhist Faculty' in the period of the *Vidyālakāra* University. The main purpose of the Department is to promote vast areas of study and research on Buddhism giving privotal attention to the Pāli Canon while also academically scrutinizing the teachings of the Buddha together with its philosophical and cultural aspects. Indeed, the mission of the Department is to enable the students to handle the expanding field of Buddhist Studies successfully. Consequently, Pāli, Buddhist Philosophy, Buddhist Culture, Buddhist Psychology are the main subjects in the curricula of this Department. It offers Degrees on Buddhist Studies at undergraduate, (both the General and Honours Degrees), and Postgraduate levels (B.A./M.A./M.Phil./Ph.D.). As a result of the interest in the study of Buddhism, this Department has acquired a remarkable increase in fame among other academic Buddhist institutions not only in Sri Lanka but also overseas. Thus, a remarkable number of foreign students, from various countries such as China, Korea, Vietnam, Cambodia, Myanmar and Bangladesh, are pursuing their academic goals at this Department. Further, countries such as Singapore, Malaysia and China conduct their academic works in their respective Buddhist Studies institutions and conferment of degrees following the subject syllabi and other relevant guidelines at the Department of Pāli and Buddhist Studies in the University of Kelaniya.

Pali

The Pāli language occupies an important place among the classical languages that still have a historical value, besides being replete with rich literary and semantic qualities. The main purpose of offering this subject is to prepare the student to comprehend Buddhism accurately. Further, through a systematic analysis of the content of the Tipitaka, the students are introduced to a wide range of knowledge not only of Buddhist thought but also of contemporary religious systems of India. This syllabus is meant to provide the student with an opportunity to acquire proficiency in the Pali canon and its traditional exegeses. It also includes an inquiry into the canonical standpoints with regard to areas such as Buddhist Epistemology, Buddhist Logic, Aesthetics and Poetics. In order to further enhance the students' comparative knowledge, strict attention is drawn to the primary sources in hybrid Sanskrit and Prakrit. Further, the students can pursue studies in either Sinhala or English mediums.

Buddhist Philosophy

Buddhist Philosophy is, one of the areas of knowledge, unique among Indian thought. Its speciality relating to other traditions is the integration of its philosophy and the fact that for over two hundred thousand years, it has been the nurturing force of Asian life and thought, a phenomenon that continues to this day. We have three Canonical traditions and versions that are helpful to comprehend the fundamental characteristics of the subject area of Buddhism. They are the Pali, Chinese and Tibetan Tipitakas. The

oldest among them is Pali and it mainly studies the thought in primary sources such as the *Pali Tipitaka, Atthakatha, Tika* according to historical, critical and comparative academic methodologies. While embracing areas such as analysis of man and the world, ethics, epistemology, analysis of psychological phenomena, society, economy and political philosophy, and communication, this subject also includes *Madhyamika, Yogacara and Vajrayana* philosophies and more related areas of study. This study also includes the development, distinctive features and fields of Buddhist philosophical traditions of varied geographical areas. In the subject of 'Buddhist Philosophy', facilities are provided to study from the First Degree upto a Doctor of Philosophy. Further, the students can pursue studies in either Sinhala or English medium.

Buddhist Culture

In the area of Buddhist Culture an advanced study of Buddhism and the evolving of culture is pursued. Here facilities are provided for studies ranging from B.A. and (Honours) degrees upto MA, and PhD degrees. A student passing G.C.E.(A/L) in any Arts subject qualifies to following this subject for the B.A. Degree programme. The areas of " Buddhist Culture" comprises chiefly of the Cultural Background of India, Fundamental Principles of Buddhist Culture, Source Studies, Buddhist Arts and Archaeology, Social Institutions and Thought,.Rites,Rituals, and Customs, Sri Lankan Buddhist Culture, Trends and Global Expansion of Buddhism, Mahayana Buddhism and Comparative Study of Religion. Additional courses have been introduced for the study of Sri Lankan culture in accordance with relevant and modern studies and trends for the increase of knowledge in the field, such as Management, Counseling, Environmental Ethics, Buddhist Art, Ayurveda and Astrology. The subject units could be followed by a student reading any subject and does not require prior qualifications. In view of the increasing demand for knowledge on Buddhism, both locally and internationally, facilities are provided for the study of the subject in both Sinhala and English.

Buddhist Psychology

Modern Psychology is recognized as a science, a field of philosophy, which studies the psychology of the mind in depth. In brief, the main aim, of Modern Psychology is to provide comprehensive guidance on psychology for people to succeed in their lives, as well as to eliminate problems related to their day today lives. As a result of increasing problems in society, the field of Modern Psychology has also been widened introducing a large number of subfields such as Counseling Psychology, Clinical Psychology, Child Psychology, School Psychology Educational Psychology, Development Psychology, and Abnormal Psychology etc. It is also of prime importance that each of these fields is of a number of more sub severances.

On the other hand, it could be said that Buddhism itself presents a profound understanding of the human mind and therefore the subject is called 'Buddhist

Psychology'. In truth, Buddhist Psychology aims at solving all fundamental causes and derivations of problems related to individuals so as to achieve the well being of humans through mental development. Indeed, as evident in the characteristic of Buddhism, mentioned previously, it cannot be dichotomized as Buddhism and Psychology. However, at present, Buddhist teachings are being studied to help people by blending it with western theories of Psychology. Even though Sri Lankans can claim this valuable and profound psychological philosophy, unfortunately, we still have not been able to employ it for the benefit of the Sri Lankan society.

Therefore, by taking into consideration this inadequate emphasis on putting Buddhist teaching into practice in society, as a distinguished national university, we have decided to establish a foreign academic field of studying Buddhism introducing both the General and Honours Degrees in "Buddhist Psychology". Student following the course will be able to study areas such as fundamentals of Buddhist Psychology, Buddhist Cognitive Psychology, Buddhist Concept of Psychiatry, Psychology of Death in Buddhist Perspective, Buddhist Analysis of Psychological Disorders, Mindfulness Based Stress Management, Buddhist Counseling Psychology, and Meditation for Development of Human Competencies, and so on. Further, this subject can also be followed in Sinhala and English mediums. Therefore, it is our pleasure to mention that this kind of degree cannot be obtained from any other University in Sri Lanka.

This Department which was previously named as the Department of Sanskrit was renamed as *the Department of Sanskrit and Eastern Studies* under the Gazette 2069/16 based on the recommendation given by the Council of the University of Kelaniya in accordance with the proposal made by the Head of the Department with the consent of the academic staff of the Department in the year 2016.

At present, few students study Sanskrit in the university and it is observed that the number of lay students following Sanskrit is strikingly limited. Sanskrit is in fact confined to the Pirivena. Therefore, many consider Sanskrit as a religious language reserved for the Bhikkus. This wrong impression is the reason for laymen to keep away from Sanskrit Studies. Yet, the Sanskrit language, which is not limited to a country, a province or an area, is entering various fields in the entire world.

The lack of knowledge in Sanskrit could indeed cause many challenges to a student studying Sinhala, Pali, Hindi or any other language. Further, Sanskrit has influenced fields such as History, Archeology, Economics, Meteorology, Music, Management and its influence is apparent in most of the technical terms used in these fields. Certain scholars would even hesitate to consider a set of literary works as 'literature' if they have not been enriched by Sanskrit.

Further, a wide range of subjects are connected to Sanskrit. Architecture, Yoga, Astrology, Indigenous Medicine, Hinduism, Mahayana Buddhist Philosophy, Vedic Mathematics, Vedic Management and Vedic Administration are only a few of them. It is difficult to study these subjects without the knowledge of the Sanskrit language. Hence, the preservation and continuation of the mentioned subjects rely on the preservation of Sanskrit.

In this respect, the University of Kelaniya has decided to change the name of the

Department in order to bring together the many subjects aligned with Sanskrit studies for the Development of the subject area. Thus, the Department of Sanskrit and Eastern Studies has granted the following Degree courses.

- BA Honours Degree in *Sanskrit*
- BA Honours Degree *Vastusastra* (Architecture)

No prerequisites are required to follow the above degree courses. However, students are admitted to the BA Honours degree based on their performance at the first-year examinations. Students aspiring to pursue the BA degree can choose Sanskrit and Vastusastra as a subject unit. All study areas are taught from the very beginning.

A student following Sanskrit at the Department will obtain knowledge in Sanskrit Language, Literature, Dancing and Philosophy. The syllabus pertaining to the degree course on *Vastushastra* was introduced with the intention of introducing local Architecture to prospective students. Students who opt to pursue this course will follow modules on local and modern architecture and on tools such as AutoCAD.

The Department aspires to facilitate Hinduism as a subject to BA degree.

Further, every internal student of the University of Kelaniya has the opportunity to study the certificate and Advance Certificate Course in Sanskrit.

Sanskrit can also be studied as a main subject of the External Degree offered by the University.

External students are also given the opportunity to follow Certificate Courses in *Vastusastra* (Architecture), Astrology and Advance certificate in Yoga philosophy. Diploma in *vastusastra*, Diploma in Sanskrit and Diploma in Yoga. The annual magazine '*Sadana*' published by the Department showcases the talents of students following Sanskrit and related studies. An International Research Conference is organized annually to provide a common platform for those who wish to follow their research in the field of Eastern studies. The Department also offers MPhil and PhD. degrees to postgraduate students.

This does not belong to the degree course and is an additional qualification.

The Sinhala Department of the University of Kelaniya conducts courses in **Sinhala** and **Literary Criticism** under two streams, the Bachelor of Arts degree and the Bachelor of Arts Honours degree. Following Sinhala for G.C.E. A/L is not a prerequisite to follow these programmes. The Department also provides facilities for M.A, M.Phil., as well as Ph.D. degrees. It also provides facilities for research leading up to advanced studies. The Department also conducts a one year certificate course and a six month certificate course in Sinhala for foreign students. In addition, a one year Diploma course in Sinhala is conducted for non-Sinhala Sri Lankans.

The B.A. as well as the B.A. Honours Degree have been designed to include the academic analysis of Sinhala language and Grammar, Inscriptions, Palaeography, Classical Sinhala Prose, Verse, Aesthetics, Literary Theory, Sinhala Culture Folklore, Arts and Architecture, Modern Sinhala Short Stories, Novels, Poetry, Sinhala Drama, and Sinhala Cinema. In addition, the Sinhala Department has introduced a Course in Literary Criticism for the B.A. Degree as well as for the Honours Degree. Students are registered on the Honours Degree programme on the basis of high marks obtained at the first year examination.

It is observed that the knowledge of undergraduates with regard to Sinhala Language is questionable. The students who have not studied Sinhala after their G.C.E (O/L) Examination face serious problems in writing in Sinhala. Based on this premise the Department of Sinhala has designed several optional courses for such students. Any student from the Faculties of Science, Commerce and Management Studies, Social Science, and Humanities can apply for these optional Sinhala course units.

Furthermore, a **Sinhala Language Certificate Course** has been introduced under the Modern Language Certificate Programme for the **non-Sinhala speaking students**. A prior knowledge in Sinhala language is not required for this course.

The Department offers two Bachelor of Arts degree programmes, namely Western Classical Culture or Greek and Roman Culture and Christian Culture. It is not necessary to have followed these subjects earlier to select them for the B.A. degree. These degree programmes could be studied in the Sinhala or English medium.

Western Classical Culture or Greek & Roman Culture

This deals with the study of the culture in ancient Greece and Rome where Western civilization originated. The opportunity has been given to follow Greek and Roman literature, Literary Criticism, Drama, Theatre, Poetry, Great Poetry, Ancient Civilization in Greece, Antiquities and Art under this study area. This programme also consists of subjects such as Greek Philosophy, Greek and Roman religions and Greek Thought. This course can be followed in either English or Sinhala medium.

Christian Culture

The main objective of this programme is to scientifically analyze Christian Culture. This study programme helps Christians of various groups to develop a scientific outlook on Christianity allowing them to master inter-religious and philosophical knowledge irrespective of the student's religious or ideological background. Since the English, French, Italian, Spanish, Russian, German languages evolved in connection with Christian Culture, it will be useful for students who are following those subjects to follow Christian Culture courses. This study programme deals with Christian document analysis, philosophical thought, fundamentals, literature, arts, history and also historical analysis of the Bible.

It is for the purpose of enhancing the subject area of Christian Culture that students are recruited on special intake basis. Hence, such students are expected to follow the B.A. Honours in Christian Culture Degree programme.

The undergraduates who select the B.A. Honours in Christian Culture degree programme have the opportunity of taking 18 credits from the Faculty of Computing & Technology

The Bachelor of Education (BEd Hons) degree program will be implemented as soon as the education unit receives the approval of the University Grants Commission.

7.13 Internship & Skills Development Unit

The Internship & Skills Development Unit was established in the Faculty of Humanities of the University of Kelaniya in 2019 in order to assist student who pursue their degree in the Arts stream to overcome the complex challenges they will have to face as graduates after their study period. The establishment of this unit was based on a concept of the AHEAD project, which was implemented with assistance from World Bank. The primary aim of setting up this academic unit was to increase the student's employability and to develop the associated skills, thus playing a unique role in the Faculty of Humanities. The unit's objectives are as follows:

- Directing the students for authentic industrial training related to employment within and without the subject field they are studying within the period of studying the degree.
- Providing opportunities for students to engage with public and private sector institutions in Sri Lanka to gain professional competence in matters such as corporate administrative structures and management, the operation of corporate rules and ethics, and the nature of a work environment.
- Expanding services and opportunities to help develop a student's personality for employment.
- To develop in the students the ability to manage the three languages of Sinhala, English and Tamil for office work.
- To improve the use of information technology and to develop computer literacy in students which is a special need concerning professional competencies today.
- To develop leadership qualities in the students and to promote their teamwork skills, decision-making skills, organizational skills, and ability to perform any task well
- To develop the ability to work in a manner that respects others and does not violate the rights of others in the Sri Lankan society that comprises different languages, cultures and lifestyles.
- To develop the ability to adapt to any work environment and to build a sense of responsibility and accountability in the students.
- In addition to the subject knowledge, developing application and presentation skills that should exist in the students, as well as developing the basic statistical and analytical knowledge essential in office work.

To achieve the above objectives, so far the Internship & Skills Development Unit has introduced about 08 career-oriented subject units covering 12 credits. Being allowed to complete these subject units as an essential part of the degree course can also be said to be a privilege for you as a student to add a new value to your degree certificates.

The Faculty of Social Sciences consists of thirteen departments of study. The Faculty offers 18 subjects for the Bachelor's degree. Students are able to follow Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Arts Honours degrees in those subjects in addition to prescribed lectures and tutorial classes relevant to the degree courses offered by the departments in the Faculty. Lectures, Seminars, and Workshops are held with the participation of specialists in various fields of study in order to improve the subject knowledge of the students.

Certificate courses, Diploma courses, Postgraduate Diploma courses, MA. (one year) and MSc (two years) courses from selected subject streams are conducted by the Faculty of Social Sciences and the Faculty also provides facilities to follow M.Phil. and Ph.D. degrees based on research, by providing a research laboratory and information technology facilities and other resources.

The SIDA/SAREC Research Library which was established at the Faculty of Social Sciences under the SIDA/SAREC research project fund, has a collection of thousands of books, research publications, journals and magazines. The Information Centre which commenced as a part of the research library provides internet and other information facilities to researchers.

There are three computer laboratories fully equipped with the latest software, internet and other technological facilities, established in the K3 and K4 buildings of the Faculty of Social Sciences and they are available for the use of students. Also, the main lecture halls of the Faculty are equipped with multimedia projectors and other relevant facilities creating a comfortable learning and teaching environment.

An Audio Visual Studio has been established under the Department of Mass Communication on the first floor of the K4 building. The students are given the opportunity to learn the modern techniques and latest advanced technology used in Mass Communication and to gain the relevant practical competence.

The Research Centre for Social Sciences (RCSS) was established with the aim of carrying out timely important research activities. The Research Centre has also launched a programme to provide financial assistance for research and its publication for the academic staff members of the Faculty who are interested in engaging in research activities. The Journal of Social Sciences, Sri Lanka is published by RCSS once every

three months. In addition, two periodicals which include research articles are published annually by each department of study at the Faculty of Social Sciences. This center conducts the International Conference on Social Sciences, Sri Lanka and it further organizes lectures, discussions, workshops and seminars on Research Methodology and other relevant topics for the academic staff and the undergraduates.

The aim of establishing the Palm Leaf Manuscript Study and Research Library is to conserve the local manuscript heritage of the country and to facilitate the research work related to manuscripts. It has a large collection of rare palm leaf manuscripts together with a collection of digitalized palm leaf manuscripts.

Academic and research activities, with special reference to the Asian Region, are conducted by the Asian Centre which is a part of this Faculty.

First year undergraduates enrolled with the Social Sciences and Humanities Faculties have the opportunity to apply for the undergraduate degree programmes in Archaeology, Anthropology and Tourism and Cultural Resource Management (TCRM) offered by the Department of Archaeology under the Faculty of Social Science. There are no prerequisites for enrolling in these programmes and during the end of the first-year exam. Students could apply for Bachelor of Honours degrees in either Archaeology or TCRM. The selection process for these degrees is based on the cut-off results of the first- year examination. The Student intake for each Bachelor of Honours degree programme is contingent upon the resource availability of the department. Further, student can utilize departmental resources, including the laboratory, library and museum, etc facilities to support their studies.

The Department of Archaeology is one of the most renowned and well-established departments in the Faculty of Social Sciences. Further, it has a robust partnership with the Postgraduate Institute of Archaeology in Colombo, which is an affiliated institute of the University of Kelaniya. The students have access to the post-graduate institute resources and can actively engage in various research-related activities offered by them. The Department of Archaeology and the Central Cultural Fund are primary organizations in the field of Archaeology and the directorship of both organizations have been held by eminent professors from the Department of Archaeology at the University of Kelaniya. Additionally, many of the staff members in the Archaeology discipline are alumni of various archaeology – related prestigious organizations and institutions. Moreover, the department academic staff is committed to teaching and leading various national and international research programmes while enhancing student’ skills and knowledge.

In addition to that, the Department maintains a strong relationship with government and private sector entities involved in Tourism, with the aim of improving the caliber of the tourism degree programme and facilitating practical learning opportunities. Another noteworthy aspect of the TCRM Honours degree programme is that it is conducted in English medium since the academic year 2020/2021. The undergraduate students pursuing a Bachelor of Art Honours degree in Tourism and Cultural Resource Management are required to follow a modern language course defined by the TCRM curricula and also, students need to engage in practical training sessions and an internship programme as a partial fulfillment of their degree programme. The Department of Economics of the University of Kelaniya was established along with the establishment of the University in 1959. The Department offers Bachelor of Arts Honours in Economics and Bachelor of Arts Degree programmes at the undergraduate level. From the academic year 2017/2018, B.A. Honours in Economics is offered in both English and Sinhala medium. In addition, the Department also conducts Postgraduate Degree programmes namely, Master of Arts (MA) and Master of Social Sciences (MSSc) in Economics in both Sinhala and English medium. Further, opportunities have been extended to obtain Master of Philosophy (M.Phil), and Doctor of Philosophy (PhD.) Degrees in Economics.

Economics

- i. There are no prerequisites to select Economics as a subject for the first year examination.
- ii. Applicants, who obtain the highest marks for the subject of Economics in the first year examination are eligible to follow B.A. Honours in Economics

- iii. The B.A. Honours in Economics consists of twenty-seven (27) course units including one internship-training programme and an independent dissertation. At the end of the internship training, students should submit a detailed report relevant to the training they received.

The Department of Geography offers two subjects for the B.A. Degree, Geography and Development Studies. Both of these subjects are taught under B.A. and B.A. (Honours) Degrees.

Honours degrees in Geography and Development Studies structure under a course unit system. According to the course unit system B.A. Degree in Geography consists of 28 core units with 120 credits and Development Studies consists of 36 core units with 120 credits.

Honours Degree Course – Geography

Students who wish to follow Honours degree in Geography, they should follow 2 units in Geography at their Level 1. At the Levels 2 and 3, students should follow 28core units offered by the Department of Geography. In the second semester of the Level 3 student

will be placed in Institutional Training. It is also considered as a core unit. At the Level 4, students should follow 08 core units including dissertation with 8 credits.

Honours Degree Course - Development Studies

Students who wish to follow Honours Degree in Development Studies, they should follow 2 units in Development Studies at their Level I. At the Levels 2 and 3 students should follow at least 20 core units offered by the Department of Geography and 1 core unit offered by the Department of Economics & Sociology. Apart from these, students can follow 2 auxiliary units by other departments. In the second semester of Level 3, students will be directed to institutional training which is also a core unit. At Level 4 students should follow 09 core units including dissertation with 8 credits.

With the participation of the academic staff, field survey activities are conducted in different areas in Sri Lanka, in connection with Geography and Development Studies. Lectures and discussions are carried out by lecturers on each subject and finally an assignment should be submitted and a final presentation will be made by the students.

The Department of Geography maintains a laboratory of Geographical Information System (GIS) consists of modern hardware and software. The department offered GIS as a core unit for all the undergraduates who follow the General and Honours degree programmes in Geography and Development Studies. To improve student's knowledge this unit includes practical classes, workshops and projects and it also gives theoretical and conceptual knowledge of GIS.

The department has been conducting Postgraduate programs since 1997.

International Studies

The Department of International Studies offers 6 course units for the Bachelor of Arts Degree which is taught in Sinhala Medium. No prerequisite is needed to select the subject of International Studies for the first year examination of the Bachelor of Arts Degree.

The undergraduates who obtain the highest marks in the Bachelor of Arts first year examination are qualified to follow the Bachelor of Arts honours in International Studies which is conducted in English medium. Moreover, they should pass the English Language Proficiency test conducted by the Department.

Department of Philosophy

The Department of Philosophy is one of the pioneering departments of the University of Kelaniya. It offers degrees in Philosophy, Psychology, and Peace and Conflict Resolution.

Philosophy

Philosophy (the original Greek word means 'the love of wisdom') is praised as 'science of all sciences' considering its antiquity in the history of systematic studies. Philosophy is a conceptual scholarship which studies abstract concepts related to various other subject areas, like Philosophy of Science, Philosophy of Law and Political Philosophy. At the same time, Philosophy studies certain areas such as logic, metaphysics, ethics and epistemology that are unique to the subject itself. Recently philosophy extended its boundaries to the new territories such as environment (Environmental Philosophy), Psychology (Philosophical Psychology) and Peace Studies (Philosophy of Human Rights).

Psychology

Psychology as a study of human and animal behaviour studies various dimensions of behaviour such as general natural aspects of behaviour (General Psychology) abnormal behaviour (Abnormal Psychology) learning behaviour (Educational Psychology) work behaviour (Psychology of Organizational Behaviour) and social behaviour (Social Psychology) Meanwhile Child Psychology and Development Psychology studies developmental aspects of human behavior: physical development, cognitive development, socio-emotional development and moral development. As psychology studies behaviour of the individual it has become one of the most attractive subjects in the modern world.

Peace and Conflict Resolution

Peace studies has become a discipline that is in high demand in modern society where wars and conflict are a common event. The Department introduced the B.A Degree in Peace and Conflict Resolution for the first time in South Asia. This degree studies various dimensions of peace and conflict resolution styles and history of wars and conflict; philosophy and psychology of peace and conflicts; conflict management techniques and skills.

As a newly introduced subject area to the academic world “Peace and Conflict Resolution” play an important role in the university study programmes in Sri Lanka. In a social context where conflicts are common, the study of issues in peace and conflicts is very important. Peace and Conflict Resolution services could play a decisive role in the social development. Philosophy of peace, psychology of peace, history of war and conflict are some of the study areas of this degree programme.

Entry Requirements and Medium of Instruction

No pre-requisites for selecting either Philosophy or Psychology. However, the students who are chosen to study Peace and Conflict Resolution (Honours) are selected by the University Grants Commission.

While the lectures for Philosophy degrees are given in Sinhala medium. Psychology (Honours) degrees are taught in both Sinhala and English mediums. Lectures for Peace and Conflict Resolution are conducted in the English medium.

The duration of the Dip (IT) (SLQF Level 3) Programme is 36 months conducting in both mediums, Sinhala, and English with a load of 30 credits.

The foremost objective of this department is to bridge the gap between labor market requirements and the skills and competencies of the Arts graduates while originating their interest in the field of IT to produce globally employable individuals.

09. Basic Information on Bachelor of Arts degree programmes conducted in the Faculties of Humanities and Social Sciences

The Bachelor's degree in Arts at the University of Kelaniya is conducted jointly by the Faculties of Humanities and Social Sciences. Upon registration at the University of Kelaniya, the students will be selected to both these faculties based on their subjects and the z-score obtained at G.C.E. (A/L) Examination. It is compulsory for a student to follow a minimum of two subjects for the Bachelor of Arts degree programme from the assigned Faculty.

The Bachelor of Arts Degree programme is conducted according to the course unit system. Duration of the programme is 3 years and there are two semesters per year. This degree programme has been organized in order to facilitate the flexibility of selecting subject combinations of the students' own choice.

A course that belongs to one particular subject comprises a number of course units. One course unit may include lectures for 30 hours, 60 hours or 90 hours. The course units have been named starting from four English letters and a numeric code. The Four English letters depict a summary of the English word that identifies the subject.

Opportunities are available for students to select three major subjects for the Bachelor of Arts Degree programme. Such combinations have been prepared enabling the undergraduates to gain sufficient and profound knowledge pertaining to different subjects. In addition to the compulsory course units of her/his own subject combination, this system has allowed the student to follow the subjects offered by other Faculties such as Humanities, Social Sciences as well as the Faculties of Commerce and Management Studies, Science and Computing and Technology according to their own choice.

In order to measure the value of a course unit, a unit of measurement has been introduced as credit hours in accordance with the number of lecture hours allotted for the respective unit. Accordingly, one credit consists of a course unit of 15 hours of lectures within one semester, which has 15 weeks, with one hour lecture per course unit. Each student should follow course units aggregating to at least 30 credits in each academic year. For the B.A. degree, the students should accumulate at least 90 credits based on the course units followed during the three academic years. Pre-requisites are necessary for the selection of some subjects for the B.A. degree programme, as described in this Handbook, and listed under section 3.1.

The Bachelor of Business Management (Accountancy) special degree programme was introduced in 1993 and the Department of Accountancy was established in 1999. Currently the Department of Accountancy conducts Bachelor of Business Management Honours in Accountancy programme, Bachelor of Business Management Honours in Auditing and Forensic Accounting Degree and Bachelor of Business Management Honours in Accounting Information Systems. These curricula mainly consist of Accountancy discipline including other contemporary subject areas such as Management, Business Finance, Economics, Quantitative Technique and Information Technology. These programmes are conducted in the English medium and the examinations are conducted on a semester basis. The Department of Accountancy is fully aware of the necessity to provide students with a practical exposure to the corporate world. In 2004 the Department introduced an Internship programme which carries six (06) credits. Therefore, the students are required to undergo a compulsory industry practical training in the Accountancy discipline under the supervision of the Department through the Digital Internship System (DIS).

The Department of Accountancy won a competitive grant, worth Rs.100 million from the World Bank on Improving Relevance and Quality of Undergraduate Education (IRQUE) in year 2005. The project spanned over a period of six years (2005-2010) and the objective of this project was to develop a dynamic and vibrant study programme which produces employable graduates for the global market. All proposed project activities were successfully completed during the project period and local and international reviewers commended the Department of Accountancy's commitment towards the remarkable completion of this project. The Department of Accountancy is currently utilizing the resources and benefits acquired through this project for the development of the degree programme.

The scope of the Department of Accountancy was widely expanded by introducing a postgraduate degree in 2009, to meet the growing demand of graduates and professionals in the fields of Accountancy, Finance and Information Technology. In the year 2013 the Department of Accountancy introduced a Master of Business and Finance programme through a novel technology based on teaching and learning system (E-

Learning). Meanwhile the Department of Accountancy introduced a Higher Diploma Programme in Business Accounting in 2014 for professionals in the field of Accounting and Finance. Further, to address the emerging trends in the Accounting profession by identifying national and international demands, the Department of Accountancy introduced, Bachelor of Business Management Honours in Auditing and Forensic Accounting in 2020 and Bachelor of Business Management Honours in Accounting Information systems from 2022. Upon the evaluation conducted by the UGC in year 2018, to verify and control the quality of state university departments, the Department of Accountancy is acknowledged for obtaining 89 marks and securing an A grade.

In year 2019 Department of Accountancy was able to win Rs.18 Mn competitive grant from the Accelerating Higher Education Expansion and Development (AHEAD) project funded by the World Bank. With this project, the Department of Accountancy implements five major activities which are based on the concerns of all the activities of the Department such as curriculum and teaching, learning and assessment, English language proficiency, enabling ICT based education, extra-curricular activities such as social and intercultural harmony and research culture. Department of Accountancy believes that, activities of this project will directly contribute to build world class graduates who are socially and emotionally sensitive, technological savvy, English proficient and capable in discovering new knowledge in accounting discipline.

The Department of Commerce & Financial Management (DCFM), formerly known as the Department of Commerce, which was initially set up as a sub-section under the Department of Economics in the Faculty of Arts in 1976, is the founder of Commerce and Management education at the University of Kelaniya and pioneered to from the

Faculty of Commerce and Management Studies in 1995. DCFM's vision is "to reach the destination of excellence in Commerce and Management education in Sri Lanka".

DCFm produces graduates that suit middle and higher level managerial positions in both public sector and private sector organizations. Besides, it prepares graduates to create new ventures with a view to create new employment opportunities and helping the national economy.

DCFm currently conducts five degree programmes, namely: Bachelor of Commerce Honours Degree; Bachelor of Commerce Honours in Entrepreneurship Degree; Bachelor of Commerce Honours in Business Technology Degree; Bachelor of Commerce Honours in Financial Management Degree; Bachelor of Commerce (Special) (External). Further the department conducts three postgraduate degree programmes named Master of Commerce Degree (MCom), Master of Commerce Degree (MCom) (China Intake), Master of Business Studies Degree (MBS) and Master of Business Studies Degree (China Intake). Almost 1100 students are presently pursuing studies under these programmes. DCFm has introduced a Higher Diploma in Business programme which are designed for school leavers, those who run small scale business and for potential entrepreneurs.

At present, the DCFm comprises 40 academic staff including 9 professors and 19 PhD holders. 2 other members are currently reading for their doctoral studies in international universities.

The DCFm qualified to achieve a competitive grant of Rs. 65 million from the World Bank under the project of Improving the Relevance and Quality of Undergraduates Education (IRQUE) in 2006. In year 2019 Department has won the AHEAD project grant offered by World Bank on competitive basis.

The Bachelor of Business Management Honours in Finance was introduced in 2004 under the Department of Accountancy. It was granted full departmental status in June 2011 and was named the Department of Finance (DFin). The Department of Finance is the latest endowment to the undergraduates of the Faculty of Commerce and Management Studies (FCMS) to broaden their knowledge in the areas of Finance, Banking, Insurance and Financial Engineering. The Department of Finance currently offers Bachelor of Business Management Honours in Finance, Bachelor of Business Management Honours in Insurance (Proposed Name: Bachelor of Business Management Honours in Insurance and Finance - Subject to the UGC approval), Bachelor of Business Management Honours in Banking (Proposed Name: Bachelor of Business Management Honours in Banking and Finance - Subject to the UGC approval) and Bachelor of Business Management Honours in Financial Engineering. Further, this Department offers Higher Diploma in Business Finance to pave a path for the students who are willing to continue their education up to bachelors and master's degree level in the field of Finance, Insurance and Banking. The Finance Department also offers a Master of Professional Finance (MPF) to enhance the capacity of graduates professional qualification to advance their knowledge in the areas of financial discipline.

The Department has obtained an "A" Grade for Self Evaluation Review (SER) conducted by the University Grants Commission for the period 2013-2018. Writing a new chapter in the history of the department, the Sri Lanka standards Institution (SLSI) awarded the "ISO 9001:2015/SLS ISO 9001:2015" on February 23, 2022.

The certification covers the design, development and delivery of certificate, Diploma, Higher diploma, Undergraduate and postgraduate programmes and conducting research & publications in the areas of Finance, Banking, Insurance and Financial Engineering.

The uniqueness and importance of the Finance discipline, and the growing demand for Finance graduates in the job market have proven the ability of Finance graduates to play a dominant role in both public and private sectors. There is an intense competition among the students to select these degree programmes, due to the increasing demand for finance, banking, insurance and financial engineering graduates in the job market. Currently, the Department enrolls 220 students for the degree programme. The medium of instruction is English.

The Bachelor of Business Management Honours in Finance program has been designed giving careful consideration to the requirements of the modern corporate world and to impart in-depth knowledge in the subject area. Furthermore, its curriculum has been designed on par with international standards and the Bachelor of Business Management Honours in Finance program has been recognized by the University Affiliation Programme of Chartered Financial Analysts CFA (USA).

The Bachelor of Business Management Honours in Insurance is introduced with the purpose of producing graduates with specialized knowledge in insurance to cater to the requirements of the rapidly changing business world. The curriculum is designed to provide future Insurance Professionals with the knowledge, skills, attitudes, practice and insight they need to create value for their organizations and for society.

The structure of the Bachelor of Business Management Honours in Banking Programme has been designed on par with the Banking Industry expectations. The aim of this Degree Programme is to provide future Banking Professionals who can play a major role in the Banking Industry, utilizing knowledge, skills, attitudes, practice and insight gathered over four years.

The Department of Finance focuses on producing graduates who are competent in relevant theories and concepts and who are equipped with skills that are essential in achieving the desired goals of the corporate and public sector organizations. Therefore, the Department has provided an opportunity for the undergraduates to participate in an internship programme. The Internship experience is a value addition to the degree programme where students are given a chance to be a part of a dynamic business environment and to experience how theories they learnt in class can be put into practice. This is a compulsory course unit. Moreover, the undergraduate experience is vastly enriched by gaining research experience, which is made possible through the module “Dissertation”, which is offered to students in the final year.

Currently, the Department of Finance has joined hands with several dominant industry players for many fruitful endeavors. Providing internship opportunities for students, and conducting guest lectures and workshops are a few of these opportunities. Educational Institutions such as the Chartered Financial Analysts (CFA) Society Sri Lanka, the Institute of Chartered Accountants of Sri Lanka and Institute of Bankers of Sri Lanka and various other organizations such as Softlogic Life Insurance PLC and Securities and Exchange Commission of Sri Lanka are currently offering gold medals and cash prizes for students who have performed exceptionally well in their degree programme.

In addition to that, the Department offer a Diploma in HRM and a Higher Diploma in HRM since 2014. The Department publishes the journal titled "Kelaniya Journal of Human Resource Management" biannually since 2005.

Bachelor of Business Management Honours in Human Resource Degree

This study programme consists of compulsory optional and auxiliary course units. In level four, the B.B.Mgt. (HR) Honours Degree allow a six month practical training programme in HRM or in non HR fields in order to obtain the practical experiences and developments taking place in the industry.

The compulsory course units are identified as subjects that provide the core knowledge and skills required to perform relevant jobs in the HRM field. These compulsory course units cover areas of Human Resource Management, Skills Development, Business Economics, Information and Communication Technology, Law, Sociology, Psychology, Organizational Behaviour, Total Quality Management, Accountancy, Finance and Project Management.

Our curriculum focuses on student development through its course work and extracurricular events. Action Learning projects, industry based assignments, workshops

The Department of Chemistry offers students a comprehensive education in Chemistry and Biochemistry and it offers course units for the BSc programmes in Physical Science and Biological Science. Further, the Department offers Chemistry course units required for the BSc programme in Environmental Conservation and Management.

A limited number of students are selected to follow the Bachelor of Science Honours (BSc Hons) in Chemistry and BSc Hons in Biochemistry based on their performance at the compulsory Chemistry and Biochemistry course units, respectively offered in Year 1 and Year 2. An Honours Degree student should carry out a research project under the supervision of a senior member of the academic staff assigned by the Department during the 4th academic year. In addition, a limited number of students are enrolled under the University Grants Commission special intake for applied chemistry honours degree programme.

Introduction

The Department of Industrial Management was established in 1967 as a major Department of study in the Faculty of Science. Being the first and only Department of Industrial Management in a Faculty of Science in Sri Lanka, its establishment was a unique event in the sphere of higher education in Sri Lanka, a distinction it holds even today.

The Department has developed rapidly since its inception from an entity offering management as a single subject to those following the Bachelor of Science Degree programme, to incorporating Information Technology into the programme by offering two main subjects in the early 1990s, which was a timely decision. A significant development of the Department emerged when it decided to provide much greater specialization to students in the two areas; Management and Information Technology. In a ground-breaking move, the Department was the pioneer in the Faculty of Science to offer its own degree programme, namely the Bachelor of Science in Management and Information Technology (BSc in MIT) in 2003. Fifty selected students were provided the opportunity to empower themselves with a degree which combines management and information technology, the mix of which makes students productive, modern in their outlook, and mobile. With our lineage on our outbound activity, we engage our students in participatory training programmes, to develop their leadership and communicational skills in particular. These activities are mandatory for all of our students and trainees. Our outbound activities include field experiences, internship training and camp style interactive activities.

It has since then experienced a vertical path of development by leveraging its expertise by providing three postgraduate programmes to professionals in the industry and developing horizontally by providing professional services to the industry. The two postgraduate diploma programmes: Industrial and Business Management, and Information Technology, and our Masters Degree programmes in Management and Information Technology, target professionals and academics who aspire to acquire greater application skills in these areas. The Department has now expanded its portfolio, by commencing the Master of Information Technology (M.IT) degree programme and the revolutionary Master of Data Analytics (MDA) degree programme.

The success of the Department's academic programmes can be attributed to the proactive stance taken in assessing organizational needs and industry trends, the commitment and dedication of its experienced academic faculty in both Management and in Information Technology and the students in the programmes who invest their time in trying to absorb, learn and implement the learning experience in the classroom in practical settings, and in the field.

A key strategic strength of the Department arises from the academic and professional qualifications and experience of the staff. The mix of multi-disciplinary academic staff,

with backgrounds in Engineering, Information Technology and Management in a single Department is unique and provides them a strategic advantage when catering to the current needs of the industry, where specialized graduates with a diverse set of skills encompassing multiple areas are valued and desired. This has enabled the Department to become one of the premier institutions in the country in integrating Information Technology with Management.

Our students have had a tremendous response from industry with the feedback on the overall knowledge and skills in the respective disciplines, communication and leadership skills and ability to work well in a team environment highlighted by senior management. They also have reacted very positively to our endeavour to build a well-rounded professional, confident in their ability and skills in Management and in Information Technology and having the ability to leverage those skills across industry and job descriptions. The success of our students is reflected in both the average starting salaries and the placement rates after graduation. The quality of the MIT graduates are reflected in the high placement rates with many contracted for employment even before the final examinations are completed. The graduates are recruited to a wide range of positions such as Business Analyst, Software Engineer, Quality Assurance Executives, and Management Trainees in diverse functional areas and sectors.

On the consultancy and research front, the academic staff has been engaged in a significant number of consulting and research projects, the results of which are highly acclaimed and published in a number of local and foreign journals. Its staff have published valuable textbooks and served on the editorial boards of some international journals. Academic staff of the department also serve in various Public Corporations/ Institutes and on boards of private companies.

In the interest of fostering university-industry linkages and the added benefit of practical exposure for the academic staff, the Department has developed a reputation for quality management consulting services in the country. Assignments have been undertaken for the World Bank, UNDP, UNIDO, ILO as well as a number of local, private and public sector institutions.

A UNDP funded UNIDO implemented project set up a special centre. i.e the Centre for the Enterprise Management Information Services (CEMIS) affiliated to the Department to address shortcomings of the industrial sector. This centre was the first such centre to be set up by UNIDO in a developing country.

The Department intends to pursue the next phase of its developments by expanding its current programmes and offering new programmes leveraging on its core competencies so as to produce human capital to meet the long term development objectives of the nation. The Department also has put in place a strategy to become one of the leading research centres in identified core areas in the country.

The BSc Honours in Management and Information Technology Degree Programme / BSc Honours in Information Technology Degree Programme

This four year Honours Degree Programmes offer a wide range of knowledge and skills as a blend of management and information technology disciplines. The students who get selected, will have to opt for either the BSc Hons in MIT degree programme or the BSc Hons in Information Technology degree programme, at the end of the first year of study. The final assignment of the student into the degree programme will be done, based on student performance and preference. The subsequent three years of the BSc Hons in IT degree programme will focus on building the information technology competencies of the students, depending on their career objective. The programme is designed taking in to consideration the increasing national and international need for computing professionals. The curriculum of the programme follows the latest guidelines of recognized professional bodies such as the ACM and IEEE and aims at equipping students with necessary knowledge and skills to choose a career in the field of information technology including software engineering, data science, systems engineering, database administration, network engineering, business analysis and software quality engineering.

Those selected students for the BSc Hons in MIT programme have the opportunity to specialize in one of the following areas at the end of the second academic year; Business Systems Engineering (BSE), Operations and Supply Chain Management (OSCM) and Information Systems (IS).

a.) Business Systems Engineering (BSE)

Business Systems Engineering is a detailed approach of identifying and implementing the business processes, tasks, and transactions that are required to successfully operate a business. To compete in the global market, it is important that our organizations re-engineer their processes with world class management best practices, enabled by the use of Information Technology in order to exploit these business opportunities.

b.) Operations and Supply Chain Management (OSCM)

The curriculum of this programme is based on Information Technology enabled application of world-class best practices for the management of supply chain operations. Hence, the programme aims to deliver professional knowledge and skills in Business Process Management customized to applications in the field of Operations and Supply Chain Management.

c.) Information Systems (IS)

Information systems play a strategic role in ensuring that the key decision makers are provided with timely information to make business decisions. It enhances operational effectiveness in delivering products and services to its customers and assists to maximize returns to stakeholders. Therefore, management of information technology resources become crucial if the business is to succeed in this dynamic and competitive

environment. The prime objective of the 'Information Systems' specialization is to develop professionals equipped with the necessary knowledge and skills to assess technology needs, procure, maintain and improve information systems which are tightly bound with organizational strategies and processes while managing the necessary human and physical resources.

Apart from knowledge and skills, both degree programmes also inculcate the necessary soft skills required for graduates to be successfully absorbed in to the professional world.

The Department of Mathematics was among the first few academic departments established when the Vidyalandara University was founded in 1959. The Department, which functioned under the Faculty of Arts was absorbed into the Faculty of Science when the latter was established in 1967. Since then, as one of the eight departments in the Faculty of Science, the Department of Mathematics has been expanding the frontiers of mathematical understanding on a wide range of topics over the years.

The Department of Mathematics offers course units in two major subjects for the B.Sc. degree in physical sciences, namely Pure Mathematics and Applied Mathematics. The Department also conducts a B.Sc. Honours Degree Programme in Pure Mathematics and Applied Mathematics, a B.Sc. Honours Degree Programme in Pure Mathematics and Statistics with collaboration of the Department of Statistics & Computer Science and a B.Sc. Honours Degree Programme in Mathematical Physics in collaboration with the Department of Physics.

Based on the performance of Level I and II, the students who show high competency are selected for the BSc Honours in Mathematics degree programme at the end of the second year of the Bachelor of Science in physical science degree programme. To be eligible for BSc Honours in Mathematics degree programme, the student should have followed course units in one of the subjects Applied Mathematics, Statistics or Physics with Pure Mathematics in the BSc degree programme.

In addition, the Department offers a few course units in Mathematics especially formulated for B.Sc.degrees in Biological Science and Management and Information Technology and B.Sc. Honours degrees in Software Engineering and Electronics and Computer Science. These course units have been designed for non-Physical Science students to grasp the mathematical concepts in their disciplines. The Department also contributes to the recently started Business Management Honours in Financial Engineering Degree offering by the Department of Finance, Faculty of Commerce and Management Studies.

The Department offers PhD and M.Phil. Degree in Mathematics by research and the members of the department create, communicate, and apply mathematics of the highest caliber through activities such as internationally recognized research and undergraduate education and extensive outreach to local schools.

The central goal of the Department of Mathematics at the University of Kelaniya is to provide intellectual leadership in the field of Mathematics that is of direct benefit to the country and its citizens and commands national and international respect for its depth of scholarship.

The Department of Microbiology at the University of Kelaniya is the only department in the island's university system that has been established exclusively to offer "Microbiology" as a main subject for the B.Sc. Degree offered under the Biological Sciences Stream. A wide range of industries and Government bodies require the services of Microbiologists: Hence, the employability of the graduates of this stream remains high. Due to the limited resources and infrastructure available in conducting practical sessions, only 60 students are accommodated to follow this degree program. The performance of the Biological Sciences students in their Semester I Examination of the 1st year, is the basis for the selection. In Semester II of the 3rd year, all students are assigned to follow 460 hours of an Internship program in reputed industries and government departments in the country where Microbiology applies. This provides a great opportunity for the students to commence their career pathways.

Based only on the academic performance of students who study Microbiology in the 1st and 2nd years, only seven students are selected at the end of their 2nd year to follow the BSc Honours Degree in Microbiology (Four year Degree) where they carry out a research project in Microbiology.

Further, for the graduate students, the Department offers two MSc degree programmes; MSc in Applied Microbiology and MSc in Food and Nutrition. Both programmes have early exit points too. Facilities are also available in the Department to follow research based degrees leading to MPhil and PhD in the field of Microbiology.

The Department of Physics which came into existence with the commencement of the Faculty in October 1967 is one of the eight academic departments that belong to the Faculty of Science of the University of Kelaniya. Since then, the Department has developed the academic programmes, with revisions of the syllabi at regular intervals and improvements of the laboratory facilities. In 2019, the Department was renamed as the Department of Physics and Electronics. At present, there are seventeen academic staff members including ten professors and about twenty temporary supporting academic staff members working in the Department. In addition, there are twelve non-

academic supporting staff members. The Department consists of six undergraduate laboratories and three research laboratories. The Department of Physics and Electronics also possesses facilities for research based MPhil and PhD degree programmes.

Course units related to the subjects, Physics and Electronics for the BSc degree are offered by the Department of Physics and Electronics. Physics and Electronics subjects may be selected by the students who enter the Physical Science subject stream. Because of the limitations in facilities, only a limited number of students who follow the subject Physics, are allowed to select the subject Electronics. Only a limited number from these students are given the opportunity to follow the BSc Honours in Physics degree programme, based on their performance during the first two years of study. Those who wish to pursue higher studies in Theoretical Physics may obtain a BSc Honours degree by following Mathematical Physics. A selected number of students from those who show high competency in the subjects Physics, Pure Mathematics, and Applied Mathematics during their first two years are admitted to the BSc Honours in Mathematical Physics degree programme which is conducted collaboratively by the Departments of Physics and Electronics, and Mathematics.

The Department of Physics and Electronics offers another degree programme BSc (PHEL), since the academic year 2015/2016. This degree programme consists of two main subjects, Physics and Electronics, together with selected course modules from Applied Mathematics, Pure Mathematics and Computer Studies. Furthermore, this degree programme also includes several compulsory course modules in Management, offered by the Faculty of Commerce and Management Studies.

The Department of Physics and Electronics offers another degree programme, BSc Honours in Electronics and Computer Science, starting from the academic year 2020/2021 in collaboration with Departments of Statistics & Computer Science and Mathematics. This degree program provides both theoretical and practical knowledge in the areas of Electronics and Computer Science in order to produce skilful graduates competent with both hardware and software who can contribute to national economy in the modern era of IoT.

The Department was established in 1967 as the Department of Botany at the inception of the Faculty of Science and commenced its academic activities in 1968 by offering Botany as a subject for BSc (General) Degree Programme. In 1976 the Department introduced the BSc (Special) Degree Programme in Botany. The core subject areas taught during the early years were Physiology, Morphology, Anatomy, Biochemistry, Ecology, Genetics, Plant Diversity and Taxonomy. Gradually the subject areas were expanded into applications of Botany that included Microbiology, Plant Pathology, Mycology, Molecular Biology, Gene Technology, Bioinformatics, Microbial Genetics, Plant Breeding, Horticulture, and Quantitative Ecology. In 2002, a discipline on Molecular Biology and Plant Biotechnology (MBBT) was introduced with BSc honours degree programme in MBBT. In order to portray the academic and research domains excelled by the Department it was renamed as Department of Plant and Molecular Biology in 2019. Concurrently, the course structure and course contents of the subject Botany was revised to accommodate recent developments and introduced as Plant Biology (PLBL).

The staff of the Department has been engaged in research and development activities and have collaborations with local and foreign organizations and universities in view of enhancing research capabilities. The spectrum of research carried out by the academic staff was broadened to include an array of aspects including aquatic weed control, improving post-harvest practices using locally available resources, assessment of bioactivity of plants, use of botanicals as soil amendments to improve soil fertility, environmental quality monitoring, ecosystem carbon sequestration, developing plant-based solutions for environmental issues, molecular phylogeny, crop improvement, molecular biology and reproductive biology of plants. Research findings are published in national and international scientific journals. Academic staff members carry out postgraduate research with funds received from the National Science Foundation (NSF), the National Research Council (NRC), Ministry of Higher Education, Ministry of Science, Technology & Research under the Indo-Sri Lanka Joint Research Programme and Sri Lanka Council for Agricultural Research Policy (SLCARP) and international grants.

The Department maintains a botanical garden that contains some endemic, ornamental, aquatic and medicinal plants, a herbarium and an authenticated fungal collection for research and teaching purposes. Development of human and physical resources of the Department in the past couple of decades has been materialized through foreign financial support.

The Department is constantly engaged in enhancing the quality of graduates and winning of a grant worth of LKR 80 million through competitive bidding under the World Bank project for Improvement of Relevance and Quality of Undergraduate Education (IRQUE) in 2004 was a major achievement which facilitated improving human and physical capacity to use effective student-centered pedagogical methods to deliver knowledge and skills. Also the Department has collaborated with the Faculty in conducting postgraduate research programmes funded by World Bank under Higher Education for Twentieth Century (HETC) project. Currently, under the Accelerating Higher Education Expansion and Development (AHEAD) project staff members are engaged in conducting postgraduate research programmes. Moreover, the Department was able to secure a grant of LKR 18 million under the (AHEAD) project for the development of the infrastructure.

Currently, the Department of Plant and Molecular Biology offers BSc and BSc Honours Degree programmes on two disciplines, i.e. Plant Biology (PLBL) and Molecular Biology and Plant Biotechnology (MBBT). Students are selected for the BSc Honours Degree Programmes in the above two disciplines at the end of the second year of study considering their academic performance in the first two years. Optional course units on applications of plant biology, molecular biology and plant biotechnology are offered in the second semester of the third year of study. A course unit on "People and Plants" is

offered every other academic year to the non-biology students in the University of Kelaniya.

Alumni Association of Faculty of Science Gold Medal is awarded to the graduates with best performance in the disciplines, Plant Biology and Molecular Biology & Plant Biotechnology. Professor I. Balasooriya Memorial Gold Medal is awarded to the graduate in the BSc Programme with best performance in Plant Biology. The Society of Plant and Molecular Biology scholarships are awarded to the best – performed student in the plant Biology course units in Year 1 and Year 2.

The Department offers postgraduate programmes (by research) leading to MPhil and PhD degrees. Since 2016, a full-time MSc course in Crop Protection and plant Biotechnology (SLQF level 10), is offered to graduates wish to acquire In-depth knowledge and skills in the fields of crop protection and application of molecular biological and biotechnological tools for the quality improvement of crops.

The Department has established a Floriculture Research Centre at Henerathgoda Botanic Gardens, Gampaha in 2015, to facilitate research and development of new ornamental plant cultivars using modern molecular biological tools and tissue culture. This centre provides training on plant propagation and nursery management for ornamental plant growers. Facilities of the centre are also available for undergraduate and postgraduate research of the department. Our department is committed to achieving excellence in dissemination and creation of knowledge to address modern day challenges in plant and molecular biology.

The Department of Statistics & Computer Science in the Faculty of Science was established on the 01st of July, 1999 to cater to the disciplines of Statistics and Computer Science. Initially, the Department offered a Statistics & Computing course for the Physical Science students in the Bachelor of Science Degree Programme. Identifying the demand, the Statistics & Computing course was revised and renamed as the Statistics & Computer Science from the academic year 2000/2001. Further, the BSc. (Special) in Statistics and Computer Science, degree program was conducted by the Department from the academic year 2000/2001 to the academic year 2007/2008.

The Department offers course units in the following disciplines: Information Technology, under the Computer Studies (COST) programme. The Computer Studies course units are offered for a selected group of students from the Biological and Physical Science stream who are not eligible to follow Computer Science. In addition to that, the service from the Department has been expanded to the faculties of Social Sciences and Humanities by offering the Computer Studies course units under their Bachelor of Arts degree programme.

The Department further developed its course units in the disciplines of Computer Science (COSC) and Statistics (STAT) as separate majors for the physical science students, from the academic year 2007/2008, Subsequently, in the academic year 2009/2010, the Department commenced offering BSc Honours degree in Statistics, and BSc Honours degree in Computer Science.

Starting from the academic year 2011/2012, the Department offers a BA Honours in Computer Studies degree programme to the faculties Social Sciences and Humanities. Since the academic year 2012/2013, the BSc Honours in Computer Studies degree program has been offered by the Department for students from the Faculty of Science. Moreover, since the academic year 2015/2016 the Department provides computer studies course units for undergraduates who are following the BSc degree in physics and electronics. The Department continues to offer Statistics course units for the BSc Honours in Mathematics degree since its establishment.

Further, from the academic year 2020/2021 our Department together with the Department of Physics & Electronics and the Department of Mathematics started to offer the Bachelor of Science Honours Degree in Electronics and Computer Science.

The Department of Statistics & Computer Science provides opportunities for graduated students to pursue postgraduate programs leading to Master of Science (MSc), Master of Philosophy (MPhil), and Doctor of Philosophy (PhD).

The Software Engineering Teaching Unit was established in September 2017 to offer the first ever Bachelor of Science in Software Engineering degree in the Sri Lankan state university system. The objective of this degree programme is to produce software engineering graduates for successful careers in the field of software engineering by providing a thorough understanding of engineering methods and scientific principles in computing.

BSc Honours in Software Engineering Degree Programme

This four-year degree programme, designed according to the internationally accepted ACM guidelines, helps students to gain essential skills, knowledge, engineering practice and attitudes required to function as software engineers in the local and international industries. An internship opportunity of six months will provide necessary industry exposure to the students to enhance their technical knowledge, skills, and professional practices. In addition, the one-year software engineering research component is a unique feature of this programme. The students following this degree programme have provided flexibility to specialize in their own field of interest by incorporating six (06) specialized application domains; Net Centric, Mobile Computing, Digital Gaming and Animations, Health Informatics, Business Engineering Applications, and Data Science and Engineering Applications to the curriculum.

a) Net Centric

Net centric specialization aims to develop the advanced skills and knowledge required to become successful software engineers in the advanced web application, distributed and cloud computing and semantic web and ontological engineering.

b) Mobile Computing

Mobile computing is a rapidly emerging area of computing which has enormous market potential and growth. Mobile computing specialization provides thorough knowledge about mobile computing technologies, mobile networks, and build advanced skills in mobile application development.

c) Digital Gaming and Animations

This specialization provides knowledge about the cutting-edge digital gaming and animations technologies and builds advanced skills essential to cater the requirements of digital gaming and animation industry.

d) Health Informatics

This specialization aims to provide advanced knowledge about health information management, health information system design and development and medical imaging and biomedical signal processing. The software engineering skills blended with medical informatics will fill the gap in the industry for health informaticians with advanced software engineering skills.

e) Business Engineering Applications

Software engineering is an integral part of modern business applications. Business engineering applications specialization provides the essential knowledge and skills required for a software engineer to design and implement solutions to improve business processes and services. The curriculum includes business systems modeling and optimization, computer-based operations management, and business process engineering.

f) Data Science and Engineering Applications

Data Science and engineering applications aims to equip students with the advanced knowledge and skills required for building business intelligence and management support systems, designing and developing big data infrastructures and analyzing big data to deliver insights and discover new relations.

The Faculty of Medicine of the University of Kelaniya was established in 1991, under the provisions of the Universities Act No 16 of 1978 and its amendments. The Founder Dean was Prof. Carlo Fonseka. The first intake of 120 medical students was registered on 2nd September 1991 and they graduated with their MBBS in 1996.

The Faculty now has 17 Departments of study, namely: Anatomy, Biochemistry and Clinical Chemistry, Disability Studies, Family Medicine, Forensic Medicine, Medicine, Medical Microbiology, Obstetrics and Gynaecology, Paediatrics, Parasitology, Pathology, Pharmacology, Physiology, Psychiatry, Public Health, Surgery, and Medical Education. The Faculty also has a Computer Centre, a Research Support Centre and a Molecular Medicine Unit. The Computer Centre is dedicated to providing computer training. It aids in self directed learning, maintaining an intranet and providing internet connectivity.

The MBBS study programme is 5 years in duration (with 3 terms in a year), with an organ system based, integrated curriculum. It has 3 phases of study as listed below, which are described in more detail in the Handbook for MBBS students.

First Examination for Medical Degrees: the course of study comprises 5 terms and includes 3 continuous assessments.

Second Examination for Medical Degrees: the course of study comprises 6 terms of study and includes 6 continuous assessments.

Final Examination for Medical Degrees: the course of study comprises 5 subjects which are assessed separately with theory and clinical examinations.

In keeping with the need to expand and improve allied health professions in the country, the medical faculty established the Disability Studies Unit in 1993 and the Centre for Tropical Medicine and International Health. The Molecular Medicine Unit was established in 2003 with the aims of improving molecular diagnostic facilities for infectious diseases and providing DNA finger-printing. In 2007, the Disability Studies Unit was upgraded to the Department of Disability Studies, the only one of its kind in the South Asian region. The department offers two undergraduate professional courses; BSc (Hons) in Speech and Hearing Sciences and BSc (Hons) in Occupational Therapy.

The BSc (Hons) in Speech and Hearing Sciences is a 4 year programme with 2 semesters in each academic year. The curriculum is a credit-based course unit system. Each course unit is assessed at the end of the relevant semester or academic year. In the 1st year of study, students are expected to choose one of two alternative study tracks: Speech and Language Therapy or Audiology based on which a professional qualification as a Speech and Language Therapist or Audiologist is awarded. The program includes a comprehensive classroom based theoretical foundation, an intensive clinical training and a compulsory research project in the final year.

The BSc (Hons) in Occupational Therapy is also a similar 4 -year degree program that commenced in 2022. It leads to a professional qualification in Occupational Therapy. Similar to the SHS program the program, the curriculum is a credit based, course unit system. This program too includes classroom based theoretical modules, clinical training and compulsory research project in the final year.

The Faculty is located in Ragama, in a spacious campus of about 35 acres. It has approximately 1000 students on roll now. This includes several foreign students, mainly from other South Asian countries, who have been admitted on a fee levying basis. The Faculty also welcomes students for elective appointments and many students from

medical schools in Europe, USA and Australia have spent their elective periods in the Faculty.

There is a permanent academic staff of approximately 130, in addition there are over 40 temporary academic staff and over 60 visiting staff that include consultants who are based in the affiliated teaching hospitals.

Since 1991, the Faculty has produced a large volume of research publications. Several of the staff have been awarded prestigious prizes for research papers presented at national and international scientific fora and Presidential Research Awards. The clinical and paraclinical academic departments have been recognized as training centres by the Postgraduate Institute of Medicine, University of Colombo. Postgraduate research degree programmes M.Phil, DM and Ph.D, are conducted by the Faculty under the auspices of the Faculty of Graduate Studies.

The Colombo North Teaching Hospital, which is one of the busiest tertiary referral centres in the country, is the main teaching hospital. University Clinical Departments have wards in this hospital. Other allied teaching hospitals include the Ragama Rehabilitation Hospital, Welisara Chest Hospital and Base Hospitals in Negombo and Gampaha. The 'Ayati ' centre initiated in 2018, is a state-of-the-art facility that provides multidisciplinary clinical services for children and persons with disabilities. This is the primary training Centre for the Speech and Hearing Sciences and Occupational Therapy programs.

Faculty provides hostel facilities for most of its students. It also has an open air theatre, sports grounds, a multi-purpose court and a gymnasium. Funds are being sought to develop a sports complex and a swimming pool. A Cultural Centre was opened in January 2009 and programmes in music, dance, art and photography are conducted. Yoga classes are held every Thursday afternoon. Tamil classes are conducted every year to enable our graduates to practice in any part of the country. There is an elected Student Council and several other thriving cultural and literary student societies.

The Department of Anatomy undertakes the training of undergraduate medical students in their preclinical years. The preclinical training incorporates an integrated programme of teaching, involving all three preclinical Departments. The teaching curriculum is based on a module system which was introduced in the year 2004. This new module system incorporates a horizontally and vertically integrated system of teaching aimed at training these students to take up the final M.B., B.S. and also embark on postgraduate studies. Students are afforded a comprehensive knowledge in applied and clinical anatomy, tissue morphology and embryology. The Department also trains students following the Speech and Hearing Sciences course offered by the Department of Disability Studies of the University of Kelaniya, finally leading to a B.Sc. in Speech and Hearing Sciences. In addition, the Department conducts a series of lectures and practical sessions for a Diploma course offered by the Postgraduate Institute of Medicine, Colombo, and also a Diploma course in Physiotherapy and Occupational therapy.

The Department has a state of the art dissection theatre and a virtual laboratory. The Department also has a modern museum of dissected, preserved and mounted specimens. These mounted specimens enable students to study three dimensional views of gross anatomy specimens. The academic staff of the Department apart from undertaking student teaching is also involved in research fields in gastroenterology, osteology, sports medicine, human embryology, reproductive endocrinology, and clinical genetics with special interest in thalassaemia.

The Department of Disability Studies (DDS) started as the Disability Studies Unit (DSU) in 1993, under a collaborative agreement between the University of Kelaniya and the University of Uppsala, Sweden. In June 1995, the University Grants Commission approved the DSU as a regular unit of the Faculty of Medicine, University of Kelaniya. In 2008, it was upgraded to a department. The primary objective of the DDS is to offer BSc (Honours) in Speech and Hearing Sciences in Speech and Languages Therapy and in Audiology. From 2022 the department also offering B.Sc honours degree in Occupational Therapy .

BSc (Honours) in Speech and Hearing Sciences

This four-year degree offered since 2008 enables a student to graduate as a Speech and Language Therapist or an Audiologist. These students are admitted directly by the UGC. Students who have obtained S pass or above for physics at the GCE (A/L) examination

are eligible to specialize in the Audiology stream. All students must complete a mandatory research project in the final year. **All teaching, examinations and research components of this degree programme, is conducted only in English and require high standards in English proficiency to follow the course.** The degree programs are accredited by the Ceylon Medical College Council (CMCC) and the Sri Lanka Medical Council (SLMC).

BSc (Honours) in Occupational Therapy

This four-year degree program introduced from 2022 and leads to a professional qualification in Occupational Therapy. Similar to the SHS program students are admitted directly by the University Grants Commission. Successful completion of this professional program leads to the award of the degree of Bachelor of Science in Occupational Therapy. The program includes a comprehensive classroom based theoretical foundation, an intensive clinical training and a compulsory research project in the final year. **All teaching, examinations and research components of this degree programme, is conducted only in English and require high standards in English proficiency to follow the course.**

Clinical training and services

The Department also conducts multidisciplinary clinical services at a centre known as 'Ayati', situated within the faculty premises and is a result of from a private public partnership. This state-of-the-art faculty is the department's primary training centre and is a national clinical centre for children with disabilities. It provides multidisciplinary medical and rehabilitation services including Speech and Language Therapy, Audiology and occupational therapy for children and adults with acquired or congenital neurological and developmental disorders.

Family medicine is the medical specialty which provides comprehensive, continuing, health care in both preventive and curative contexts for the individual and family. It is a specialty in breadth that integrates the biological, clinical and behavioral sciences.

The University Family Medicine Centre established in the Faculty in 1996, provides medical care service to the community and is also a teaching centre for undergraduates and postgraduates. The clinic, the first such centre to be set up in a Sri Lankan university, has had from its inception, skills and facilities for the teaching and learning of communication skills in primary care. The University Family Medicine Centre is recognized by the Postgraduate Institute of Medicine for the training of postgraduates for the Diploma in Family Medicine and the MD in Family Medicine.

The undergraduate teaching of the Department is through the professional development and family medicine strand. In addition to didactic lectures and small group teaching activities conducted in the third year, students have a clinical rotation of one month at the University Family Medicine Centre in the fourth year. During this period, the students are exposed to primary care therapeutics and a range of common problems encountered in family practice. Consultation skills and communication skills are taught through observation, role play and feedback. Group discussions are conducted on common clinical problems. Students also visit several other primary care settings for learning.

The Adolescent & Adult thalassemia care unit in Mahara - is the only specialized haemoglobinopathy centre dedicated to adults in the country, and at present serves over 400 patients.

The Department of Paediatrics is responsible for teaching paediatrics to undergraduate and postgraduate students of the university. The academic staff of the Department consists of specialist in General Paediatrics and Paediatric Neonatology. The University Paediatrics Unit which is located at the Colombo North Teaching Hospital, Ragama is comprised of a 68-bed General Paediatrics ward, a 6-bed Paediatric High Dependency Unit, an 8-bed Neonatal Intensive Care Unit, an 8-bed Special Care Baby Unit, Child Protection Unit and a Paediatrics Thalassaemia Unit. In addition to the services provided for in-ward patients, five outpatient paediatric clinics and a high risk infant clinic is organized weekly by the Department.

The undergraduate teaching programme of the Department includes lectures, tutorials, clinical training in a well-equipped lab and clinical attachments. There are two 4-week clinical attachments each during third and fourth years and an eight-week professorial attachment in the final year of medical training. During these clinical attachments medical undergraduates are trained on history taking, physical examination, planning management of sick children and neonates in ward classes and integrated ward rounds. In addition, the Department provides lectures for students studying for BSc in Speech and Hearing Sciences, clinical training for Registrars and Senior Registrars pursuing postgraduate MD in General Paediatrics and Diploma in Child Health, supervision of thesis for MPhil and PhD candidates and training for medical students from reputed foreign universities during their elective appointments.

The Department contributes to the paediatrics component of the Final MBBS examination and third and fourth year exams for medical undergraduates and exams of the Department of Disability Studies. In addition, the Department contributes to MD Paediatrics and Diploma in Child Health examinations conducted by the Postgraduate Institute of Medicine, University of Colombo and the academic staff members participate as examiners at the final MBBS clinical examination in Paediatrics in other medical faculties in the country.

The Department of Paediatrics has an excellent record in medical research as well. A number of research projects are currently being carried out in the fields of functional gastrointestinal disorders, liver related disease, thalassaemia, red blood cell disorders, bronchial asthma, child protection growth, nutrition, breast feeding, endocrine disorders and neonatal diseases. The research work of the Department has generated a large number of publications in high impact refereed scientific journals including Nature Reviews Gastroenterology and Hepatology, Nature Communication, Archives of Diseases in Childhood, Blood, Haematologica, Paediatric Gastroenterology and Hepatology and Journal of Tropical Pediatrics. Members of the Department have received number of awards for research including the Presidential award for scientific publications for many consecutive years.

The main functions of the Department of Parasitology encompass its teaching/ training programmes, research activities, and diagnostic services. The main teaching activities focus on the 3rd year medical students. Departmental staff members also teach medical parasitology for undergraduate and postgraduate students from the Faculty of Science of the University of Kelaniya; Diploma and MD trainees from the Postgraduate Institute of Medicine, University of Colombo; and postgraduate research students. Diagnostic services offered by the Department include examination of blood films for malaria and filarial parasites, faecal samples for intestinal parasites and testing services for leishmaniasis and rickettsial infections. The identification of helminths, reptiles and arthropods of medical importance is also carried out on request.

The current research interests of the academic staff include all aspects of soil-transmitted helminth infections and pinworm infections (especially their epidemiology), lymphatic filariasis, malaria, toxoplasmosis, leishmaniasis, entomological aspects of dengue and rickettsial infections and the epidemiology of snake bites.

Undergraduate teaching is the main commitment of the Department, being involved in all the system based modules conducted in phase 11. Teaching is carried out according to well planned instructional objectives intergraded with clinical disciplines. The practicals are conducted using a digital laboratory with 50 computer terminals.

It is a recognized centre for training for the Diploma in Histopathology and haematology and MD Histopathology and haematology courses of PGIM, University of Colombo.

The Department provides honorary consultancy services in Histopathology, Cytopathology and Haematology to the Colombo North Teaching Hospital.

Special research interests of the academic staff include chronic inflammatory bowel disease, chronic hepatitis, perinatal pathology, breast pathology, cervical cytology and haematology.

A bio-dosimetry laboratory funded by the International Atomic Energy was established in 2010. The activities undertaken by this laboratory include measurement of the dose of radiation exposure, detection of chromosomal aberrations and introduction of methods for early detection of cancer.

The Department started teaching activities in 1993, two years after the Faculty of Medicine was established in the University of Kelaniya. The major focus of the Department continues to be the teaching of undergraduate pharmacology. This takes place in the third and fourth years of the academic curriculum. With the introduction of the new curriculum, pharmacology teaching is now conducted by the Department's teachers devolved to a series of system-specific modules wherein relevant pharmacology teaching is incorporated into the understanding of individual systems and diseases. This follows an introductory module where some more general pharmacological topics are dealt with alongside other general principles.

The Faculty established the Clinical Trials Unit to foster more clinical trial work within and beyond the Faculty. It undertakes a number of collaborative trials both nationally and internationally. The research interests of the Department include clinical trial methodology, ageing and dementia, asthma and lung infection, alcohol-induced liver injury and portal hypertension stroke trials and poisoning and toxicology. In addition, the Department conducts interdepartmental clinical research, in particular with the Department of Medicine and the Colombo North Teaching Hospital.

The main focus of the Department is the undergraduate MBBS Physiology course. In addition, the Department is actively involved in the B.Sc. in Speech & Hearing Sciences programme. Attempts are being made to move away from the traditional didactic lecture towards a more student-centred approach. As an initial step, many of the lectures in Physiology are available for review by students in the computer assisted learning site. Despite financial constraints, new equipment has been added to the teaching laboratory, which now has facilities for students to get hands-on experience in the use of ECG machines, audiometry, spirometry, ophthalmoscopy etc. Senior staff also contributes regularly to teaching and examining in several post-graduate programmes.

The main research interests of the Department are in the areas of gastroenterology, respiratory physiology, clinical genetics and environmental physiology. The state of the art gastroenterology research laboratory and respiratory physiology laboratory in the Department continue to provide expert diagnostic services in applied gastrointestinal physiology and respiratory physiology. A new addition has been the development of an autonomic function testing laboratory and a sleep laboratory.

The Department also provides clinical services to the Colombo North Teaching Hospital and other hospitals such as giving opinions useful for ongoing research in the Department on clinical genetics and endocrine disorders.

The Department of Psychiatry conducts the teaching programme in Psychiatry and psychological aspects of medicine in the undergraduate medical curriculum. The Department conducts its teaching from the first year in the professional development and family medicine strand. The teaching of Psychiatry proper starts in the third year; with an 8 week full time professorial appointment in the final year.

The Department of Psychiatry is an established training centre for the MD in Psychiatry as well as for short courses in Psychiatry for Postgraduate degrees in General Medicine and Family Medicine conducted by the Postgraduate Institute of Medicine/ University of Colombo. The Department of Psychiatry also conducts lectures for students who are undergoing the degree programme in Speech and Hearing Sciences and occupational therapy of the Faculty of Medicine, University of Kelaniya.

Research conducted by the Department includes those on psychological issues due to substances, childhood development deliberate self-harm and suicide, culture and mental illness, near-death experiences and old age wellbeing

The Department also offers a wide-ranging service component. The academic staff provides honorary consultant service to Colombo North Teaching Hospital. The academic members of the Department conduct four outpatient clinics per week at the Colombo North Teaching Hospital and run in-patient units at ward 28 & 29 of the same hospital. The clinical conditions managed by the academic members of the Department span from mental illnesses occurring in childhood to those occurring among the elderly. There are also specialized clinics for children and adults. In addition to medical treatments, the Department also specializes in conducting psychotherapeutic treatments for various psychiatric conditions. Thousand of patients are treated every month.

The Department of surgery provides the surgical training for undergraduate medical students of the Faculty of Medicine in collaboration with consultants of the Ministry of Health at the Colombo North Teaching Hospital, Ragama. The Department is a recognized centre for PGIM trainees in surgery as well. Each year about 180-200 medical students including some foreign medical students and 20-30 post graduates are trained in the unit.

The Department provides clinical services to the Colombo North Teaching Hospital through wards 41 & 42. Outpatient clinics are held eight times a week. The technical expertise of the Department includes laparoscopic surgery, diagnostic and therapeutic endoscopy, repair of anorectal sphincter injuries, surgery for inflammatory bowel disease and colonic cancer, hepatobiliary surgery. The Department has a team of surgeons undertaking liver transplantations and is the recognized centre for liver transplantation in the country. The Department is a well-recognized centre for endocrine surgery including thyroid, para-thyroid gland diseases. The Department provides novel surgical procedures for breast cancer including breast conservation surgery, total and partial breast reconstructions (autologous implant) and cosmetic breast surgery. Following chest wall perforator flap (CWPF) surgery is preferred for breast cancer patients for partial breast reconstruction following breast carcinoma diagnosis.

Major research interests of the Department are in diseases of the large bowel, intestinal, thyroid and parathyroid disease, breast disease, liver & hepatobiliary disorders and laparoscopic surgery. The Department has an excellent record of research publications, especially in the field of colorectal diseases, hepatobiliary diseases, endocrine surgery and breast cancer.

The gastrointestinal endoscopy unit functions jointly with the Department of Medicine providing a state of the art endoscopy services to the patients of teaching hospital, Ragama and is one of the two units recognized for endoscopy training by the PGIM.

The Faculty of Computing and Technology (FCT) was established on the 30th of December 2015 by the Gazette (Extraordinary) notification No. 1947/24 of the Government of Sri Lanka with three departments, namely, Department of Applied Computing, Department of Computer Systems Engineering and Department of Software Engineering. The new Faculty commenced its operations on 18th January 2016.

The academic registration of students in the FCT commenced from the academic year 2015/2016. The FCT started to offer degree programmes from the academic year 2015/2016 for students from the technology stream, namely, Bachelor of Information and Communication Technology (BICT) Honours and Bachelor of Engineering Technology (BET) Honours. From the academic year 2016/2017 the Faculty started offering the B.Sc. Honours in Computer Science Degree programme.

In addition, the Faculty will offer Bachelor of Bio System Technology (BBST) Honours degree programme near future. The Faculty will offer Postgraduate Programmes in the areas of Computer Science, Software Engineering, Information Technology and Engineering Technology. The Master of Science in Information Technology in Education programme is developed in collaborate with the Ministry of Education to train ICT teachers. This programme would commenced in 2020 is currently in progress.

The Faculty will conduct research in diverse fields of significant impact. The research enterprise at the FCT will expand from fundamental Computer Science research to the development of new technologies with applications to the industry and society as a whole. The discovery and creation of new technology are the essence of the doctoral programs in Computing and Technology. The Faculty is in the process of establishing several Research and Development centres. The following research centre are already established:

- Center for Excellence for Technology Education (CETE)
- Center for Advanced Material and Smart Manufacturing (CAMSM)

The FCT is planning to establish the following Research and Development Centres in the near the future:

- Centre for Data Science
- Centre for Cyber Security and Digital forensics

The Faculty of Computing and Technology is located at the University Drive, Bulugaha Junction, Kelaniya. New faculty complex was occupied in January 2023, and the financial support was provided by the Asian Development Bank.

Bachelor of Information and Communication Technology Honours Degree

The Bachelor of Information and Communication Technology is a four-year degree programme. The regular intake is 91 candidates. Students who followed the Technology Stream in their A/L are eligible to register for this programme. This degree programme will help students to build necessary skills, knowledge and attitudes required to function as software developers, network administrators ICT professionals in the industry. A strong fundamental knowledge in electronics and data communication with supporting hands-on laboratory sessions will provide the necessary skills and knowledge required to design, build and maintain industry standard software and computer networks. The incorporation of highly demanded application areas such as Virtualization and Cloud Computing, Network Computing, Network Management, Wireless and Mobile Communications, Computer Security, Web Programming, Mobile Application Development, Computer Games and Animation, Virtual Reality into the curriculum provides ample flexibility for students to specialize in their own areas of interest. The first two years of the curriculum aims at developing the common competencies expected of an ICT professional while the final two years are devoted to developing specific competencies in chosen areas of specialization. The areas of specialization currently on offer are:

- Computer Networks
- Software Systems Technology
- Games and Animation

Students will get an opportunity to work in the industry for six months through the internship module in the 4th year. The medium of instructions and examinations is English.

Bachelor of Engineering Technology Honours Degree

The Bachelor of Engineering Technology is a four-year degree programme. The regular intake for this degree is 100 candidates. Students who followed the Technology Stream in their A/L are eligible to register for this programme. The Engineering Technology Honours degree programme has a strong focus on practical applications of science and engineering with the view of preparing graduates for a wide variety of industry applications. The first two years of the curriculum aim at developing the common competencies expected of a manufacturing engineering technologist while the final two years are devoted to developing specific competencies in chosen areas of specialization in manufacturing technology. The areas of specialization currently on offer are:

- Materials and Process Technology
- Industrial Automation and Robotics
- Sustainable Technology

Students who follow Industrial Automation will be able to develop skills required to use control systems such as programmable logic controllers and robot manipulators for automating industrial processes. The Materials and Process teaching specialization focuses on design, operation and control of all the activities required to convert raw materials and commodity materials into valuable products, where as sustainable technology focuses on technologies that enable sustainable use of energy and materials in manufacturing technology.

Students in the degree programme will get an opportunity to work in the industry for six months through the internship module in the 4th year. The programme is delivered and assessed in English medium only.

Bachelor of Science Honours in Computer Science Degree

This is a four-year degree programme leading to the Bachelor of Science Honours in Computer Science Degree offered by the University of Kelaniya. The regular intake for this degree programme is 70 candidates. Students who followed the Physical Science Stream in their A/L are eligible to register for this programme. The course structure of the Bachelor of Science Honours in Computer Science Degree is designed to align with the recommendations of the Standing Committee on Computing of the UGC, and the computing guidelines of the Association for Computing Machinery (ACM) and the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE).

This degree programme will help students to build necessary skills, knowledge and attitudes required to function in the software industry, conduct research and disseminate

knowledge in Computer Science. Deep fundamental knowledge in theoretical Computer Science with supporting hands-on laboratory sessions will provide the necessary skills and tacit knowledge required to analyse, design, implement and maintain industry standard software. Knowledge on Database Systems, Machine Learning, Data Security, Theory of Compilers, Parallel Computing, High Performance Computing, Digital Forensics, Semantic Web and e-business technologies, Computer Games and Animation, Virtual Reality in the curriculum provide ample flexibility for students to specialize in their own areas of interest. Students can choose one of the following subject disciplines to specialize within the said degree programme:

- Data Science

Students will get an opportunity to work in the industry for six months through the internship module in the 4th year. The medium of instructions and examinations is strictly in English. In the final year all students should carry out a research project relevant to their area of interest.

Learning Centred Education

The Faculty has adopted the learning centred education pedagogy for its programme design and delivery for the first time in Sri Lanka. A series of workshops were conducted both in Sri Lanka and at the University of Oxford, UK under the guidance of Prof. Lynn McAlpine, Professor Emerita of University Education Development, Oxford Learning Institute, University of Oxford to train the staff and adopt the curriculum to reflect learning-centeredness.

The learning centred education approach promotes active learning where the emphasis is placed on creating and managing tasks and activities which will empower student learning, both inside and outside the class. The pedagogical style required to enable active learning is different to traditional lecturing. A different set of instructional and assessment strategies are adopted in the learning centred approach to facilitate independent learning by the students. The lecturer will select appropriate interactive techniques from a host of such techniques available, in addition to mini-lectures, to achieve the intended learning outcomes. The lecturer will also use a set of different assessment strategies, both formative and summative, to assess the level of achievement of the intended learning outcomes by each student, based on pre-defined rubrics, during the entire course module. This places less importance on the traditional end of the semester exams, and as a result a considerable percentage of marks will be earned by the students through continuous assessments throughout the modules.

Industry Advisory Board

The Faculty of Computing and Technology has established an Industry Advisory Board composed of eminent professionals from the industry, representatives of industry associations as well as representatives of professional associations.

The role of the Industry Advisory Board (IAB) of the Faculty of Computing and Technology (FCT) is to a liaise between the FCT and the industry as well as other institutional stakeholders in order to support the FCT in the formulation and attainment of its Mission and Strategic Objectives. It plays a key role in providing inputs and recommendations to the FCT from an industry perspective and guiding the strategic directions of the FCT in terms of academic programs, research and partnerships.

Annual Conference

The **International Conference on Advances in Computing and Technology** organized by the Faculty of Computing and Technology, University of Kelaniya was inaugurated in 2016 on 25th November 2016 at the Hilton Residences, Colombo. This annual conference was held in December 2022 for the 8th time.

This conference is expected to bring together researchers, educators, students, practitioners, technocrats and policymakers from across the academia, government, industry and non-governmental organizations to discuss, share and promote current work and recent accomplishments across all aspects of Computing, Nano Technology, Materials and Process Engineering, Robotics and Automation.

15. Scholarships, Gold Medals and Other Awards

15.1 Scholarships

- **Extension of the Year 5 Scholarship**

Students who have been entitled to Year 5 Scholarships can get them extended for university education. However, the students who receive the Mahapola scholarship or other bursaries are not eligible for the extension of the Year 5 Scholarship. Such students must inform the Senior Assistant Registrar (Students' Welfare Division) in writing, that they have received another scholarship.

- **Mahapola Scholarships**

The selected students are eligible for 10 installments on the monthly basis. The entire amount should be credited by the Mahapola trust fund to the students bank account

- **Bursaries**

The applications are called by the University during the academic year for the selection of suitable students for bursaries. An approved monthly stipend is paid to the eligible students. The students who are not entitled to receive Mahapola or other scholarships are eligible to apply for a bursary.

The Vice-Chancellor of the University has the authority to cancel, temporarily halt or cancel installments of a scholarship or a bursary in the following circumstances:

- a) Irregular attendance at lectures, tutorials and practical classes
- b) Misbehavior in or outside the university premises
- c) Becoming eligible for more than one scholarship or bursary
- d) Not registering for the academic year
- e) Obtaining paid employment (If employed after registration, the student must inform the Student Welfare Division).

Students are required to produce the Identity Card issued by the University to obtain their bursaries, Mahapola or other scholarships.

Apart from the government scholarships, there are other scholarships awarded by other institutes and persons.

- **The University Grants Commission scholarships**

These scholarships are awarded to students who are not eligible for any other form of financial assistance.

There are other scholarships awarded by institutions and individuals. Students are informed of these opportunities through notices placed in the common

meeting places of the University and the Student Welfare Division. Some of them are listed below:

- **Rathnakara Scholarship - Department of Linguistics**

Applications are called from low income students who perform well in the examinations in the 2nd, 3rd and 4th years in Linguistics.

- **Indian State Scholarship for Students who follow Hindi as a subject**

Students who follow Hindi as a subject for the B.A. or B.A. (Honours) degree have the opportunity to be trained in the Agra Centre in India on a scholarship awarded by India.

- **Reverend Hevanpola Sri Rathanasara Ananda Scholarship**

These scholarships are awarded to a student monk who has obtained the best results in one of the subjects: Pali, Buddhist Civilization, Buddhism at the G.C.E. (A/L) examination, and is registered as a student following Pali and Buddhism as subjects at the University of Kelaniya.

- **Professor W.S. Karunaratna Scholarship**

This is awarded to a low-income student who obtains the best results in the first year examination in Buddhist Philosophy.

- **Linee Dissanayake Scholarship**

This is awarded to four female students who obtain highest marks at the first year, first semester examination in the Bachelor of Arts degree for the subjects Pali, Buddhist Philosophy, Buddhist Culture and Buddhist Psychology.

- **Norwegian Maris Venor Scholarship**

This is awarded to a selected student who follows the subject streams offered by the Department of Economics.

- **Professor Shelton Gunaratne Merit Scholarship**

This is awarded to selected students who follow the B.A. degree in Mass Communication at the University of Kelaniya. This scholarship is awarded by Professor Shelton Gunaratne, Professor of Mass Communication of University of Minnesota, USA.

- **Professor J.K.P. Ariyaratne Memorial Scholarship**

This is awarded to the student who obtains the highest GPA for level one compulsory course units in Chemistry in the Bachelor of Science degree programme.

- **Professor H.H. Costa Memorial Scholarship**

This scholarship is awarded to four undergraduates from Kurunegala District who follows courses in the Biological Science stream and receives the Mahapola Scholarship. Preference will be given to the students following Zoology as a subject.

- **Agnes Peduru Parent Felicitation Scholarship**

This is awarded to a student who gets the highest marks for the first year degree programme in Medicine or in Science. Preference will be given to low income students.

- **Lakshmi Happitiya and Don Dharmasena Memorial Scholarships - Department of Physical Education and Sports Advisory Board**

Applications will be called from undergraduate sport persons of any faculty, who are in second year or above, who have won university colours for at least one sport conducted by the Department of Physical Education to select candidates to offer these two scholarships annually.

- **Dr. Dilushi Sandaken Hettiarachchi Memorial Scholarship - Department of Physical Education and Sports Advisory Board**

Applications will be called from undergraduate sport persons who are in second year or above of Faculty of Medicine, who have actively participated in at least one sport conducted by the Department of Physical Education and who have passed all subjects at one sitting of the second year bar examination to select a candidate in order to offer this scholarship annually.

- **Sujatha Guruge Scholarship**

Mr. Ananda W.P. Guruge has established the Sujatha Guruge Trust Fund under the Department of Public Trustee to commemorate Ms. Sujatha Guruge.

The intent of this trust is to award an annual monetary prize to female undergraduate students of a Sri Lankan state university who had obtained the highest marks in their first-year examinations. The monetary prize is offered to help these undergraduates in their education.

- **Chinese Ambassador's scholarship**

This scholarship is offered by the Ministry of Higher Education and Cultural affairs. Every year undergraduates who have obtained the highest Grade point Average (GPA) are selected for this scholarship.

- **Scholarship of Student trust fund – Department of Human Resource Management**

This scholarship will be awarded for two first year two low in come students, who are entering for the Bachelor of Business Management (Honours) degree in HR to help them success in the studies.

The University of Kelaniya has the highest number of international students (over 500 students) and offers the highest number of scholarship opportunities for undergraduates numbering (over 100 annually). Furthermore, the University has unique fields of study that have great potential to attract international scholars and students in large numbers i.e. the Departments of Modern Languages, Sanskrit, Pali and Buddhist Studies, and Fine Arts.

The Centre for International Affairs is the first contact point for any international scholar, grant agency, prospective student or university and envisages encouraging and supporting academics and students in their research/ study activities by providing assistance through funding, links with international universities and guidance to meet the university's goal of becoming an internationally recognised leader in the development and implementation of a knowledge-based society.

23. Coordinating Centre for Students with Disabilities

About the Centre

The Coordinating Centre for Students with Disabilities (CCSD) aims to be a central coordinating body offering support to all students with disabilities to enable equal access to university education. The CCSD is to offer students with disabilities relevant and timely advice, guidance and medical, psychosocial and academic support to promote individual growth and independence.

The Centre encourages diversity and equal and equitable participation of all students with disabilities in all aspects of university life by decreasing barriers and promoting inclusion. This includes promoting renovation and upgrade of existing buildings and pre-planning of new infrastructure projects in keeping with current legislature, advice on making accessible sanitary amenities and washrooms as well as appropriate inclusive hostel facilities and extending library resources, helping to mainstream disability into policy and practice.

Philosophy

The evolving concept of disability and the foundation of rights-based model advocating the rights of students with disabilities to access higher education is the guiding philosophy of CCSD. It is strengthened by the articulation of the rights of persons with disabilities within the United Nations Convention of Rights of Persons with Disabilities (UNCRPD), ratified by the Sri Lankan government in February 2016 and Fundamental Rights Chapter (III) of the constitution of Sri Lanka, article 12 (4), which provides for the possibility of 'special provisions' for women, children and persons with disabilities.

Any student with a physical or sensory disability, a speech and language difficulty, an on-going health condition, an ongoing mental health difficulty, specific learning disorders such as dyslexia and dysgraphia, or an Autism spectrum disorder is entitled to support and adjustment to learning, study materials, assessments and activities.

The students who have approached CCSD were provided support in:

- Opportunities for confidential discussions on student concerns and needs.
- Information, recommendations, guidance to support student access to education and to all aspects of university life.
- Advice on available courses, course combinations and assessment demands.

- Access to print materials in alternative methods (audiobooks)
- Accessible IT course for the visually impaired
- Accessible language courses for the visually impaired
- Support to secure, relevant specialist assistive technology and devices (Hearing aids, Voice recorders, digital magnifiers, etc.)
- Reasonable accommodation in examinations-adjustments for assessment tasks to ensure the same opportunity to demonstrate the level of learning as other students.
- Sign language interpretation
- Scholarships for those with financial difficulties

The Centre also conducts programs that promote awareness of challenging academic, mobility, societal and attitudinal barriers that discourage students with disabilities from full and equal participation in university life. The CCSD has undertaken an accessibility audit in 2017 and is currently working on the recommended changes.

The CCSD is comprised of representation from the Science Faculty together with academic staff from the Department of Disability Studies, Faculty of Medicine who form the advisory panel.

The University Health Service was established to help University students and all staff members lead an active life, free from disease, and to contribute towards the social wellbeing of students, and provide a comprehensive, preventive health service. The Medical Centre provides OPD consultation, day treatment and emergency treatment for the university community and patients may be referred to relevant clinics or transferred to tertiary care hospitals according to their requirements and situations. To provide these services, the Medical Centre has qualified staff, a well-equipped laboratory, a pharmacy and other required facilities. The University Medical Centre (UMC) functions on weekdays from 9.00 a.m. to 4.00 p.m. except on public holidays and poya days for students and both academic and non-academic staff. Further, patient care services are available only for students from 4.00 p.m. to 8.00 p.m.

A special mental health unit has been established at the UMC in collaboration with the Psychiatric unit of the Faculty of Medicine, University of Kelaniya. A consultant psychiatrist from the Faculty of Medicine, Ragama visits three times a month to attend to any student seeking special care. The confidentiality of patients is strictly maintained, and service is provided free of charge.

The University Medical Officers are well trained in student counselling and student health, especially in areas of sexual and reproductive health, and psychological problems of youth. During counseling sessions, strict confidentiality is maintained and students can meet any doctor during working days or reserve a time slot via telephone by contacting the Matron on 0112903152.

Further, preventive medical care and community health of the University community is followed up and observed by the University Medical Centre and the responsible Public Health Inspector (PHI) under the supervision of the Chief Medical Officer.

Students need to provide Medical Certificates whenever they take leave due to illnesses, especially during examinations. The University authorities accept three types of Medical Certificates.

01. University Medical Certificates

A Medical Certificate issued by The University Medical Officers / University Ayurvedic Medical Officers.

02. Government Medical Certificates

A Medical Certificate from a government medical institution or hospital and in case of infectious illness from a Medical Officer of Health (MOH)

03. Private Medical Certificates

A Medical Certificate issued by private medical practitioner / Consultant / Private Hospital should be duly certified by University Medical Officer (s) (SUCH PRIVATE MEDICAL CERTIFICATES SHOULD BE SUBMITTED WITHIN TWO WEEKS FOLLOWING THE ILLNESS) .

Private Medical Certificates which are **submitted for the examinations, ONLY** ACCEPT medical certificates issued by the relevant medical consultants.

04. Private Ayurvedic Medical Certificates

Ayurvedic Medicals should be approved by the Chief Medical Officer, Yakkala Ayurvedic Hospital or University Ayurvedic Medical Officer.

i.e. Students who bring Medical Certificates from private medical practitioners must provide sufficient evidence in the form of prescriptions, pathological reports and x-rays, to prove the authenticity of illnesses. It is only after scrutinizing these reports that the University Medical Officer would certify the private Medical Certificates.

It is mandatory for all the students to submit their duly completed Medical Certificate by a Government Hospital/MBBS doctor, to the Medical Centre, University of Kelaniya.

UNIVERSITY OF KELANIYA BY LAWS ON STUDENT DISCIPLINE

These By-Laws made by the Council of the University of Kelaniya under Section 135(1) (d) read with Section 29(n) of the Universities Act No. 16 of 1978 as amended by the Universities (Amendment) Act No. 7 of 1985 may be cited as Students Discipline By-law No. 01 of 2014 and shall come into operation with effect from **1st April 2014**.

Students' Discipline By-law No. 1 of 2009 and other By-laws relating to student discipline are hereby revoked.

The Vice-Chancellor shall be responsible for the maintenance of discipline within the University in terms of Section 34(6)(b) of the Universities Act No.16 of 1987 amended by the Universities (Amendment) Act No.7 of 1985.

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in any of the provisions of these By-laws, the Vice-Chancellor shall take whatever appropriate action he deems necessary to maintain discipline at the University and nothing in these By-laws shall be construed in a manner to detract from these powers, duties and functions conferred on or imposed upon the Vice-Chancellor by the Universities Act No.16 of 1978 (hereinafter referred to as the 'Act') or by any other Instrument.

Without prejudice to the generality of the powers and duties and functions conferred upon or imposed on the Council by the Act or any other Instrument, the Council shall be responsible for the administration and implementation of these By-laws.

These By-laws shall apply to every student of the University of Kelaniya (hereinafter referred to as the 'University')

PART 1 - STUDENT REGISTRATION AND IDENTIFICATION

1.1 The Registrar shall, on receipt of an application from a student, nominated by the University Grants Commission to be registered as a Student of the University of Kelaniya, on a form provided for the purpose by the University together with such information and documentation as may be required by the University, register such student as a student of the University and issue such student an identity card bearing a recent photograph of him/her and a student record book. *Student Identity Card / record book*

1.2 Every student allocated to a hostel shall be issued with a Hostel Admission Card with his/her registration number, name of the hostel and his/her photograph. *Hostel Admission Card*

1.3 Every student shall carry the said identity card and the hostel admission card, in the case of a hostel student, whilst in the University premises and shall produce such document when called upon to do so by any member of the academic or administrative staff or security staff, Marshal or any other person of the University authorized by the Vice-Chancellor. *Possession of Identity Cards*

PART 2 - DISCIPLINARY PROCEDURE

2.1 Any charge of misconduct/indiscipline against a student shall in the *Reporting*

- first instance be reported to the Vice-Chancellor (VC) *misconduct*
- 2.2 Where the VC receives information relating to any misconduct/indiscipline and considers that further particulars should be obtained, may request a member of the staff to proceed to the place in question and to report on the same as soon as possible. *On receipt of information*
- 2.3 Where the Vice-Chancellor received a complaint relating to misconduct, he may *Function of the Vice-Chancellor regarding a complaint*
- 2.3.1 appoint one or more members of the academic staff or
- 2.3.2 appoint a committee comprising of one or more persons from outside the University to investigate the matter and to submit to him their recommendations thereon.
- 2.3.3 The Vice-Chancellor may, take interim disciplinary action that he considers appropriate, pending such investigation.
- 2.4 The aforesaid committees shall investigate the relevant matter and submit their recommendations to the Vice-Chancellor. Such recommendations may be for imposition of punishment or holding a formal disciplinary inquiry, depending on the nature of the act/s of misconduct. *Committee of Investigation*
- The procedure to be followed is set out in Schedule I
- 2.5. Where the Vice-Chancellor receives a recommendation under 2.4 above, the Vice-Chancellor may, *Function of the Vice-Chancellor regarding the recommendation of the Committee*
- 2.5.1 discharge/pardon/warn the student/students
- 2.5.2 refer such recommendations to the Board of Discipline to determine punishment within the scope of Schedule II
- 2.6. The said Board of Discipline shall consist of five members appointed by the VC. *Board of Discipline*
- 2.7 The persons or committees described under 2.3 above may recommend to the Vice-Chancellor the imposition of the punishments set out in Schedule II. *Recommendation of Punishments*
- 2.8. Any Committee of Inquiry appointed by the Vice-Chancellor as the case may be, shall have the power to summon any student of the University to attend any Inquiry or to give evidence thereat and direct any student to make a written statement concerning any matter pertaining to his conduct or behaviour or to the conduct or behaviour of any other student within the University. *Giving evidence before the Committees*

13- STUDENT COUNSELLING SERVICE

- 3.1 The Vice-Chancellor shall appoint Student Counselors from among members of academic staff for the student counseling service. Out of them, Senior Student Counselors may be appointed representing the Faculties and there shall be one Chief Student Counselor. *Appointment of Student Counselors*
- 3.2 All Senior Student Counselors shall be responsible to the Chief Student *Appointment*

- Counselor and the Chief Student Counselor shall assist the Vice-Chancellor. *of Senior Student Counselor*
- 3.3 The Chief Student Counselor, Senior Student Counselors and Student Counselors shall have the following powers: *Authority of the Counselors*
- 3.3.1 Order any student to produce his/her student record book or student identity card;
- 3.3.2 Order a student or students to attend their office and to require him/them to make a statement in writing in relation to a matter pertaining to the maintenance of discipline in the University;
- 3.3.3 Order a student to leave the University premises (in which event an immediate report shall be submitted to the Vice-Chancellor);
- 3.3.4 Submit reports to the Vice-Chancellor if, in their opinion, a student has contravened any provision of these By-Laws.
- 3.4 Under the student counseling service, any University teacher shall have authority to: *Authority of the teachers*
- 3.4.1 Order any student to produce his/her student record book or student identity card:
- 3.4.2 Order a student to leave a lecture theatre, laboratory, classroom or library;
- 3.4.3 Submit reports to the Vice-Chancellor, through the appropriate Dean, or the Librarian if, in his opinion, a student has contravened any provision of these By-laws.
- 3.5 The Marshal of the University shall be responsible to the Registrar and he shall act in accordance with instructions and orders given by the Vice-Chancellor and the Registrar. *The Marshal*
- 3.6 The Marshal shall have the authority: *Authority of the Marshal*
- 3.6.1 to order a student to produce the record book or identity card issued to him/her by the University;
- 3.6.2 to report a student to the Senior Student Counselor or to a Student Counselors if he has reason to believe that such student has contravened any provision of these By-laws.

PART 4 – INTERPRETATION

1. Council

"Council" means the Council of the University of Kelaniya constituted by the Universities Act No. 16 of 1978, and the Universities (Amendment) Act No. 7 of 1985.

Senate

"Senate" means the Senate of the University of Kelaniya constituted by the Universities Act No. 16 of 1978, and the Universities (Amendment) Act No. 7 of 1985.

Registrar

"Registrar" means the Registrar or Acting Registrar of the University of Kelaniya including the Deputy Registrar, Senior Assistant Registrar, Assistant Registrar and any other officer

authorized to sign for, or on behalf of the Registrar of the University.

Vice-Chancellor

"Vice-Chancellor" means the Vice-Chancellor and the Deputy Vice-Chancellor of the University of Kelaniya or the Acting Vice-Chancellor / Deputy Vice-Chancellor for the time being.

Student

Is a male student/students or a female student/students registered as a scholar of the University of Kelaniya. It shall not include scholars registered for external examinations and fee-levied courses.

Chief Student Counselor

Means the Director of Student Affairs appointed by the Vice-Chancellor with the concurrence of the Council of the University of Kelaniya or any other parallel post.

2. Any question regarding the interpretation of these By-Laws shall be referred to the Council whose decision thereon shall be final.

SCHEDULE I

1. The complainant/s and the suspect student/s shall be interrogated at a preliminary investigation concerning an allegation of misconduct.
2. The adversarial system followed in Courts of Law need not be followed.
3. The allegation or charge should be communicated to the student against whom misconduct is alleged with particulars as to the nature of the misconduct and the day or time place of its occurrence and any person or property against whom or which the misconduct is alleged.
4. The student/s against whom misconduct is alleged must be informed of the substance of information relating to the complaint and be given an opportunity to show cause as to why he should not be punished.
5. The witnesses to incidents and the student/s against whom misconduct is alleged be examined separately and not in the presence of one another.
6. The student whose misconduct is under inquiry has no right of cross-examination of any witness against him or any right of representation at the preliminary stage of an inquiry.
7. In the case of a serious act of misconduct, the Committee appointed may, after the preliminary investigation/inquiry, recommend punishment or the holding of a formal inquiry, as the case may be.
8. The Vice-Chancellor may, in cases where the conducting of a formal disciplinary inquiry is recommended as stated in 7 above, take interim disciplinary action that he considers appropriate, pending such formal inquiry, and report such action to the Senate and Council for their endorsement or review of same.

Formal Inquiry

9. The Vice-Chancellor shall, on receipt of a recommendation to hold a formal inquiry, cause charges to be framed in writing and sent under registered post to the personal address or serve by hand as the case may be, to the student/s against whom misconduct is alleged.

10. The charges contained in a charge sheet shall be specific and shall contain a direction for the accused student to plead guilty/not guilty to the said charges. The accused student/s shall be required to plead to the charge sheet in writing within a specified period of time.
11. Where the accused student/s pleads guilty to the charges contained in the charge sheet, the Vice-Chancellor may make appropriate disciplinary order regarding the charges and report to the Senate and Council of same.
12. Where the accused student/s fails to plead to the charge sheet, the Vice-Chancellor may make appropriate disciplinary order after holding an inquiry ex-parte and report to the Senate and Council of same.
13. The Vice-Chancellor shall appoint a committee comprising of a member of the academic staff/not more than three members of the academic staff or an outside person/not more than three outside persons, as the case may be, to conduct a formal inquiry.
14. The said committee of inquiry shall have the power to summon any witness required by the prosecution or by the defence or is deemed a necessary witness by the committee.
15. At the formal inquiry, the prosecution/defence may produce witnesses and/or documents on their behalf and cross-examine the witnesses called by the prosecution/defence.
16. The Committee of Inquiry may, considering the nature of the complaint, obtain the statement of any witness in writing without calling him/her before the Committee. The defence shall not have an opportunity to cross-examine a witness who furnishes such written statement and, in such situation, the defence may be given the opportunity to obtain written clarifications relating to charges from such witness through the Committee.
17. The Committee of Inquiry shall, at the end of the inquiry, submit its report containing its decision and the reasons for arriving at such decision to the Vice-Chancellor.
18. Upon receipt of such report, the Vice-Chancellor shall refer such report to the Board of Discipline to determine the punishment to be imposed on the accused student/s and enforce such punishment with the approval of the Council.
19. After imposition of punishment, it shall be conveyed to the accused student/s by registered post or by hand as the case may be.
20. A student/s against whom such disciplinary action has been taken may appeal to the Vice-Chancellor against such decision within fourteen (14) days from the date of receipt of such decision.

ALS PROCEDURE

1. Any appeal made by the student/s against the decision to punish the student/s shall be made to the VC.
2. The VC shall place such appeal before the next immediate meeting of the council.
3. The Council shall appoint an Appeals Committee consisting of 3 of its members for this purpose. The Appeals Committee shall elect its Chairman. The Registrar shall be the Secretary to the Appeals Committee.
4. The Appeals Committee of the Council shall consider all appeals and submit a report to the Council within two weeks from the receipt of the appeal by the Committee.
5. The members of the Disciplinary Committee relating to the appeal in question, shall not participate in the proceedings of the Council (if they are members of the council) when it considers the report of the Appeals Committee.

6. The Council shall have the power to vary the decision taken on the disciplinary action against the student on the basis of the recommendation of the Appeals Committee. The decision of the Council on the appeal by the student shall be final.
7. The VC shall communicate the decision of the Council to the appellant student/s under registered post. The decision so communicated shall be final and conclusive.

- d. severe warning by the VC/Rector with a record of same in student's personal file.

- xxvi. Defacing or mutilating property belonging to the VC, Deputy VC/Rector any other officer, member of the academic or administrative staff, an employee, student of the University/ examination results or certificate as appropriate

Annex II

Prohibition of Ragging and Other Forms of Violence in Educational Institutions
Act (No. 20 of 1998) - Sect 1

Short title

1. This Act may be cited as the Prohibition of Ragging and Other Forms of Violence in Educational Institutions Act, No. 20 of 1998.

Ragging

- (1) Any person who commits, or participates in; ragging, within or outside an educational institution, shall be guilty of an offence under this Act and shall on conviction after summary trial before a Magistrate be liable, to rigorous imprisonment for a term not exceeding two years and may also be ordered to pay compensation of an amount determined by court, to the person in respect of whom the offence was committed for the injuries caused to such person.
- (2) A person who, whilst committing ragging causes sexual harassment or grievous hurt to any student or a member of the staff, of an educational institution shall be guilty of an offence under this Act and shall on conviction after summary trial before a Magistrate be liable to imprisonment for a term not exceeding ten years and may -also be ordered to pay compensation of an amount determined by court, to the person in respect of whom the offence was committed for the injuries caused to such person

Criminal intimidation,

3. Any person who, within or outside an educational institution, threatens, verbally or in writing, to cause injury to the person, reputation or property of any student or a member of the staff, of all educational institution (in this section referred to as "the victim") or to the person, reputation or property of some other person in whom the victim is interested, with the intention of causing fear in the victim or of compelling the victim to do any act which the victim is not legally required to do, or to omit to do any act which the victim is entitled to do, shall be guilty of an offence under this Act and shall on conviction after summary trial before a Magistrate be liable to rigorous imprisonment for a term not exceeding five years.

Hostage taking

4. Any person who does any act by which the personal liberty and the freedom of movement of any student or a member of the staff of an educational institution or other person within such educational institution or any premises under the management and control of such educational institution, is restrained without lawful justification and for the purpose of forcing such student, member of the staff or person to take a particular course of action, shall be guilty of an offence under this Act and shall on conviction after summary trial before a Magistrate, be liable to rigorous imprisonment for a term not exceeding seven years.

Wrongful restraint

5. Any person who unlawfully obstructs any student or a member of the staff of an educational institution, in such a manner as to prevent such student or member of the staff from proceeding in any direction in which such student or member of the staff, has a right to

proceed, shall be guilty of an offence under this Act and shall on conviction after summary trial before a Magistrate be liable to rigorous imprisonment for a term not exceeding seven years.

Unlawful confinement

1. Any person who unlawfully restrains any student or a member of the staff of an educational institution in such a manner as to prevent such student or member of the staff from proceeding beyond certain circumscribing limits, shall be guilty of an offence under this Act and shall on conviction after summary trial before a Magistrate be liable to imprisonment for a term not exceeding seven years.

Forcible occupation and damage to property of an educational institution

7. (1) Any person who, without lawful excuse, occupies, by force, any premises of, or under the management or control of, an educational institution shall be guilty of an offence under this Act, and shall on conviction after summary trial before a Magistrate be liable to imprisonment for a term not exceeding ten years or to a fine not exceeding ten thousand rupees or to both such imprisonment and fine.
- (2) Any person who causes mischief in respect of any property of, or under the management or control of, an educational institution shall be guilty of an offence under this Act and shall on conviction after summary trial before a Magistrate be liable to imprisonment for a term not exceeding twenty years and a fine of five thousand rupees or three times the amount of the loss or damage caused to such property, whichever amount is higher.

Orders of expulsion or dismissal

8. Where a person is convicted of an offence under this Act, the court may, having regard to the gravity of the offence"
 - (a) in any case where the person convicted is a student of an educational institution, order that such person be expelled from such institution;
 - (b) in any case where the person convicted is a member of the staff of an educational institution, order that such person be dismissed from such educational institution.

Bail

- (1) A person suspected or accused of committing an offence under subsection (2) of section 2 or section 4 of this Act shall not be released on bail except by the judge of a High Court established by Article 154P of the Constitution. In exercising his discretion to grant bail such Judge shall have regard to the provisions of section 14 of the Bail Act, No. 30 of 1997.
- (2) Where a person is convicted of an offence under subsection (2) of section 2 or section 4 of this Act, and an appeal is preferred against such conviction, the Court convicting such person may, taking into consideration the gravity of the offence and the antecedents of the person convicted, either release or refuse to release, such person on bail.

Certain Provisions of the Code of Criminal Procedure Act not to apply to persons convicted or found guilty of an offence under this Act

10. Notwithstanding anything in the Code of Criminal Procedure Act, No. 15 of 1979"
 - (a) the provisions of section 303 of that Act shall not apply in the case of any person who is convicted,

- b) the provisions of section 306 of that Act shall not apply in the case of any person who pleads or is found guilty,

Offences under this Act deemed to be cognizable offences

- 11. All offences under this Act shall be deemed to be cognizable Offences for the purposes of the application of the provisions of the Code of Criminal Procedure Act, No. 15 of 1979, notwithstanding anything contained in the First Schedule to that Act.

Certificate

- 12. Where in any prosecution for an offence under this Act, a question arises whether any person is a student or a member of the staff of an educational institution or whether any premises or property is the property of, or is under the management and control of, an educational institution a certificate purporting to be under the hand of the head or other officer of such educational institution to the effect that the person named therein is a student or a member of the staff of such educational institution, or that the premises or property specified therein is the property of, or is under the management and control of, such educational institution, shall be admissible in evidence without proof of signature and shall be prima facie evidence of the facts stated therein.

Admissibility of statement in evidence

- 13. (1) If in the course, of a trial for an offence under this Act, any witness shall on any material point contradict either expressly or by necessary implication a statement previously given by him in the course of any investigation into such offence, it shall be lawful for the Magistrate if, after due inquiry into the circumstances in which the statement was made, he considers it safe and just”
 - (a) to act upon the statement given by the witness in the course of the investigation, if such statement is corroborated in material particulars by evidence from an independent source; and
 - (b) to have such witness at the conclusion of such trial, tried before such court upon a charge for intentionally giving false evidence in a stage of a judicial proceeding,
- (2) At any trial under paragraph (b) of subsection (1) it shall be sufficient to prove that the accused made the contradictory statements alleged in the charge and it shall not be necessary to prove which of such statements is false.

Provisions of this Act to be in addition to and not in derogation of the provisions of the 14. Penal Code & c

- 14. The provisions of this Act shall be in addition to and not in derogation of, the provisions of the Penal Code, the Convention Against Torture and Other Cruel, Inhuman or Degrading Treatment or Punishment Act, No. 22 of 1994 or any other law.

Priority for trials and appeals under this Act

- 15. Every Court shall give priority to the trial of any person charged with any offence under this Act and to the bearing of any appeal from the conviction of any person for appeals under any such offence and any sentence imposed on such conviction.

Sinhala text to Prevail in case of inconsistency

16. In this Act unless the context otherwise requires " "criminal force", "fear", "force", "grievous hurt", "hurt" and "mischief shall have the respective meanings assigned to them in the Penal Code; "educational institution" means
- (a) a Higher Educational Institution;
 - (b) any other Institution recognized under Chapter IV of the Universities Act, No, 16 of 1978;
 - (c) the Buddhist and Pali University established by the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka Act, No. 74 of 1981;

 - (i) the National Institute of Education established; by the National Institute of Education Act, No
 - (j) the Collage of Education established by the: Collage of Education Act, No.30 of 1986 or a training Collage;
 - (k) a Government school or an assisted school or an unaided school, within the meaning of the Education Ordinance (Chapter 185,)

and include any other institution established for the purpose of providing education, instruction or training "head of an educational institution" means the Vice-Chancellor, Mahopadyaya, Director, President, Principal or any other person howsoever designated charged with the administration and management of the affairs of such educational institution;"Higher Educational Institution" has the meaning assigned to it in the Universities Act, No.16 of 1978; "ragging" means any act which causes or is likely to cause physical or psychological injury or mental pain or: fear to a student or a member of the staff or an educational institution; "student" means a student of an educational institution; "sexual harassment" means the use of criminal force, words or actions to cause sexual annoyance or harassment to a student or a member of the staff, or an educational institution:

AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE SETTING OUT OF RIGHTS AND ENTITLEMENTS OF VICTIMS OF CRIME AND WITNESSES AND THE PROTECTION AND PROMOTION OF SUCH RIGHTS AND ENTITLEMENTS; TO GIVE EFFECT TO APPROPRIATE INTERNATIONAL NORMS, STANDARDS AND BEST PRACTICES RELATING TO THE PROTECTION OF VICTIMS OF CRIME AND WITNESSES ; THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE NATIONAL AUTHORITY FOR THE PROTECTION OF VICTIMS OF CRIME AND WITNESSES; CONSTITUTION OF A BOARD OF MANAGEMENT; THE VICTIMS OF CRIME AND WITNESSES ASSISTANCE AND PROTECTION DIVISION OF THE SRI LANKA POLICE DEPARTMENT; PAYMENT OF COMPENSATION TO VICTIMS OF CRIME; ESTABLISHMENT OF THE VICTIMS OF CRIME AND WITNESSES ASSISTANCE AND PROTECTION FUND AND FOR MATTERS CONNECTED THEREWITH OR INCIDENTAL THERETO.

BE it enacted by the Parliament of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka as follows :-

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the Assistance to and Protection of Victims of Crime and Witnesses Act, No. 4 of 2015.

Short title.

(2) The provisions of this Act, other than this section, shall come into operation on such date or dates as the Minister may appoint by Order published in the *Gazette*. Different dates may be appointed by the Minister for the coming into operation of different Parts of this Act.

PART I

OBJECTS OF THE ACT

2. The objects of this Act shall be to-

Objects of the Act.

(a) set out, uphold and enforce the rights and entitlements of victims of crime and witnesses and to provide for a mechanism to promote, protect, enforce and exercise such rights and entitlements ;

- (b) provide assistance and protection to victims of crime and witnesses ;
- (c) enable victims of crime to obtain compensation from persons convicted of having committed offences against them ;
- (d) provide for obtaining redress by victims of crime, including restitution, compensation, reparation and rehabilitation of such victims ;
- (e) set out duties and responsibilities of the State, judicial officers and public officers towards the promotion and protection of the rights and entitlements of victims of crime and witnesses ;
- (f) stipulate offences that may be committed against victims of crime and witnesses and the penal sanctions that may be imposed on persons who commit such offences ; and
- (g) provide for the adoption and implementation of best practices relating to the protection of victims of crime and witnesses.

PART II

RIGHTS AND ENTITLEMENTS OF VICTIMS OF CRIME AND WITNESSES

Rights of
Victims of
Crime.

- 3.** A victim of crime shall have the right :—
- (a) to be treated with equality, fairness and with respect to the dignity and privacy of such victim ;
 - (b) where the victim is a child victim, to be treated in a manner which ensures the best interests of such child ;
 - (c) in accordance with procedures as may be prescribed, to receive prompt, appropriate and fair redress, including reparation and restitution, for and in consideration of any harm, damage or loss suffered as a result of being a victim of a crime ;

- (d) to be appropriately protected from any possible harm, including threats, intimidations, reprisals or retaliations ;
- (e) to be medically treated for any mental or physical injury, harm, impairment or disability suffered as a victim of a crime ;
- (f) upon a request made by such victim, to be informed—
 - (i) by the Authority or the Division, of the legal remedies available for the redress of any harm which he has suffered including civil remedies available for obtaining damages and relevant periods of prescription applicable thereto ;
 - (ii) without prejudice to any on-going investigations being carried out by the officer-in-charge of the relevant police station or other authority conducting the investigation, of the progress of the investigation being conducted into the complaint presented by the victim of crime, to such police station or other authority conducting the investigation ;
 - (iii) by the officer-in-charge of the relevant police station or other authority conducting an investigation, the Attorney-General or the Registrar of the Court, as the case may be, of the dates fixed for hearing and the progress and the disposal of judicial proceedings relating to the offence complained of by the victim of crime, including the non-summary inquiry, trial, appeal and application in revision and by the Authority of the rights and entitlements of the victim of crime pertaining to such proceedings ;
 - (iv) by the officer-in-charge of the relevant police station or other authority conducting

an investigation, the Attorney-General, the Registrar of the Court or the Superintendent of Prisons, as the case may be, of the dates fixed for the—

- (a) release on bail ;
 - (b) discharge of the suspect ;
 - (c) institution of criminal proceedings against the accused ;
 - (d) the conviction, sentence or acquittal of the suspect or the accused; and
 - (e) the release from prison of the convict, who has committed or is alleged to have committed and offence against the victim of crime and the reasons therefore ; and
- (v) by the Authority of the medical, social services and any other assistance that is or may be available for the treatment or amelioration of any harm caused to such victim of crime.
- (g) to present, either orally or in writing, a complaint pertaining to the commission of an offence and to have such complaint recorded by any police officer, in any police station or other unit or division of the Police Department and to have such complaint impartially and comprehensively investigated by the relevant investigating authority ;
 - (h) without prejudice to any on-going investigation, to be represented by an Attorney-at-Law during an investigation, including criminal and forensic investigations and magisterial inquiries into the alleged offence committed against such victim and make necessary representations to the appropriate competent authorities who are conducting such investigations ;

- (i) without prejudice to any on-going or concluded investigation, to obtain certified copies of Cause of Death forms, Post Mortem Reports, Medico-Legal Reports, Reports of the Registrar of Finger Prints, Reports of the Government Analyst and any other report of an expert and reports filed in the Magistrate's Court by the Police, as required by sections 115, 116 and 120 of the Code of Criminal Procedure Act :

Provided however, where an application is made for the purpose of obtaining certified copies of reports referred to in this paragraph, the Magistrate to whom such application is made shall inquire from the police, whether the issue of such Reports would prejudice the on-going investigations, to which those Reports relate and where the release of any one or more of the Reports is likely to prejudice the on-going investigation, the Magistrate shall refuse the issue of such Report or Reports ;

- (j) to present written communications or make representations through legal counsel to the Attorney-General, before, during and after the investigation into the offence alleged to have been committed against such victim, and before and during the conduct of judicial proceedings, including at the non-summary inquiry, trial and appeal ;
- (k) to present written communications or make representations through legal counsel to an investigator, who is conducting an investigation into the offence committed against such victim of crime, and to be entitled to receive a response in regard to such communications or representations made ;
- (l) to be present at all judicial or quasi-judicial proceedings relating to an offence, including at the non-summary inquiry, trial, appeals and any application in revision, unless the court, Commission or other tribunal determines, for reasons to be recorded that such victims evidence would be

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materially affected if he hears other evidence at such proceedings or the due discharge of justice could be secured only by the exclusion of such victim from being present during the hearing of certain parts of such proceedings ;

- (m) to receive any assistance and information required to attend and participate at judicial or quasi-judicial proceedings pertaining to the offence committed against him ;
- (n) without prejudice to the prosecution, to be represented by legal counsel at the several stages of the criminal proceedings relating to the offence, including at the non- summary inquiry, trial, appeal and application in revision, and where a request is made, to be provided where available with legal assistance for such purposes ;
- (o) following the conviction of the offender and prior to the determination of the sentence, either personally or through legal counsel, to submit to court the manner in which the offence concerned had impacted on his life, including his body, state of mind, employment, profession or occupation, income, quality of life, property and any other aspects concerning his life ;
- (p) in the event of an appeal or application in revision being presented by a person convicted of having committed an offence, either personally or through legal counsel, to submit to court that adjudicates upon such appeal or application in revision, the manner in which the offence concerned had impacted on his life, including his body, state of mind, employment, profession or occupation, income, quality of life and property and any other aspects concerning his life ; and

- (q) in the event of any person in authority considering the grant of a pardon or remission of sentence imposed on any person convicted of having committed an offence, to receive notice thereof and submit through the Authority to the person granting such pardon or remission, the manner in which the offence committed had impacted on his life including his body, state of mind, employment, profession or occupation, income, quality of life, property and any other aspects concerning his life.

4. (1) A victim of crime shall be entitled to receive a sum of money from the Authority, in consideration of the expenses incurred as a result of the offence committed and his participation in any judicial or quasi-judicial proceedings before a court or Commission, pertaining to the alleged commission of an offence or an alleged infringement of a fundamental right or a violation of a human right.

Entitlements of
a victim of
crime.

(2) Where necessary resources are available with the State, a victim of crime shall be entitled to claim and obtain from the State any required medical treatment, including appropriate medical services, medicine and other medical facilities, in respect of physical or mental injury, harm, impairment or disability suffered as a result of being a victim of crime and for necessary rehabilitation and counseling services.

(3) Where due to absence or lack of necessary resources the State is unable to provide the services claimed by a victim of crime under subsection (2), such victim shall be entitled to apply to the Authority for financial assistance for the purpose of obtaining the required medical treatment for any physical or mental harm, injury or impairment suffered as a result of being a victim of crime and for any necessary rehabilitation and counseling services.

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Crime and Witnesses Act, No. 4 of 2015*

Entitlements of
witnesses.

5. (1) A witness shall be entitled to receive from investigational, quasi-judicial and judicial authorities fair and respectful treatment, with due regard to the dignity and privacy of such witness.

(2) A witness shall not be harassed or intimidated, coerced or violated during or thereafter, due to or as a consequence of-

- (a) providing information relating to the commission of an offence or to the infringement of any fundamental right or the violation of any human right ;
- (b) volunteering to make a statement during an investigation into any offence or an investigation or inquiry into the infringement of any fundamental right or the violation of any human right ; or
- (c) providing testimony in a court or before a Commission relating to the alleged commission of an offence or an alleged infringement of a fundamental right or a violation of a human right.

(3) A witness shall be entitled to protection against any real or possible harm, threat, intimidation, reprisal or retaliation resulting from such witness having provided information or lodged a complaint or made a statement to any law enforcement authority or for having provided any testimony in any Court or before a Commission or for instituting legal proceedings, pertaining to the commission of an offence or for the infringement of a fundamental right or for a violation of a human right, by any person.

Persons to be
entitled to

6. A person who is neither a victim nor a witness, shall be entitled to claim protection against :

- (a) any harassment, intimidation, coercion, violation or suffering from loss or damage in mind, body or reputation ; or

(b) any adverse change to his condition of employment,

due to or as a result of such person having provided information, lodged a complaint or made a statement to any law enforcement authority or to any Court or Commission or of having given a testimony in any Court or before a Commission, pertaining to the commission of an offence or an infringement of any fundamental right or the violation of a human right, at such persons' place of employment or in the employment environment of such person.

7. It shall be the duty of every public officer including the members of the armed forces and police officers and every judicial officer, to recognize, protect and promote rights and entitlements referred to in sections 3, 4, 5 and 6 of this Act.

Duty of public and judicial officers to respect etc. rights and entitlements.

PART III

OFFENCES AGAINST VICTIMS OF CRIME AND WITNESSES

8. (1) Any person who-

Offences against victims of crime and witnesses.

(a) threatens a victim of crime or a witness with injury to his person, reputation or property or to the person or reputation or property of any other in whom such victim of crime or witness has an interest, with the intention of causing alarm to such victim of crime or witness or to cause such victim of crime or witness to refrain from lodging a complaint against such person with a law enforcement authority or testifying at any judicial or quasi-judicial proceedings or to compel such victim of crime to withdraw a complaint lodged or legal action instituted against such person ; or

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- (b) voluntarily causes hurt to a victim of crime or a witness, with the intention of causing such victim of crime or witness to refrain from lodging a complaint against such person with a law enforcement authority, or testifying at any judicial or quasi-judicial proceedings or to compel such victim of crime to withdraw a complaint lodged or legal action instituted against such person, or in retaliation for a statement made or testimony provided by such victim of crime or witness in any court of law or before a Commission, against such person,

commits an offence, and shall on conviction by a High Court, be sentenced to a term of imprisonment not exceeding ten years and to a fine of rupees twenty thousand.

(2) Any person who—

- (a) voluntarily causes grievous hurt to a victim of crime or a witness ; or
- (b) wrongfully restrains a victim of crime or a witness,

with the intention of preventing such victim of crime or witness from lodging a complaint against such person with a law enforcement authority or from testifying in any judicial or quasi-judicial proceedings against such person, or compelling such victim of crime or witness to withdraw a complaint lodged or a legal action instituted against such person, or in retaliation for a statement made or testimony provided by such victim of crime or witness in a Court of law or before a Commission against such person, commits an offence,

and shall on conviction by a High Court be sentenced to a term of imprisonment not exceeding twelve years and to a fine of rupees thirty thousand.

(3) Any person who—

- (a) by force compels or by any deceitful means, abuse of authority or by any other means of compulsion, induces any victim of crime or a witness to leave any place ; or
- (b) intends to cause or knowing that he is likely to cause wrongful loss, damage or destruction to the property of a victim of crime or a witness, causes such loss, damage or destruction to the property of that victim of crime or witness,

with the intention of preventing such victim of crime or witness from lodging a complaint or making any statement against such person to a law enforcement authority or testifying against such person in any judicial or quasi-judicial proceedings or in retaliation for a statement made to a law enforcement authority or the testimony made against such person in any judicial or quasi-judicial proceedings by such victim of crime or witness, commits an offence, and shall on conviction by the High Court be sentenced to a term of imprisonment not exceeding twelve years and to a fine of rupees thirty thousand.

(4) A person who causes—

- (a) any harassment, intimidation, coercion, violation, physical or mental suffering, loss or damage to the reputation of another person ; or

- (b) an adverse change being made to the conditions of employment in the place of employment of such other person,

due to or as a result or consequence of such other person having provided any information or lodged a complaint or made a statement to any law enforcement authority or to any Court or Commission or having provided testimony in any Court or before a Commission or instituted legal proceedings pertaining to the commission of an offence or the infringement of a fundamental right or the violation of human rights of such person, commits an offence and shall on conviction by the High Court be sentenced to a term of imprisonment not exceeding seven years and to a fine of rupees fifteen thousand.

(5) Any person who—

- (a) having received information given for the purpose of commencing or conducting an investigation into an offence ;
- (b) having gathered information in the course of an investigation into an offence ; or
- (c) having received such information referred to in paragraphs (a) and (b) from any other person,

provides, issues or gives to a third person or publishes or otherwise disseminates any such information or part thereof regarding the identity of the relevant victim of crime or a possible witness or informant who provided such information and thereby places the life of such victim of crime,

witness or informant in danger, other than in good faith and in accordance with or in compliance with—

- (a) any provisions or procedures established by law ;
- (b) an order made by a judicial officer ; or
- (c) a directive issued by a person duly authorized to do so by or under any law,

commits an offence, and shall on conviction by the High Court be sentenced to a term of imprisonment not exceeding seven years and to a fine of rupees fifteen thousand.

(6) Any person who is alleged, suspected or accused of having committed an offence, offers, provides or gives any gratification to any other person who is—

- (a) intending or preparing to institute legal proceedings against such person for having committed such offence ; or
- (b) likely to provide information or testimony against such person to any law enforcement authority, Commission or court,

with a view to preventing, discouraging or dissuading such other person from instituting legal proceedings or providing truthful information or testimony against such first mentioned person who is alleged, suspected or accused of having committed the offence, commits an offence, and shall on conviction by the High Court be sentenced to a term of imprisonment not exceeding seven years and to a fine of rupees fifteen thousand.

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(7) Any person who with the intention of obtaining any protection or assistance from the Authority, the police including the Division, a Court or a Commission, provides any information knowing or having reasonable grounds to believe that such information is false, commits an offence, and shall on conviction by the High Court be sentenced to a term of imprisonment not exceeding seven years and to a fine of rupees fifteen thousand.

(8) Any person who is in charge of or participating or assisting in providing protection to a victim of crime or to a witness or who otherwise is in possession of information relating to the protection being afforded to a victim of crime or a witness, provides, issues or gives to another person such information and thereby places the life of such victim of crime or witness in danger, other than in good faith and in accordance with or in compliance with—

- (i) any provisions or procedures established by law ;
- (ii) an order made by a judicial officer ; or
- (iii) a directive issued by a person duly authorized to do so by or under any law,

commits an offence, and shall on conviction by the High Court be sentenced to a term of imprisonment not exceeding seven years and to a fine of rupees fifteen thousand.

Attempting or instigating the commission of an offence under section 8, to be an offence.

9. Any person who attempts to commit, instigates or intentionally aids any other person to commit or engages in any conspiracy for the commission of any offence referred to in section 8, shall be guilty of an offence and shall on conviction by the High Court be sentenced to the same punishment provided for that offence, by that section.

10. (1) (a) An offence under section 8 or 9 shall be cognizable and non-bailable and no person suspected, accused or convicted of such and offence shall be enlarged on bail, unless under exceptional circumstances by the Court of Appeal.

An offence under section 8 and 9 to be cognizable and non-bailable.

(b) When enlarging a person on bail, the Court of Appeal shall have the power to impose a condition prohibiting communication with or coming into close proximity with the person in respect of whom the suspect is alleged to have committed the offence, and with any other persons who may be specified in the order granting such bail.

(2) A trial against a person accused of having committed any offence under section 8 or under section 9 shall be taken up before any other business of that court and shall be held on a day to day basis and not be postponed during the course of such trial, except due to unavoidable circumstance which shall be specifically recorded.

(3) If after an inquiry by a Court, it is found that there exists *prima-facie* material to conclude that a person who at the relevant point of time was on bail in respect of any offence alleged to have been committed by him, has committed an offence under section 8 or section 9, the bail granted to such person by the Court which conducted the inquiry shall be cancelled and such person shall be placed on remand till the end of the trial in respect of the offence which he had been enlarged on bail.

PART IV

ESTABLISHMENT OF THE NATIONAL AUTHORITY FOR THE PROTECTION OF VICTIMS OF CRIME AND WITNESSES

11. (1) There shall be established an Authority which shall be called the National Authority for the Protection of Victims of Crime and Witnesses (in this Act referred to as the "Authority").

National Authority for the Protection of Victims of Crime and Witnesses.

(2) The Authority shall, by the name assigned to it by subsection (1), be a body corporate with perpetual succession and have a common seal, and may sue and be sued in such name.

Board of
Management of
the Authority.

12. (1) The administration and management of the affairs of the Authority shall be vested in a Board of Management (hereinafter referred to as the “Board”) which shall consist of:—

(a) the following *ex-officio* members—

- (i) the Secretary to the Ministry of the Minister in charge of the subject of justice or an Additional Secretary to the said Ministry, nominated by such Secretary;
- (ii) the Secretary to the Ministry of the Minister in charge of the Police Department or an Additional Secretary to the said Ministry, nominated by such Secretary;
- (iii) the Secretary to the Ministry of the Minister in charge of the subject of Women’s Affairs or an Additional Secretary to the said Ministry, nominated by such Secretary;
- (iv) the Secretary to the Ministry of the Minister in charge of the subject of Children or an Additional Secretary to the said Ministry, nominated by such Secretary;
- (v) a member of the Human Rights Commission of Sri Lanka established by the Human Rights Commission of Sri Lanka Act, No.21 of 1996, nominated by such Commission;
- (vi) a nominee of the Attorney-General; and

- (vii) a nominee of the Inspector General of Police holding the rank of a Senior Deputy Inspector General of Police:

Provided that where the subjects specified in sub-paragraphs (iii) and (iv) of this paragraph are assigned to or remain in charge of a single Minister, the Secretary to the Ministry of that Minister alone shall be eligible to become a member of the Board under this paragraph;

- (b) five appointed members, selected from among persons who are academically or professionally qualified and have experience in professions or fields of professional activity associated with criminology, the criminal justice system, the promotion and protection of human rights or medicine appointed by the President.

(2) The President shall, designate as the Chairman of the Board, a member from among the members of the Board who shall also be the chairman of the Authority.

(3) The provisions of the Schedule to this Act shall apply to and in relation to the appointment of the members of the Board, the meetings of the Board, remuneration payable to the members and the seal of the Board.

13. (1) The duties and functions of the Authority shall be to—

Duties and
functions of the
Authority.

- (a) promote the recognition of and respect for the rights of victims of crime;
- (b) promote the recognition of and respect for the entitlements of witnesses;

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- (c) protect or cause to be protected the rights of victims of crime and entitlements of witnesses;
 - (d) on receiving a complaint or any information regarding an alleged infringement or imminent infringement of any right or entitlement of a victim of crime or a witness, investigate and inquire into such alleged infringement or imminent infringement and to require any relevant authority to take such appropriate corrective measures in that regard, in order to ensure the protection and promotion of the rights and entitlements of victims of crime and witnesses provided by this Act;
 - (e) provide necessary assistance to victims of crime and witnesses, including appropriate measures for their treatment, reparation, restitution and rehabilitation;
 - (f) make an award for payment of compensation to a victim and for that purpose develop and implement a scheme for the grant of compensation to victims of crime from the Victims of Crime and Witnesses Assistance and Protection Fund established under section 29 of this Act;
 - (g) create awareness among the public regarding the rights and entitlements of victims of crime and witnesses provided by this Act;
 - (h) advice and make recommendations to the Sri Lanka Police Department and any other government department, statutory institution and to public officers, either generally or on a case by case basis, on appropriate and specific measures that should be adopted or implemented to give effect to the rights and entitlements of victims of crime and witnesses and in particular regarding the provision of—
 - (i) effective protection;

- (ii) necessary treatment, rehabilitation and counseling; and
 - (iii) other appropriate assistance,
- to victims of crime and witnesses.
- (i) review existing policies, legislation and the practices and procedures being adopted and followed by various authorities, to ensure their conformity with recognized standards and best practices relating to the promotion and protection of the rights and entitlements of victims of crime and witnesses, and based on such review, to make recommendations regarding the adoption, amendment and application of appropriate policies, legislation and practices;
- (j) make available on request to any Court or a Commission or any other person information on best practices pertaining to the reception of evidence of victims of crime or witnesses through contemporaneous or near contemporaneous audio-visual linkage;
- (k) take measures to sensitize public officers involved in the enforcement of the law, including officers of the Sri Lanka Police, the Prisons Department, government medical officers and public officers associated with probation and social services, on the needs of victims of crime and witnesses and on any special needs of particular categories of victims of crime, arising as a result of the harm inflicted or possible harm that may be inflicted on them due to their age, gender, religion, language, cultural beliefs and practices, ethnic or social origins or disabilities or any other reason;
- (l) promote and ensure the observance and application of codes of conduct and recognized norms and best practices relating to the protection of the rights and

entitlements of victims of crime and witnesses, by Courts, Commissions, any other tribunals, public officers and employees of statutory bodies involved in the enforcement of the law, including officers of the Sri Lanka Police, the Prisons Department, government medical officers and officers of government social service institutions;

- (m) conduct or promote the conduct of research into ways and means in which—
- (i) incidents of crime can be reduced;
 - (ii) impact of specific crimes on victims could be minimized or prevented;
 - (iii) victims of crime can be effectively treated, rehabilitated, counseled, assisted, compensated and protected;
 - (iv) a conducive environment could be created for witnesses to make statements before the law enforcement authorities or to testify fearlessly at proceedings before courts, any Commissions and other tribunals; and
 - (v) assistance and protection could be provided to victims of crime and witnesses;
- (n) recommend to appropriate government institutions, social, health, educational, economic and crime prevention policies that may be adopted by such institutions for the reduction of incidents of crime and for facilitating assistance and protection being provided to victims of crime and witnesses;

- (o) promote the development, adoption and implementation of measures of restitution to victims of crime as a sentencing option in the criminal justice system;
- (p) promote the development and implementation of measures of restorative justice as a method of administering criminal justice and as a sentencing option in the criminal justice system;
- (q) develop, adopt and implement a scheme for providing assistance and protection to victims of crime and witnesses;
- (r) issue guidelines pertaining to the establishment and maintenance of the Victims of Crime and Witnesses Assistance and Protection Division;
- (s) present annually to Parliament, a report on the:—
 - (i) manner in which the Authority has given effect to the objects of this Act;
 - (ii) performance and discharge of the duties and functions of the Authority; and
 - (iii) proposals for necessary policy and legislative reforms.
- (t) do or perform any further functions and activities that may be necessary to achieve the objects of this Act.

(2) Where the Authority makes any recommendations to any person or authority or requires any person or authority to carry out any measures under subsection (1), it shall be the duty of such person or authority:—

- (a) to give effect to such recommendation or carry out such measure and report back to the Authority of such fact; or

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- (b) where the person or the authority concerned is unable to give effect to the recommendations or carry out the measures, to report back to the Authority of such inability, giving reasons for the same.

(3) For the purpose of ensuring that any recommendations or the measures are given effect to or carried out adequately and in a proper manner by the person or authority concerned under paragraph (a) of subsection (2), the Authority shall monitor all activities performed by such person or authority in giving effect to the recommendations or carrying out the measures concerned.

Powers of the
Authority.

14. (1) The Authority shall have the power—

- (a) for the purpose of conducting an investigation or an inquiry into an alleged or an imminent infringement of a right or entitlement of a victim of crime or witness, to:—
- (i) require any person other than a judicial officer or a Commissioner of a Commission to appear before the Authority and to participate in an investigation or inquiry;
 - (ii) require any person other than a court or a Commission, to produce before the Authority any document, a certified copy thereof or other material in his or its possession or custody, including the reports of investigations, information book, extracts and officers visiting book extracts of the police, for examination and copying;

- (iii) require any person other than a court or a Commission to provide to the Authority in writing, any information which it or he is likely to possess;
- (iv) interview and record the statement of any person other than that of a judicial officer or a Commissioner of any Commission;
- (v) make an application to any court or Commission and be entitled to obtain certified copies of any proceedings of any case, action or other proceedings of such Court or Commission and documents and other material that may be filed of record in a case record or a file of such court or Commission;
- (vi) enter into, inspect, examine or observe and record any event, location or process taking place in any place, including an investigation, inquiry, trial or other proceeding;
- (vii) make an appropriate order and to direct, advice or recommend the adoption of such measures for the promotion or protection of the rights and entitlements of the victim of crime or a witness or for remedying any damage caused as a result of the infringement of the rights or entitlement of the relevant victim of crime or the witness;

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- (b) acquire, hold, take or give on lease or hire, mortgage, pledge, sell or otherwise dispose of any movable or immovable property;
- (c) enter into such contracts as may be necessary for the performance and discharge of its duties and functions;
- (d) invest monies lying to the credit of its Fund in an appropriate and secure manner and open and maintain current, savings or deposit accounts in banks;
- (e) appoint, dismiss and exercise disciplinary control over officers, consultants and advisors as may be necessary for the proper performance and discharge of its duties and functions;
- (f) subject to the provisions of section 24(3), solicit, accept and receive donations, gifts, bequests and grants from sources within or outside Sri Lanka and to apply the same for the proper discharge of its duties and functions;
- (g) exercise all such other and further powers as may be necessary for the proper performance and discharge of its duties and functions under this Act.

(2) Any person who fails to comply with any requirement imposed by the Authority under paragraph (a) of subsection (1) shall be guilty of an offence of contempt of the Authority.

(3) Every offence of contempt committed against the Authority shall be punishable by the Supreme Court as though it were an offence of contempt committed against the authority of that Court and the Supreme Court is hereby vested with jurisdiction to try every such offence.

(4) Where the Authority determines that a person is guilty of an offence of contempt under subsection (2), against the Authority, the Authority may transmit to the Supreme Court, a certificate setting out such determination. Every such Certificate shall be signed by the chairman of the Authority.

(5) In any proceedings for the punishment of an offence of contempt which the Supreme Court may think fit to take cognizance of, as provided in this section, any document purporting to be a certificate signed and transmitted to the Court under subsection (4) shall—

- (a) be received in evidence, and be deemed to be such a certificate without further proof, unless the contrary is proved; and
- (b) be evidence that the determination set out in the certificate was made by the Authority and of the facts stated in the determination.

(6) In any proceeding taken as provided in this section for the punishment of any alleged offence of contempt against the Authority no member of the Authority shall, except with his own consent and notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this Act, be summoned or examined as a witness.

15. (1) There shall be a Director-General of the Authority who shall be a person professionally qualified and experienced in professional activity associated with the criminal justice system or law enforcement.

Appointment of
Director-
General.

(2) The Director-General shall be appointed by the Board.

(3) The Director-General shall be the chief executive officer of the Authority and shall be responsible for carrying out all such duties necessary for the management and administration of the affairs of the Authority.

(4) The Board may delegate to the Director-General any of the duties and functions of the Authority and such of its powers as may become necessary, to perform and discharge the duties and functions so delegated.

Investigations
and Inquiries.

16. (1) An investigation by the Authority into any complaint or information regarding an alleged infringement or imminent infringement of a right or entitlement of a victim of crime or of a witness, shall be carried out on its behalf by an officer of the Authority, nominated by the Authority who shall submit the report of such investigation including the notes of such investigation to the Board.

(2) (a) where the Board is of the opinion that such report discloses an alleged infringement or imminent infringement of a right or entitlement of a victim of crime or of a witness, the Board shall appoint a Panel consisting of three members of the Board, elected by the members from among themselves to conduct an inquiry;

(b) the Board shall nominate one of the members of the Panel to be its Chairman.

(3) The provisions of sub-paragraphs (i) to (iv) of paragraph (a) of section 14 shall apply to and in respect of the conduct of an inquiry by a Panel.

(4) In the case of a division of opinion among the members of the Panel regarding any matter being inquired into by it, the opinion of the majority shall prevail.

(5) At the conclusion of an inquiry under this section, the Panel shall submit to the Board a report on the same, along with its recommendations on the matter inquired into.

(6) On receipt of the report of a Panel, the Board shall take such action on the same as to it shall deem fit and appropriate.

- 17.** In the conduct of an inquiry under this Act, the panel may be assisted by the Director-General. Director-General to assist in the inquiry.
- 18.** (1) The Authority shall have its own Fund. Fund of the Authority and its financial year.
- (2) There shall be credited to the Fund of the Authority:—
- (a) all such sums of money as may be voted from time to time by Parliament for the use of the Authority; and
- (b) all such sums of money as may be received by the Authority by way of donations, gifts, bequests and grants from sources within or outside Sri Lanka.
- (3) All sums of money required to defray expenditure incurred by the Authority in the exercise and performance of its duties and functions under this Act, shall be paid out of the Fund of the Authority.
- (4) The Board shall cause proper accounts to be kept of the receipts and expenditure, assets and liabilities and all other transactions of the Authority.
- (5) The financial year of the Authority shall be the calendar year.

PART V

VICTIMS OF CRIME AND WITNESSES ASSISTANCE AND PROTECTION DIVISION.

- 19.** (1) The Inspector General of Police shall, in consultation with and following such guidelines as shall be issued by the Authority for the purpose, establish and maintain a Division to be called the '*Victims of Crime and Witnesses Assistance and Protection Division*' (in this Act referred to as the "Division"), for the purpose of providing assistance and protection to victims of crime and witnesses. Victims of Crime and Witnesses Assistance and Protection Division.

(2) A Senior Superintendent of Police, who comes under the supervision of the nominee of the Inspector General of Police appointed as a member of the Board referred to in section 12(1) (a) (vii) shall be placed in charge of the Division.

(3) The duties of the Division shall be to—

- (a) provide effective and necessary protection to victims of crime and witnesses ; and
- (b) investigate by itself or with the assistance of any other police officer, into, complaints, allegations or information pertaining to threats, reprisals, intimidations, retaliations or any harm, harassment, coercion or violation being committed on victims of crime and witnesses and their property and any offence committed under section 8 or section 9 of this Act.

Victims of Crime
and Witnesses
Assistance and
Protection
programme.

20. (1) The Division shall draw up and implement in compliance with the guidelines issued by the Authority for that purpose, a '*Victims of Crime and Witnesses Assistance and Protection Programme*' which shall provide for taking effective measures necessary to assist and protect victims of crime and witnesses, from potential or existing threats, harm, reprisals, retaliations and intimidations.

(2) It shall be the duty of the Division to take all such steps as may be necessary to create awareness among the public about the Victims of Crime and witnesses Assistance and Protection Programme drawn up by it under subsection (1), including what action may be taken by a victim of crime or a witness in the event of facing any threat, harm, reprisal, retaliation, intimidation and the manner in which victims of crime or witnesses may apply for and obtain assistance and protection under such Programme.

(3) The Division may undertake the admission of a victim of crime or witness into its Victims of Crime and Witnesses Assistance and Protection Programme, on:—

- (a) a request made by a victim of crime or a witness;
- (b) a recommendation made by the Authority;
- (c) a report submitted by any law enforcement Authority or a public officer; or
- (d) a notification received from a court or a Commission.

(4) The provision of assistance and protection to a victim of crime or witness shall be effected by the Division after the conduct of a threat assessment and with the consent of the victim of crime or witness concerned.

(5) Prior to the implementation of the Victims of Crime and Witnesses Assistance and Protection Programme, the Division may require the victim of crime or witness concerned, to enter into a memorandum of understanding with the Division.

PART VI

ENTITLEMENT OF A VICTIM OF CRIME OR WITNESS TO OBTAIN PROTECTION

21. (1) A victim of crime or a witness who has reasonable grounds to believe that any harm may be inflicted on him due to his cooperation with, or participation in, any investigation or inquiry into an offence or into the infringement of a fundamental right or the violation of a human right being conducted or his intended attendance at or participation in any judicial or quasi-judicial proceeding, shall be entitled to seek protection from such real or anticipatory harm.

Duty to provide protection to victims of crime and witnesses.

(2) A request for protection under subsection (1), may be made to the Authority, the Division, a Court before which the relevant judicial proceedings are scheduled to commence or where proceedings are pending or have been conducted, to a Commission or to the officer-in-charge of any police station.

Nature,
commencement,
duration and
termination of
the grant of
protection.

22. (1) Upon a consideration of the need for protection, the availability of necessary resources and subject to the prevailing laws, the measures that the Authority, the Division or a Commission, may provide to a victim of crime or a witness may include—

- (a) security to the person and property;
- (b) temporary accommodation including shelters;
- (c) permanent re-location with the consent of the victim of crime or witness as the case may be;
- (d) temporary or permanent employment;
- (e) re-identification;
- (f) any other measure which the Authority, the Division or a Commission, shall consider necessary.

(2) The Authority, the Division or a Commission, may provide protection to any victim of crime or any witness immediately upon the receipt of any information or complaint from such person, whether during or after the conduct of a criminal investigation, before, during or after any investigation or inquiry by a Commission and before, during or after any judicial proceedings.

(3) When providing protection or assistance to any victim of crime or witness, the Division shall act in accordance with the advice and recommendations made by the Authority.

(4) Where a request is made by the Division to any Ministry, Government Department, statutory institution or any public officer for assistance in providing protection or assistance to any victim of crime or a witness, it shall be the duty of such Ministry, Government Department or statutory institution or such public officer, unless unable to do so for reasons assigned, to provide the protection or assistance directly to the victim of crime or the witness concerned or to provide the assistance requested for by the Division.

(5) The Authority, the Senior Superintendent of Police in charge of the Division or a Commission shall cease to provide protection or assistance to any victim of crime or witness, where—

- (a) the need for such protection or assistance no longer exists; or
- (b) such victim of crime or witness—
 - (i) requests that such protection or assistance be terminated;
 - (ii) refuses to receive such protection or assistance;
 - (iii) abuses the protection or assistance granted;
 - (iv) commits any breach of the peace or commits an indictable offence;
 - (v) acts contrary to the terms of the memorandum of understanding entered into; or
 - (vi) is found to have provided any false information, statement, complaint or testimony in order to obtain protection or assistance or having obtained assistance or protection in terms of this Act, provides false information, statement, complaint or testimony to any law enforcement Authority, Court or Commission.

Officer in charge of a police station to take necessary steps on receipt of a request by a victim of crime or a witness.

23. An officer-in-charge of a police station who is in receipt of a request made under section 21, shall take necessary steps to forthwith investigate or inquire into the request received and if circumstances so require, immediately provide any necessary protection and communicate the receipt of such request and information pertaining to action taken by him following the receipt of such request, including his findings pertaining to the information received, to the Authority and to the Division.

Authority or a Commission to protect vulnerable victims and witnesses.

24. (1) With the view to protecting the interests of vulnerable victims of crime or witnesses under exceptional circumstances, the Authority may, either acting on a notification received from a Court or from a Commission or on its own motion, by itself or with the assistance of any designated public officer or any other person or organization, directly provide protection to such a victim of crime or a witness.

(2) (a) With the view to protecting the interest of vulnerable victims of crime or witnesses, a Commission may, after prior notice to the Authority, acting on a request by a victim of a crime or a witness or on its own motion by itself or with the assistance of any designated public officer, directly provide protection to such a victim of crime or a witness, whose statement or testimony the Commission intends to record or has already recorded.

(b) In the situation referred to in paragraph (a), the Division shall provide protection to the victim of crime or witness, only with the prior approval of the Commission concerned and after the issue to the Authority of a notice pertaining to the same.

- (c) In a situation where a Commission decides by itself or with the assistance of a designated public officer to provide protection to a victim of crime or witness, the Commission shall not obtain for such purpose the advice, services or assistance, including resources, from any person other than a public officer:

Provided however, the Commission may at any time transfer the responsibility of providing protection to such a victim of crime or a witness, to either the Authority or the Division, and where the responsibility is so transferred, it shall be the duty of the Authority or the Division, to undertake to provide the necessary protection to such a victim of crime or witness.

(3) The Authority, the Division or a Commission shall not solicit or obtain any assistance from any foreign government or national, foreign or international organization, in providing assistance or protection to a victim of crime or a witness, without the prior sanction of the Attorney-General and the Secretary to the Ministry of the Minister in charge of the subject of Foreign Affairs the grant of which shall be considered and decided upon by the Attorney-General and such secretary as expeditiously as possible.

25. (1) A Court or a Commission which has reasonable grounds to believe that a victim of crime or a witness in any judicial or quasi-judicial proceeding before such court or before such Commission, requires assistance or protection from harm, threat, reprisal, retaliation or intimidation or assistance to attend and participate in such judicial or quasi-judicial proceedings, such Court or the Commission shall, subject to the provisions of subsection (2), take all necessary steps to cause such assistance and protection to be provided to such victim of crime or witness.

Protection to be prescribed by Courts and Commissions.

(2) The protection and assistance that may be provided to any victim of crime or witness under subsection (1), shall not cause any prejudice to the rights and entitlements of the person suspected or accused of the offence concerned or the infringement of the fundamental right or the violation of the human right, of the victim of crime or witness concerned.

(3) The protection and assistance that may be provided under subsection (1), may include:—

- (a) the adoption of special measures to protect the rights of children and to ensure the best interests of child victims of crime and child witnesses.
- (b) the conduct of either the entirety or part of the judicial or quasi- judicial proceedings in camera;
- (c) the adoption of measures necessary to prevent the victim of crime or the witness concerned from being unnecessarily harassed, intimidated, coerced, violated or influenced by seeing the accused present at the venue of the trial or inquiry;
- (d) the prevention of the identity of and the background information pertaining to the victim of crime or the witness from being disclosed; and
- (e) the adoption of appropriate measures to prevent disclosure of the identity and the entirety or part of the testimony of such victim of crime or witness, to persons other than the accused concerned and his legal representative. The measures adopted shall include the power to direct media institutions, media personnel and other specified persons from publishing, broadcasting, telecasting or otherwise disseminating information pertaining to the identity of the victim of crime or the witness concerned.

(4) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (1), a Court or a Commission may by a notification issued in that behalf, request the Authority or the Division to provide to a victim of crime or a witness the protection referred to therein. On receipt of such a request, it shall be the duty of the Authority or the Division to take all necessary measures to provide the protection requested for to the victim of crime or the witness concerned, where after conducting any necessary inquiries it is of the view that the need to provide such protection, is well founded.

26. A law enforcement authority or any public officer, who has reasonable grounds to believe that a victim of crime or a witness requires assistance or protection from any possible harm, threat, reprisal, retaliation or intimidation in attending and participating in any judicial or quasi-judicial proceedings, such law enforcement authority or the public officer shall forthwith issue a communication to that effect to the Authority and to the Division.

Protection to be provided by law enforcement authorities and public officers.

27. (1) Any victim of crime or a witness who has received any assistance or protection under this Act, shall not—

Duties of victims of crime and witnesses receiving protection and assistance.

- (a) abuse such assistance or protection granted;
- (b) provide false information or testimony to any investigating agency, a Court or a Commission; or
- (c) act contrary to the terms of the memorandum of understanding entered into with the Authority, the Division or the Commission, which provided the assistance or protection concerned.

(2) Where a victim of crime or witness acts in contravention of the provisions of subsection (1), any officer or authority who or which provided assistance or protection under this Act to such victim of crime shall discontinue the assistance or protection provided to such victim of crime or witness under this Act.

PART VII

COMPENSATION

Compensation. **28.** (1) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the Judicature Act and the Code of Criminal Procedure Act, every High Court and every Magistrate's Court may upon conviction of a person by such Court, in addition to any penal sanction that may be imposed on such person in respect of the offence for which he is convicted, order the convicted person to pay to Court—

- (a) (i) an amount not exceeding one million rupees to be paid as compensation to the victim of crime or witness concerned; or
- (ii) a sum of money not exceeding twenty per centum of the maximum fine payable for that offence; or
- (b) both the compensation and the sum of money referred to in paragraph (a).

(2) Prior to arriving at a determination on the quantum of compensation to be imposed under sub paragraph (i) of paragraph (a) of subsection (1), the High Court or the Magistrate's Court shall call for, examine and consider:—

- (a) all relevant information relating to the victim of crime, including the report of the Government Medical Officer who has examined the victim, that may enable the Court to determine the nature and the extent of the damage, loss or harm that the victim of crime may have suffered as a result of being subjected to the offence the person convicted of had been charged with;

- (b) representations or submissions made by the victim of crime or his legal representative, relating to the impact of the crime on such victim; and
- (c) information pertaining to any compensation that may have already been paid to such victim of crime by any court, by the Authority or otherwise received by him from any other source.

(3) The presiding Judge of the High Court or the Magistrate shall, remit the money paid under:—

- (a) sub paragraph (i) of paragraph (a) of sub section (1) as compensation to the victim of crime concerned or to his next of kin or dependents;
- (b) sub paragraph (ii) of paragraph (a) of sub section (1) to the Victims of Crime and Witnesses Assistance and Protection Fund established under section 29 of this Act;
- (c) paragraph (b) of subsection (1), in the corresponding manner provided in paragraph (a) and (b) of this subsection.

(4) In the event of a person convicted of failing to make any payments imposed under subsection (1), the Presiding Judge of the High Court or the Magistrate shall, determine and pronounce a default term of imprisonment the convict shall be required to serve, in lieu of the non-payment of such sums of money:

Provided that, where the Presiding judge of the High Court or the Magistrate upon inquiry is satisfied that the person convicted does not have necessary financial resources to make the payment imposed under subsection (1), such Presiding Judge or the Magistrate shall, enter a community

based correction order and where such an order is entered, the provisions relating to community based correction orders contained in the Community Based Corrections Act, No. 46 of 1999, shall *mutatis mutandis*, apply in regard to that order.

(5) The receipt of compensation by a victim under subsection (1)(a) (i) of this section shall not prejudice such victim from claiming damages in any civil proceedings, provided that when determining the quantum of damages to be awarded, such civil court shall take into consideration the compensation received by such victim, under subsection (1)(a) (i) of this section.

Victims of Crime
and Witnesses
Assistance and
Protection Fund.

29. (1) There shall be a fund called the Victims of Crime and Witnesses Assistance and Protection Fund (hereinafter referred to as the “Protection Fund”).

(2) The Protection Fund shall be administered and managed by the Board.

(3) There shall be paid into the Protection Fund—

- (a) all such sums as may be voted by the parliament for such Fund;
- (b) all such sums as may be received by the Authority to be remitted to the Protection Fund by way of any gift, donation, contribution, bequest and grant from any local or foreign sources; and
- (c) all such monies remitted by a Court under subsection (1)(a) (ii) of section 28 :

Provided that any money collected by a Court in the form of a fine, shall not be remitted to the Protection Fund.

(4) There shall be paid out of the Protection Fund all such sums as may be determined by the Board for the payment of—

- (a) compensation to victims of crime for any physical or mental harm or loss or damage to property;

- (b) compensation to dependent family members, dependent next of kin and any other person dependent on a victim of crime who had died or been physically or mentally incapacitated as a result of being a victim of crime.

(5) The Director-General shall be the principal accounting officer of the Protection Fund and shall cause proper accounts to be kept of the income and expenditure and assets and liabilities of such Fund.

(6) The financial year of the Protection Fund shall be the calendar year.

30. (1) A victim of crime shall be entitled to apply to the Authority—

Entitlement to apply for compensation and assistance.

- (a) for the payment of compensation in respect of any physical or mental injury or impairment caused and for any loss or damage to property, suffered as a result of being a victim of a crime; and
- (b) for the payment of monies required to obtain medical treatment or rehabilitation or counseling services, in relation to any physical or mental injury or impairment suffered by such victim as a result of being a victim of crime.

(2) In determining whether compensation should be paid to a victim of crime who makes an application under subsection (1), the Authority shall take into consideration any sum of money already received by such victim of crime as compensation under section 28 or received by him on an order made by any Court or otherwise received by him from any other source.

(3) Where any compensation or expense is paid to a victim of crime under subsection (1) prior to an award being made by a Court for the payment of compensation to such victim of crime, the payment made by the Authority under subsection (1) shall be deemed to be an interim relief being granted to such victim of crime, pending the award of compensation by a Court.

(4) In the grant of compensation and any expenses to a victim of crime under subsection (1) of this section, it shall be the duty of the Authority to comply with the requirements of any regulation that may be made in that behalf.

PART VIII

TESTIMONY THROUGH AUDIO-VISUAL LINKAGE

Recording of
evidence or
statement
through
contempor-
aneous audio-
visual linkage.

31. (1) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in any other law a Court conducting an identification parade, a non summary inquiry or any other inquiry or a trial, or a Commission conducting an investigation or inquiry or any law enforcement authority conducting an investigation, may, if it be in the best interest of justice and is found necessary:—

- (a) as a measure of protection to be afforded to a victim of crime or witness; or
- (b) on grounds of expediency,

Record any evidence or a statement of such victim of crime or witness, by securing such testimony or statement without his personal attendance before such Court, Commission or law enforcement authority through technical means by which contemporaneous or near contemporaneous audio-visual linkage between the Court, the Commission or the law enforcement authority,

and any other location (hereinafter referred to as the “remote location”) within Sri Lanka, from where such person testifies or makes the statement, could be established.

(2) Subject to the provision of section 32 the Court, the Commission or the law enforcement authority shall, prior to the reception and recording of the testimony or statement in terms of subsection (1), satisfy itself that the audio-visual linkage concerned is technically accurate and reliable and a judicial officer or a public officer designated by the Court, the Commission or the law enforcement authority concerned is present at such remote location, from where the victim of crime or witness seeks to testify or make the statement.

(3) Prior to commencing the reception and recording of the testimony or statement of the victim of crime or witness from the remote location designated under subsection (2), the Court, the Commission or the law enforcement authority concerned shall, on the recommendation of the Attorney-General and the Secretary to the Ministry of the Minister and subject to the provisions of section 32, obtain from the Authority financial and other resources necessary for the establishment and the functioning of the relevant audio-visual linkage.

(4) For the purposes of this section “Court” means a Court before which any criminal proceedings are being conducted.

- 32.** (1) (a) Where the Attorney-General and the Secretary to the Ministry of the Minister recommends, that :-
- (i) it is not in the national interest including national security, to obtain the testimony or statement of the victim of crime or witness concerned from the remote location ;

Authority not required to provide assistance under section 31 in certain circumstances.

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- (ii) it would not be feasible to secure the testimony or the statement of the relevant victim of crime or witness from the remote location,

identified under subsection (1) of section 31, the Attorney-General shall convey his opinion to the Court, Commission or the law enforcement authority concerned.

- (b) Where the Attorney-General is of the opinion that it would be in the interest of justice to secure such testimony or statement from any other appropriate alternate remote location, the Attorney-General may recommend to the court, the Commission or the law enforcement authority of such alternate location.

- (2) (a) Where the Attorney-General has expressed an opinion that the recording of evidence or the securing of a statement of any victim of crime or witness from a particular remote location is inappropriate, the Court, the Commission or law enforcement authority concerned, shall not proceed to receive and record the testimony or statement of the relevant victim of crime or witness through contemporaneous audio-visual linkage from such remote location, and consequently the Authority shall not be required to provide any necessary assistance and financial or other resources to the Court, the Commission or the law enforcement authority under subsection (3) of section 31.

- (b) where the Court, the Commission or the law enforcement authority, decides to change the

remote location to the location recommended by the Attorney-General under subsection (1), such Court, Commission or the law enforcement authority, may proceed to obtain the assistance of the Authority under subsection (3) of section 31.

33. (1) A Court or a Commission intending to record the testimony of a victim of crime or witness under the provisions of section 31, shall initially cause the statement to be recorded and serve such statement on the Attorney-General, the victim of crime or witness and on any person whose legal rights may be affected by such testimony or on their legal representatives and issue not less than thirty days notice, to all such parties concerned, of the scheduled date of recording of the testimony of the victim of crime or witness concerned.

Procedure in recording testimony or statement.

(2) The judicial officer or the person designated by a Court or Commission under subsection (2) of section 31, to be present at the remote location concerned from which the victim of crime or witness proposes to testify or make the statement, shall be required to make his observations, where necessary by interviewing the victim of crime or witness concerned and any other relevant person and submit a report to the Court or the Commission containing such matters as may be prescribed.

(3) The Court or the Commission shall upon considering the contents of the report submitted under subsection (2), and any other relevant material before such court or Commission, reach its decision as to whether it would be in the best interests of justice to receive the evidence or statement concerned given through such contemporaneous audio-visual linkage, and on the admissibility and use of such evidence or statement recorded.

Receiving or recording testimony through audio-visual linkage to be according to this part.

34. No Court, Commission or law enforcement authority shall receive or record the testimony or statement of any victim of crime or witness through contemporaneous audio-visual linkage, save and except in accordance with requirements laid down for the same by the provisions of this part of this Act.

PART IX

GENERAL

Interference in the discharge of duties etc.

35. Any person who without lawful authority interferes or obstructs or attempts to interfere or obstruct any Court, Commission, Authority, Board, Division or any public or judicial officer, in the exercise, discharge or performance of any power, function or duty, under this Act, shall be guilty of an offence under this Act and shall on conviction by the High Court be liable to a term of imprisonment not exceeding seven years and to a fine not exceeding rupees twenty thousand.

Secrecy.

36. (1) Unless it becomes necessary for the purposes of giving effect to the provisions of this Act, no person shall in any judicial or quasi-judicial proceedings, be compelled to divulge whether a victim of crime or a witness is receiving or has received assistance or protection under this Act.

(2) No person shall otherwise than for the purpose of giving effect to the provisions of this Act or in compliance with the provisions of any other law, divulge to any other person whether a victim of crime or a witness is receiving or has received assistance or protection under this Act.

Assessment of credibility of a testimony.

37. In assessing the credibility of a testimony given by a victim of crime or witness in any Court or Commission, the fact that a victim of crime or a witness is receiving or has received any assistance or protection under this Act, shall not be relevant.

38. The provisions of this Act shall have effect notwithstanding anything to the contrary in any other written law and accordingly, in the event of any conflict or inconsistency between the provisions of this Act and such other written law, the provisions of this Act shall prevail.

Provisions of this Act to prevail over other laws.

39. (1) The provisions of Article 154 of the Constitution relating to the audit of the accounts of public corporations shall apply to and in relation to the audit of the accounts of the Fund of the Authority and the Protection Fund.

Audit of Accounts.

(2) The provisions of Part II of the Finance Act, No. 38 of 1971 shall *mutatis mutandis* apply to the financial control and accounts of the Funds referred to in subsection (1).

40. (1) At the request of the Authority, any officer in the public service may, with the consent of that officer, the Secretary of the Ministry by or under which that officer is employed, and the Secretary to the Ministry of the Minister in charge of the subject of Public Administration, be temporarily appointed to the staff of the Authority for such period as may be determined by the Authority or with like consent be permanently appointed to the staff of the Authority.

Appointment of public officers to the staff of the Authority.

(2) Where any officer in the public service is temporarily appointed to the staff of the Authority the provisions of subsection (2) of section 14 of the National Transport Commission Act, No. 37 of 1991 shall, *mutatis mutandis*, apply to and in relation to him.

(3) Where any officer in the public service is permanently appointed to the staff of the Authority, the provisions of subsection (3) of section 14 of the National Transport Commission Act, No. 37 of 1991 shall, *mutatis mutandis*, apply to and in relation to him.

(4) Where the Authority employs any person who has entered into a contract with the government by which he has agreed to serve the Government for a specified period, any

period of service to the Authority by that person shall be regarded as service to the Government for the purpose of discharging the obligations of such contract.

Officials of the Authority deemed to be public officers.

41. Members of the Board, the Director-General and all other officers and employees of the Authority, consultants and advisors appointed by the Authority, shall be deemed to be public officers within the meaning and for the purposes of the Penal Code and of the Code of Criminal Procedure Act respectively.

The Authority deemed to be a Scheduled Institution within the meaning of the Bribery Act.

42. The Authority shall be deemed to be a Scheduled Institution within the meaning of the Bribery Act and the provisions of that Act shall be construed accordingly.

Action against bodies of persons.

43. Where an offence under this Act is committed by a body of persons, then:—

- (a) if that body of persons is a body corporate, every director, manager, chief executive officer and secretary of that body corporate ;
- (b) if that body of persons is a firm, every partner of that firm and its chief executive officer ;
- (c) if that body of persons is an unincorporated body, every individual who is a member of such body and its chief executive officer ; and
- (d) if that body of persons is a local authority or any other authority appointed by or under any law relating to a local authority to act on behalf of such local authority, the Chairman of such local authority,

shall be guilty of an offence :

Provided however, any director, manager, chief executive officer and secretary of any body corporate or every partner and the chief executive officer of any firm or every

member and the chief executive officer of an unincorporated body or the Chairman of a local authority, as the case may be, shall not be guilty of an offence under this section, if he proves to the satisfaction of the Court that such offence was committed without his knowledge or that he exercised all due diligence to prevent the commission of such offence.

44. (1) The Minister on the recommendation of the Authority, may make regulations under this Act in respect of all matters that are prescribed and on such matters as may become necessary to be provided for in order to give effect to the provisions of this Act. Regulations.

(2) Every regulation made under subsection (1) shall be published in the *Gazette* and shall come into force on the date of such publication or on such later date as may be specified in such regulation.

(3) All regulations made under this section shall as soon as convenient after their publication in the *Gazette*, be brought before the Parliament for approval. Any such regulation which is not so approved shall be deemed to be rescinded as from the date of its disapproval, but without prejudice to anything done thereunder.

(4) Notification of the date on which a regulation is deemed to be rescinded shall be published in the *Gazette*.

45. In the event of any inconsistency between the Sinhala and Tamil text of this Act, the Sinhala text shall prevail. Sinhala text to prevail in case of inconsistency.

46. In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires- Interpretation.

“child victim of crime” and “child witness” respectively means, a person who is less than eighteen years of age and who is either a victim of crime or is a witness ;

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“Code of Criminal Procedure Act, means the Code of Criminal Procedure Act, No. 15 of 1979 ;

“Commission” means—

- (a) a Commission of Inquiry appointed under the Commissions of Inquiry Act, (Chapter 393) ;
- (b) a Special Presidential Commission of Inquiry established under the Special Presidential Commissions of Inquiry Law, No. 7 of 1978 ;
- (c) the Commission to Investigate Allegations of Bribery and Corruption established by the Commission to Investigate Allegations of Bribery or Corruption Act, No. 19 of 1994 ; and
- (d) the Human Rights Commission of Sri Lanka established by the Human Rights Commission of Sri Lanka Act, No. 21 of 1996.

“law enforcement authority” means a police officer or any other person authorised by or under any written law to investigate into the commission of an offence ;

“Judicature Act” means the Judicature Act, No. 2 of 1978 ;

“victim of crime” means a person including a child victim who has suffered any injury, harm, impairment or disability whether physical or mental, emotional, economic or other loss, as a result of an act or omission which constitutes an alleged—

- (a) offence under any law ; or
- (b) infringement of a fundamental right guaranteed under Articles 13(1) or (2) of the Constitution,

and includes a person who suffers harm as a result of intervening to assist such a person or to prevent the commission of an offence, and the parent or guardian of a child victim of crime and any member of the family and next of kin of such person, dependents and any other person of significant importance to that person ;

“witness” means any person who—

- (a) has provided information or lodged a complaint with any law enforcement officer and based upon such information or complaint, an investigation or inquiry could or has commenced or is likely to commence, in connection with the alleged commission of an offence or the infringement of a fundamental right or the violation of a human right ;
- (b) in the course of an investigation or inquiry conducted by a law enforcement authority into the alleged commission of an offence or infringement of a fundamental right or the violation of a human right, has provided information or made a statement containing an account of matters in respect to which such person had been questioned ;
- (c) has provided an affidavit or submitted a statement in support of a complaint made or any legal action instituted by a victim of crime ;
- (d) has provided information or any communication to a Commission ;
- (e) has reasonable grounds to believe that he shall be summoned by a Court or a Commission to make a statement or testify in any judicial or

quasi-judicial proceedings against a person, based on information provided or a statement made to a law enforcement authority or a Commission by such person ;

(f) has received summons from a court or a Commission to make a statement, testify or produce any document, report or object in any judicial or quasi-judicial proceeding before such Court or Commission ; or

(g) being a public officer, has investigated into the alleged commission of an offence or an alleged infringement of a fundamental right or the violation of a human right,

and includes a victim of crime, a child witness, the parent or guardian of a child witness, a family member or dependent of such witness or any other person of significant importance to such person, an expert witness and a person who has been summoned to testify before a Court or a Commission on behalf of a person suspected or accused of the alleged commission of an offence or the infringement of a fundamental right or the violation of a human right ;
and

“written communication” includes a letter transmitted in any medium whatsoever, such as by ordinary or registered post, by facsimile and electronic mail.

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SCHEDULE

[section 11(3)]

1. A person shall be disqualified from being appointed or continuing as an appointed member of the Board—

- (a) if he is or becomes a member of Parliament, a Provincial Council or any local authority ;
- (b) if he is not or ceases to be a citizen of Sri Lanka ;
- (c) if he is under any law in force in Sri Lanka or in any other country, found or declared to be of unsound mind ; or
- (d) if he is serving or has served, a sentence of imprisonment imposed by any Court in Sri Lanka or any other country.

2. Every appointed member of the Board shall, unless he vacates office earlier by death, resignation or removal, hold office for a term of three years from the date of his appointment and unless he has been removed from office, be eligible for reappointment :

Provided that a member appointed in place of a member who had vacated office by death, resignation or removal, shall hold office for the unexpired term of office of the member whom he succeeds.

3. The Minister may, by Order published in the *Gazette*, remove from office an appointed member of the Board for misconduct in the performance of his duties or where such member has been found guilty of an offence involving fraud or dishonesty, in consultation with those persons who are required to be consulted for the appointment of such appointed member under paragraph (b) of subsection (1) of section 11. An appointed member who is removed, shall cease to hold office from and after the date of publication of such Order in the *Gazette*.

4. An appointed member of the Board, may at any time resign from his office by letter to that effect addressed to the Minister and such resignation shall take effect upon it being accepted by the Minister in writing.

5. In the event of the vacation of office by death, resignation or removal of an appointed member of the Board, having regard to the provisions of paragraph (b) of subsection (1) of section 11 another person may be appointed to succeed such member. Any person so appointed in place of such member, shall hold office during the unexpired part of the term of office of the member whom he succeeds.

6. Where an appointed member of the Board, by reason of illness, infirmity or absence from Sri Lanka for a period not less than three months, is temporarily unable to perform his duties, it shall be the

duty of such member to inform the appointing authority in writing, of such inability. Thereupon, having regard to the provisions of paragraph (b) of subsection (1) of section 11 another person may be appointed to act in his place during such period.

7. The members of the Board may be paid such remuneration out of the Fund of the Authority as the Minister may determine.

8. (1) The Chairman of the Board, shall, if present, preside at every meeting of the Board. In the absence of the Chairman from any such meeting, the members present shall elect one of the members present, to preside at such meeting.

(2) The quorum for any meeting of the Board, shall be five members.

(3) The person presiding at any meeting of the Board, shall, in addition to his own vote have a casting vote.

(4) Subject to the provisions of this paragraph, the Board may regulate the procedure in regard to its meetings and the transaction of business at such meetings.

9. No act, decision or proceeding of the Board, shall be deemed to be invalid by reason only of the existence of any vacancy therein or any defect in the appointment of any member thereof.

10. (1) The seal of the Authority may be determined and devised by the Board, and may be altered in such manner as may be determined by the Board.

(2) The seal of the Authority shall be in the custody of such person as the Board may determine from time to time.

(3) The seal of the Authority shall not be affixed to any instrument or document except with the sanction of the Board and in the presence of two members of the Board, who shall sign the instrument or document in token of their presence.

(4) The Board shall maintain a register of the instruments and documents to which the seal of the Board has been affixed.

11. (1) If the Chairman of the Board is, by reason of illness or absence from Sri Lanka temporarily unable to perform the duties of his office, having regard to the provisions of subsection (2) of section 11, another member of the Board shall be appointed to act in his place.

(2) The Chairman of the Board may at any time resign from the office of Chairman by a letter addressed to the Minister. Such resignation shall take effect upon it being accepted by the Minister in writing.

AN ACT TO AMEND THE ASSISTANCE TO AND PROTECTION OF VICTIMS
OF CRIME AND WITNESSES ACT, NO. 4 OF 2015

BE it enacted by the Parliament of the Democratic Socialist
Republic of Sri Lanka as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Assistance to and
Protection of Victims of Crime and Witnesses (Amendment)
Act, No. 27 of 2017.

Short title.

2. Section 31 of the Assistance to and Protection of
Victims of Crime and Witnesses Act, No. 4 of 2015 is hereby
amended as follows:—

any remote location outside Sri Lanka under

Further, students who have shown the highest performance in educational activities of all the seven faculties are being appreciated by the AAOUK, by way of providing them with gold medals at the annual convocation.
